 EXTENSION ACT, 1867.

WHEREAS due proof has been made to the satisfaction of me, the undersigned, Gathorne Hardy, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that the customs of the Trades carried on in the Factories specified in the Schedule hereto, require that the children, young persons, and women working in such Factories should be employed between the hours hereinafter mentioned: Now I, the said Gathorne Hardy, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the twenty-fifth Article of the Schedule annexed to the Factory Acts Extension Act, 1867, do by this my Order give permission to the occupiers of the said Factories to employ the children, young persons, and women working in such Factories on Saturday afternoon, provided a half-holiday be given on some other day, notice of which day shall be given at least three days before the Saturday.
