THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from the Acting British Consul-General at Havana the following circular, giving notice that all persons arriving at that Port must be provided with passports visé by a Spanish Consul:—

The Captain-General to Acting Consul-General Crawford.

(Translation.)

THE abuse which is being constantly committed by masters of steamers and sailing-vessels arriving at the Ports of this Island, of admitting passengers without passports, or without these documents being visé by the Spanish Consul at the places from whence they embark, thereby openly contravening the laws of this Island, which every one should respect, has obliged me to issue orders this day requiring all shipmasters to retain on board of their vessels, for reconveyance away from this Island, all persons who may be found so circumstanced, excepting those persons whose admission may be deemed allowable after previous guarantee of their respective Consuls, or a certificate of responsibility from two persons of respectability at the place where they arrive.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

CORNHOLME: ORDER SETTLING THE BOUNDARIES OF A CORNHOLME DISTRICT, FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

WHEREAS a Petition has been duly presented to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, from ratepayers resident within the district of Cornholme, as set forth in such petition, praying me to settle and fix the boundaries of a district to be styled the "Cornholme District," for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1858.

And whereas the said petition was duly signed, as required by the said Act, and set forth, likewise, the proposed boundaries of the district sought to be formed under its provisions; and inquiry has now been duly made by Arnold Taylor, Esquire, the Inspector appointed by me for such purpose, and he has reported to me thereon.

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, having taken the said petition and report into consideration, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers vested

in me by the Local Government Act, 1858, make order as follows:—

1. That from and after the date of this present Order, the boundaries hereinafter set forth and described and delineated on the plan referred to, in and accompanying the said Inspector's Report to me, bearing date the 23rd day of October, 1868, form and constitute the boundaries of the district to be called the Cornholme District, for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1858, and that the parts included in such boundaries so described and delineated, shall, for the purposes of such Act, be deemed to be a place having a known and defined boundary, and may adopt the said Act accordingly.

The aforesaid boundaries commence at the point A on the said plan, on the boundary line between the counties of York and Lancaster, at the point where a bridle-road, from Lower Shaw Farm, known as Shaw-lane, enters the stream known as Paul Clough, and passes thence, southerly, along such county boundary line to the point B, on the north-west side of Back Rough Farm premises, thence, westerly and southerly along and including the footpath through Nant Wood, to the point C, on the westerly side of the premises at Brown Birks Farm, thence south-westerly along, and including the footpath leading to Portsmouth, to the point D, thence in a south-westerly and southerly direction along the northerly boundary fence of Portsmouth Farm, to the point E, thence westerly along the same boundary fence of such last named farm to the point F.; thence in a south-westerly direction along the westerly boundary fence of the same farm, to the point G on the easterly side of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway; thence, crossing such last-named railway, in a straight line, to the point H on the south-westerly side of Todmorden and Burnley turnpike-road; thence, southerly, along and including such last-named road, to the point I; thence, at the rear of and including the mill yard, and premises of Portsmouth Mill, to the point K on the south side of the Old Highway leading from Portsmouth to Todmorden; thence, along and including such last-named highway to the point L; thence, easterly, along the line of the Moor Fence, to the point M, at Height Top; thence, along and including a foot path leading from Height Top to Round Field, to the point N; thence, in an easterly direction, along and including the occupation-road leading from Round Field to Barewise Mill to the point O; thence, in a north-easterly direction, to the south-easterly side of the Bye Wash, near the north-westerly end of Barewise Mill premises, to the point P; thence, in an easterly direction, along the boundary line of the Todmorden Local Board District, to the point Q, on the south side of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway; thence, crossing such last-named railway, and passing in a northerly direction along and including the occupation-road known as Knott's-road, to the point R, on the east side of Sagar-lane; thence, crossing such last-named lane, and passing in a westerly direction along and including Blue Bell-lane, to the point S, at Law Bottom; thence, north-westerly, on the northerly side of the cottages at Green End, along and including the occupation-road known as Shaw-lane, to the starting-point at A; so completing the boundary of the proposed District of Cornholme.

2. That James Green, Esquire, Architect, of Portsmouth House, near Todmorden, be Summoning Officer, and take forthwith all such steps as may be necessary under the hereinbefore recited

Act, for convening a meeting of the ratepayers of the said district of Cornholme, to decide as to the adoption of the Local Government Act, 1858, within the boundaries of such district, as fixed and settled by this present Order.

AT the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the Lady the Queen, holden for the North Riding of the county of York, at Northallerton, in the said Riding on Tuesday, in the first week after the 11th day of October, to wit, the 20th day of October, in the thirty-second year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady Victoria the First of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, before John Richard Westgarth Hildyard, Esq. (Chairman), The Right Honourable Thomas Earl of Zetland, Constantine Charles Henry Phipps, Esq., commonly called Earl of Mulgrave, and others, their Fellows, Justices of our said Lady the Queen, assigned to keep the Peace of our said Lady the Queen in the said Riding, and also to hear and determine divers felonies, trespasses, and other misdemeanors committed within the Riding aforesaid.
