WHEREAS by an Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the seventeenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, Her Majesty was pleased, under or by virtue of the provisions of "The Medical Act," by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to nominate and appoint Edmund Alexander Parkes, Esquire, Doctor of Medicine, Professor in the Army Medical School, Netley, Richard Quain, Esquire, Doctor of Medicine, of Harley-street, London, and Henry Wyldbore Rumsey, Esquire, Doctor of Medicine, of Cheltenham, to be respectively members of "The General Council of "Medical Education and Registration of the "United Kingdom," for England, and to re-nominate and re-appoint Robert Christison, Doctor of Medicine, Professor in the University of Edinburgh, to be a member of the said General Council for Scotland, and also to re-nominate and re-appoint William Stokes, Esquire, Doctor of Medicine, Regius Professor in the University of Dublin, to be a member of the said General Council for Ireland: And whereas, under or by virtue of the provisions of the said Act, the said Edmund Alexander Parkes, Richard Quain, Henry Wyldbore Rumsey, Robert Christison, and William Stokes will, on the seventeenth November instant, respectively cease, by lapse of time, to be members of the said General Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth, under and by virtue of the provisions in that behalf contained in the said "Medical Act," nominate the said Edmund Alexander Parkes, Richard Quain, and Henry

Wyldbore Rumsey to be again, from and after the said seventeenth November instant, respectively members of the said General Council for England, the said Robert Christison to be again, from and after the same date, member of the said General Council for Scotland, and the said William Stokes to be again, from and after the same date, member of the said General Council for Ireland; the said several nominations to continue for the term of five years from the day aforesaid.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the nineteenth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, in the words following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty, chapter seventy; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five; have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Bartholomew, situate at Marsden, in the parish of Almondbury, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Almondbury, and of the parish of Huddersfield, in the county and diocese aforesaid, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parishes respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said parish of

Almondbury, and of the said parish of Huddersfield, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Bartholomew, situate at Marsden aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consents of the Right Reverend Robert, Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon, and of Sir John William Ramsden, of Byrom Hall, in the said county of York, Baronet, the patron of the vicarages of both the said parishes of Almondbury and Huddersfield (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Almondbury, and of the said parish of Huddersfield, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Bartholomew, situate at Marsden as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Bartholomew, Marsden,' and that the right of presentation and appointment to the church of such consolidated chapelry should belong to and be exercised by the Reverend Charles Augustus Hulbert, the vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said parish of Almondbury, and by his successors in the same vicarage, for ever.

"We, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Bartholomew, Marsden, being:—

"All that portion of the parish of Almondbury, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon, which is comprised within, and is co-extensive with, the limits of the township of Marsden-in-Almondbury.

"And also all those contiguous portions of the parish of Huddersfield, in the county and diocese aforesaid, which are comprised within, and are co-extensive with, the limits of the township of Marsden-in-Huddersfield, save and except all those small detached portions (if any), of such township as are reputed to be situate to the north-east of Park Gate, Clough, and to be locally situate within, and surrounded on all sides by, the township of Slaihwate, in the parish of Huddersfield aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Ripon.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England, beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," it is enacted that, in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of one of such Secretaries of State, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial ground or places of burial should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require), that after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time, as circumstances may require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered; provided also, that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas the Right Honourable Gathorne Hardy, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parish without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that interments in the same should be discontinued, with the modifications hereinafter specified:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by Her Order in Council of the fourteenth day of September last, to give notice of such representation and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the second day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order,

and it is hereby ordered, that no new burial-ground shall be opened in the undermentioned parish without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials in the said parish shall be discontinued (except as is herein otherwise directed), as follows; viz. —

PEMBROKE DOCK.—Forthwith wholly in the Paris' Church; and that interment in the burial ground of St. John's, Pembroke Dock, be discontinued after the thirtieth of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, except in now existing vaults and walled graves, in which each coffin shall be embedded in charcoal and separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented; and except in earthen graves which can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing remains; such graves to be used only for the burial of the widowers, widows, parents, or unmarried children of those previously buried in the burial ground.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act further to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time, to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit;

And whereas Orders in Council have been made, directing the discontinuance of burials in the burial-ground hereinafter mentioned, from the time specified in such Orders respectively; and whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the time for discontinuing burials in the said burial-ground be postponed;

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in such burial-ground be postponed as follows, viz.:

In the burial-ground of the Methodist New Connexion Chapel, Grosvenor-street, Staley-bridge to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, on the same conditions as those relating to that burial-ground which are contained in the Order in Council of the twenty-ninth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five.

WHEREAS the Right Honourable Gathorne Hardy, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned, ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has, under the provisions of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in Henley-on-Thames without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued in the undermentioned parishes, with the following modifications, viz. :—

HENLEY-ON-THAMES.—Forthwith wholly in the church; and in the churchyard after the thirtieth of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, except in now existing vaults and walled graves, in which each coffin shall be separately enclosed by concrete or brickwork properly cemented.

St. JAMES', CROYDON.—Forthwith wholly in the church; and in the churchyard after the thirty-first of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, except in now existing vaults and walled graves, in which each coffin shall be embedded in charcoal and separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented, and except in now existing family graves in which no coffin has been buried within six feet below the surface of the ground.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the twenty-first day of December next:

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before the said twenty-first day of December.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament, held in the seventeenth and eighteenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to make further provision for the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the metropolis," it is

enacted that, in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the petition of the Town Council of any borough, stating that an Order in Council has been made for closing all or any of the burial-grounds of one or more parishes, being wholly or partly within such borough, and that there is difficulty or inconvenience in providing, under the powers of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the metropolis," requisite places of burial for the inhabitants of such parish or parishes, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that powers shall be vested in the Council of such borough for providing such places of burial under the provisions of the said Act: Provided always, that notice of such petition, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same shall be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette and in one of the newspapers usually circulating in such borough one month at least before such petition is so considered:

And whereas the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Stockton, in the county of Durham, in council assembled, have presented a petition to Her Majesty in Council, stating "that there are two churches situate within the borough of Stockton, namely, the church of Saint Thomas and the church of the Holy Trinity, each of which is provided with a burial-ground;" "that on the nineteenth day of June now last past, an Order was made by Her Majesty in Council, whereby it was ordered that burials should be discontinued forthwith wholly in the old parish churchyard of Saint Thomas, within the said borough, except in existing vaults and walled graves;" "that there is difficulty in providing, under the Act sixteen and seventeen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirty-four, requisite places of burial for the inhabitants of the said borough;" "that the petitioners are proper parties to provide a cemetery, and to have the management and control thereof;" and praying that Her Majesty would be pleased, by Order in Council, to invest the petitioners, as Town Council of the borough of Stockton, with the power of providing a burial-ground for the said borough, and constitute them the Burial Board for the said borough:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that powers be vested in the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Stockton, in council assembled, for providing requisite places of burial under the provisions of the said first-recited Act, intituled "An Act to make further provision for the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the metropolis," or of any other Act of Parliament relating to burials, for the inhabitants of the said borough of Stockton.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the third and fourth years of the reign of Her Majesty, chapter 96, for the regulation of the duties of postage, power is given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, from time to time, by Warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of British postage or inland postage, payable by law on the transmission by the post of foreign or colonial letters or newspapers, or of any other printed papers, and to subject the same to rates of postage according to the weight thereof, and a scale of weight to be contained in such Warrant, and from time to time, by Warrant as aforesaid, to alter or repeal any such altered rates, and make and establish any new or other rates in lieu thereof.

And whereas further powers are given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury by another Act, passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the tenth and eleventh years of the reign of Her Majesty, chapter 85, for giving further facilities for the transmission of letters by post, and for the regulating the duties of postage thereon, and for other purposes relating to the Post Office.

And whereas it is expedient to alter the rates of postage now chargeable on certain letters transmitted by the post between Gibraltar and Malta, and Egypt, and to fix certain other rates in lieu thereof, in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

Now, we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers reserved to us in and by the said hereinbefore recited Acts of Parliament respectively, and each of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, by the authority of the statute in that case made and provided, order, declare, and direct as follows; that is to say:

1. On every letter not exceeding one half of an ounce in weight posted in Gibraltar or Malta, addressed to Egypt, or posted in Egypt, addressed to Gibraltar or Malta, and transmitted by the post between Gibraltar or Malta and Egypt direct by British packet boat there shall be charged, taken, and paid an uniform rate of British postage of four pence.
