Although the Sandy point of Ross has been partially washed away, the leading mark to clear St. Patrick rocks on the south-east side, viz., "Killala Round tower open of Sandy point of Ross," is in no respect affected thereby, and may be used as heretofore with perfect safety.

Leading marks for crossing Killala Bar.
