a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Godwald, situate at Finstall as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Stoke Prior which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Godwald, situate at Finstall as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Godwald, Finstall.'

"And, with the like consent of the said Henry, Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banus of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at such church, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We. therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Represention has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Godwald, Finstall, being:-

"All that part of the parish of Stoke Prior, in the county of Worcester, and in the diocese of Worcester, which is situate to the north-east of an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish from the parish of Bromsgrove, in the county and diocese aforesaid, at a point in the centre of the bridge which carries Tan House-lane over Salwarpe Brook; and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said lane to its junction with Sugar's Brook-lane; and extending thence first southeastward and then southward along the middle of the last named lane (thereby passing under the line of the Midland Railway), to a point in the centre of the bridge which carries the same lane over the stream called or known as Sugar's Brook; and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last named stream (thereby passing under the Worcester and Birmingham Canal), to a point near Beasley's Farm, on the south-eastern side of the bridge which carries Patchett's lane, over the same stream upon the boundary dividing the said parish of Stoke Prior from the parish of Tardebigg, situate partly in the said county of Worcester and partly in the county of Warwick, and wholly in the diocese of Worcester aforesaid,"

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, there-

fore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Worcester.
