SEWAGE UTILIZATION ACTS, 1865 AND 1867.

ORDER SETTLING BOUNDARIES OF SPECIAL DRAINAGE DISTRICTS OF BEMBRIDGE, BRADING, AND LAKE.

WHEREAS, it is enacted by the Sewage Utilization Act, 1867 (30 and 31 Vict., cap. 115), that any inhabited place not having a known or defined boundary, may petition one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in manner provided in the sixteenth section of the Local Government Act, 1858, to settle its boundaries for the purpose of the Sewage Utilization Acts, 1865 and 1867, and the Secretary of State may,

by Order made in manner provided by the said section settle the same accordingly, and from and after the date of such Order the place shall be deemed to have been constituted a Special Drainage District for the purposes of the Sewage Utilization Acts, 1865 and 1867; and whereas, in pursuance of such provisions, a memorial has been presented to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, from inhabitant ratepayers of those parts of the parish of Brading, in the Isle of Wight, which are not comprised within the districts of the Shanklin or Sandown Local Boards, praying to be constituted into special drainage districts, under the provisions of the aforesaid Acts; and whereas due investigation has been made into the circumstances of the case and into the prayer of such petition, by Arnold Taylor, Esq., the Inspector appointed by me for the purpose, and he has duly reported to me thereon:

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, do hereby, under the authority conferred upon me by the said Acts, order and direct that, from and after the date of this present Order, such portions of the parish of Brading aforesaid as are hereinafter described shall form and constitute the Special Drainage Districts of Bembridge, Brading, and Lake, respectively; that is to say:—

The Special Drainage District of Bembridge shall comprise the entire area of the Ecclesiastical District of Bembridge.

The Special Drainage District of Brading boundary shall commence at the point A on the map accompanying the said Report (being the point of junction between the north-east corner of the district of the Sandown Local Board and the westerly boundary point of the parish of Yaverland), and passing thence along the northerly boundary line of the district of the Sandown Local Board to the point B, at Morton-common, thence northerly along and including the High-road leading from Sandown to Brading to the point C, thence westerly and northerly along the south boundary fence of the property numbered 825, on the tithe map of the parish of Brading, and along the westerly fences of such last-named property, and of properties numbered 824, 823A, 822, 617, and 618, all on such tithe map, to the point D, thence easterly and northerly along the north boundary fence of such last-named property, and the westerly boundary fences of such last-numbered property, and of properties numbered 619, 502, and 501A, all on such tithe map, and crossing the High-road leading to Newport in a westerly direction to the point E, on the south side of the Brading Down-road leading to Newport, thence westerly along and including such last-named road to the point F, at the boundary line which separates the parish of Newchurch, from the parish of Ryde, thence, north-easterly, along the boundary line which separates the parish of Ryde from the parish of Brading, to the point G, at the point of junction between the parish boundaries of Brading, Ryde, and St. Helens, thence, easterly, along the boundary line which separates the parish of Brading from the parish of St. Helens, to the point H, thence, in a south-easterly direction, across the mouth of Brading Harbour, to the point I, at Bembridge point, thence, along the southerly and westerly boundary line of the Special Drainage District of Bembridge, to the point J at Great Sluice, at the point of junction between the boundary lines of the parish of Yaverland and the parish of Brading, and from thence, south-westerly, following such last-named parish boundary line along the course of the River Yar, to
