Needles Channel and Solent to Spithead.

The Elbow buoy has been altered from Black and white striped to Red and white striped vertically (can).

The N.E. Shingles buoy has been altered from Red and white chequered, to Red and white bands (can).

The Warden Ledge buoy has been altered from Black to Red (can).

The Black Rock buoy has been altered from White to Red (can).

The Lymington Spit buoy has been altered from Red to Red and white chequered (can).

The Hampstead Ledge buoy has been altered from White to Red (can).

The Salt Mead buoy has been altered from White to Red (can).

The Lepe Middle buoy has been altered from Black to Red and white striped vertically (can).

The Gurnet Ledge buoy has been altered from White to Red (can).

The Thorn Knoll buoy has been altered from Black and white chequered, to Red and white bands (can).

The West Bramble buoy has been altered from Red to Red and white chequered with staff and a cage (conical).

The Prince Consort buoy has been altered from White to Red (can).

The Calshot Spit (a refuge buoy) remains Black.

The Old Castle buoy has been altered from White to Red (can).

The N.E. Bramble buoy has been altered from Black and white chequered, to Red (can) and marked Hill Head.

The East Bramble buoy has been altered from White to Red and white striped vertically (conical).

The East Bramble buoy has been moved S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 9 cables from its former position, and now lies in 19 feet water, with West Cowes Mill, open west of the Bathing house, bearing W. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S.; Hill Head buoy in line with Calshot castle N.W. by N. distant $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles; West Bramble buoy W. by N. $\frac{3}{4}$ N. $2\frac{6}{10}$ miles; West Middle buoy W. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. $1\frac{3}{10}$ miles; and East Middle buoy S. by E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

The West Middle buoy has been altered from Black to Red and white bands (can).

The East Middle buoy has been altered from Black to Red and white bands (conical).

The Peel Bank buoy has been altered from White to Red.

The West Sturbridge buoy has been altered from White to Black and white bands (can).

The East Sturbridge buoy has been altered from White to Black and white bands (conical).

The Sand Head buoy has been altered from Red and white chequered to Black and white chequered.

Eastern Entrance to Spithead—Western Side.

The S.E. Princessa buoy has been altered from Black to Black and white chequered, with staff and cage (conical).

The S.E. Princessa buoy has been moved E. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. $4\frac{1}{2}$ cables from its former position, and now lies in 29 feet water, with Red Clay Cliff, in Sandown Bay, just open of Culver Cliff, bearing W. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N.; a high round tree on St. Helen's Down, in line with the Flagstaff on Bembridge Point, N.N.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W.; Dunnose W. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. distant 7 miles; N.W. Princessa buoy N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. nine-tenths of a mile; Bembridge Ledge buoy N. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. $1\frac{3}{10}$ miles; Warner Light Vessel N. 4 miles; Nab Light Vessel N.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. $2\frac{6}{10}$ miles; and the Nab buoy N. by E. $1\frac{6}{10}$ miles.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 101.)—BALTIC SEA, RUSSIA.

Fixed Light at Libau.

THE Russian Government has given notice, that a light is now exhibited from a lighthouse recently constructed at the entrance of the port of Libau, coast of Courland.

The light is a *fixed* white light, showing a bright flash of *four* or *five seconds* duration *every minute*; it is elevated 103 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 12 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the second order.

The tower is round and 95 feet high, is built of iron, and painted red. Position, lat. $56^{\circ} 31' N$, long. $20^{\circ} 59\frac{1}{2}'$ East of Greenwich.

GULF OF FINLAND.

Fixed Light at Hangö Head Road.

Also, that in the year 1868 a light would be established at the entrance of Hangö Head-road, North-west point of Gulf of Finland.

The light is a *fixed red and white* light, showing red towards the entrance of the Road and white towards the anchorage.

The tower is situated on the north-east point of Gustafssvard Island.

GULF OF BOTHNIA—ALAND ISLANDS.

Revolving Light on Skelskär.

Also, that from the end of the month of August, 1868, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently constructed on the Skelskär, entrance of the Gulf of Bothnia.

The light is a *revolving* light, showing *red and white* alternately for *thirty seconds*.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the second order.

The position of the tower, as given, is in lat. $60^{\circ} 24\frac{1}{2}' N$, long. $19^{\circ} 34'$ East of Greenwich.

Light Vessel on the Snipan Bank.

Also, that from the commencement of the month of August, 1868, a light vessel would be placed as a mark for the Snipan bank, Gulf of Bothnia.

The light is a *fixed red* light, elevated 20 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 7 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric or by reflectors.

The light vessel has two masts, and is painted yellow, with the word *Snipan* in large white letters on the sides. During the day a ball will be hoisted at the mizen and a yellow flag with a blue cross on the mainmast.

The vessel would be moored on the north-west extremity of the north-west bank, and the position, as given, in lat. $63^{\circ} 26\frac{1}{2}' N$, long. $20^{\circ} 45\frac{1}{2}'$ East of Greenwich.

In foggy weather and when the night is thick a bell will be sounded on board.

The vessel is removed for the winter months on the 20th October, and if from other causes her position is changed, the light will not be exhibited or the yellow flag hoisted.

V. R.—CAPE OF GOOD HOPE.

ACT to repeal Act No. 5 of 1867, and to make provision relating to Contagious and Infectious Diseases affecting Cattle, Sheep, or other Domestic Animals.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient that an Act numbered 5 of 1867 should be repealed, and that provision should be made in future for preventing the introduction into this Colony of contagious and infectious diseases affecting cattle, sheep, or other domestic animals: Be it therefore enacted, by the Governor of the Cape of Good Hope, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly thereof, as follows:—

Act No. 5, 1867, repealed.

I. The said Act, No. 5 of 1867, shall be, and the same is hereby repealed.

Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit importation of Cattle, Sheep, Horses, &c.; Penalty for landing Animal contrary to such prohibition.

II. If at any time it shall seem expedient, by reason of the known or supposed prevalence in any place beyond this Colony of any contagious or infectious disease, or any disease supposed to be contagious or infectious, affecting cattle, sheep, horses, or any other domestic animals, to prohibit the importation or introduction into this Colony for any time, from any place or places, of any such cattle, sheep, horses, or other domestic animals, it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to make proclamation, which shall be published in the Government Gazette, declaring that during such time as shall be named in such proclamation it shall not be lawful to land at any port or place in this Colony, from any ship, vessel, or boat, or otherwise to introduce into this Colony, any such cattle, or any sheep, or horse, or other domestic animal, or any animal of all or any of such denominations, and that the master of any ship or vessel, and the owner of any boats, who shall

land or permit or suffer to be landed from such ship or vessel, or boat, and every other person who shall otherwise introduce into this Colony, contrary to the prohibition in such proclamation contained, any such cattle, sheep, horse, or other domestic animal, shall, for every animal so landed or otherwise introduced into this Colony contrary to such prohibition, forfeit, upon conviction, any sum not exceeding four hundred pounds sterling, and in default of payment thereof may be imprisoned, with or without hard labour, for any term not exceeding twelve months, unless the fine be sooner paid.

Proclamation to have force of Law.

III. From and after the publication of such proclamation the prohibitions and penalties contained in the same shall be as binding and validly imposed as if the same were imposed and enacted directly by this Act.

Governor may permit landing of animals at Robben Island, or elsewhere;

Governor may, after certain period, and under certain restrictions, permit landing of animals on Mainland;

Penalty for evading or breaking restrictions imposed.

IV. Notwithstanding the general restrictions hereinbefore enacted, it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, if it shall seem expedient, by any such proclamation as aforesaid, to permit the landing of such cattle, sheep, horses, or other animals as aforesaid upon Robben Island, or any other island to be named in such proclamation, and to give order for the keeping of such animals separate and apart from any other animals; and if any such animals shall have been so kept on any such island as aforesaid, separate and apart from any others afterwards imported, for a period not less than three months, and shall during such time have shown no symptom of any contagious or infectious disease, or disease supposed to be contagious or infectious, then it shall be lawful for the Governor to give under his hand permission that such specified animals as to him shall seem expedient may, under such restrictions, if any, as to him shall seem expedient, which shall also be under the hand of the Governor, be, and the same may thereupon, subject to such restrictions, if any, be landed from such island on the mainland of this Colony, without incurring any penalty under this Act or any proclamation to be published in pursuance thereof; but if any of the restrictions deemed necessary by the Governor to be coupled with such permission shall be evaded, broken, or neglected, every person knowingly evading, breaking, or neglecting the same shall, on conviction, forfeit any sum not exceeding one hundred pounds sterling, and in default of payment thereof may be imprisoned, with or without hard labour, for any term not exceeding six months, unless the fine be sooner paid.

Sufficient bail to be taken before release of any person committed under this Act.

V. No person who shall have been committed for trial for any offence hereinbefore mentioned shall, pending such trial, be released from custody unless he shall give good and sufficient bail that he will duly appear to take his trial for such offence in any competent court, and that he will pay and satisfy any fine which may by such court be imposed upon him for such offence.

Duty of officer boarding vessel to inform master of existence of Act and proclamation under it.

VI. It shall be the duty of the port captain, harbour master, or other officer of Government who shall first board any ship or vessel arriving at any of the ports of this Colony pending the time limited in any such proclamation as aforesaid for the continuance of such prohibitions as aforesaid as may be therein contained, to ask the master of such ship or vessel whether he has on board any animal whereof the importation shall by such proclamation be prohibited, mentioning such animals by their denominations; and should the said master reply in the affirmative, the port captain, harbour master, or other officer shall inform the said master of this Act and the said proclamation, and deliver to him a copy of the same respectively.

Indemnity to Owners of Animals prohibited to be landed under certain circumstances;

Exceptions.

VII. If, during the time within which any such prohibition as aforesaid shall be in force, there shall arrive in any of the ports of this Colony any of the animals whereof the importation shall be so prohibited as aforesaid, which shall be consigned to any place in this Colony, and which shall have been shipped for this Colony after the publication of this Act in the London Gazette, and before the publication of any such proclamation as aforesaid in the London Gazette, it shall in such case be lawful for the Governor, and he is hereby authorized, to indemnify, from and out of the public revenue, the owner of every such animal, by paying to him or his agent the first cost of every such animal, together with freight, insurance, and any other charge which shall have been reasonably and properly incurred upon or about such animal, whereupon such animal shall become the property of the Queen in her colonial revenue; but it shall not be incumbent on any importer of such animal to accept such terms, if he shall be willing to submit to such conditions as may be proposed to him by the Colonial Government with reference to landing such animal on Robben Island, or such other island as the Governor shall appoint, and to providing for the care and maintenance of such animal separate and apart from other animals, save such as shall have been imported therewith, at the risk of the owner, for such time as may seem expedient, not being less than three months, and shall abide by such conditions and submit to such restrictions as to subsequently landing such animal upon the mainland of this Colony, and keeping the same for such time thereafter as may seem expedient, and shall be ordered by the Governor as aforesaid in that behalf: Provided also, that no compensation shall be made in respect of any such animal as aforesaid which shall have been shipped at any time after the publication of such proclamation as aforesaid in the London Gazette, or in respect of any such animal as shall be found to be actually suffering from any contagious or infectious disease, or any disease supposed to be contagious or infectious, at the time at which such animal would in the ordinary cause, have been landed on the mainland of this Colony, or within fourteen days thereafter: Provided, also, that it shall be lawful for the Governor to order the destruction of such infected animal, should the same at any time be landed on the mainland.

Interpretation of term "Master."

VIII. In the interpretation of this Act, the

term "master" shall include any officer in command of any ship or vessel.

Short title.

IX. This Act may be cited for all purposes as the "Cattle Diseases Act of 1868."

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by the Cattle Disease Act of 1868 it is provided that if at any time it shall seem expedient, by reason of the known or supposed prevalence in any place beyond this Colony of any contagious or infectious disease, or any disease supposed to be contagious or infectious, affecting cattle, sheep, horses, or any other domestic animals, to prohibit the importation or introduction into this Colony for any time, from any place or places, of any such cattle, sheep, horses, or other domestic animals, it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to make proclamation, which shall be published in the Government Gazette, declaring that during such time as shall be named in such Proclamation it shall not be lawful to land at any port or place in this Colony from any ship, vessel, or boat, or otherwise to introduce into this Colony, any such cattle, or any sheep, or horse, or other domestic animal, or any animal of all or any of such denominations: And whereas there is reason to believe that certain contagious and infectious diseases affecting horned cattle are prevalent in Europe and other places, and it is, therefore, expedient to prohibit the introduction into this Colony of horned cattle for such time as may be deemed meet: Now, therefore, I do hereby proclaim, declare, and make known that until such time as this Proclamation shall be repealed it shall not be lawful to land any horned cattle at any port or place in this Colony from any ship, vessel, or boat coming from any place or places beyond the Colony, or otherwise to introduce any horned cattle into this Colony.
