AT the Court at *Windsor*, the 12th day of *December*, 1868.

PRESENT,

The **QUEEN's** Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by "The Merchant Shipping Law Amendment Act, 1853," it was, among other things, enacted that Her Majesty might from time to time, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, fix the establishment to be maintained by the Trinity House, the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses, and the Port of Dublin Corporation respectively, on account of the services of light-houses, and to be maintained by the Trinity House on account of the services to which the said ballastage rates are to be applied aforesaid, or the annual or other sums to be paid out of the Mercantile Marine Fund in respect of such establishments, and that if it appeared that any part of the establishments of the Trinity House, or of the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses, or of the Port of Dublin Corporation respectively, was maintained for the purposes of the said Act, and also for other purposes Her Majesty might fix and from time to time alter the portion of the expense of such establishments to be paid out of the Mercantile Marine Fund :

And whereas it was made to appear to Her Majesty that part of the establishment of the Port of Dublin Corporation was maintained for the purposes of the said recited Act, and also for other purposes :

And whereas Her Majesty, by Order in Council, dated the eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, was pleased to fix the establishment therein mentioned which might be maintained by the said Port of Dublin Corporation, and to fix that in respect of the said establishment two-thirds of the aggregate amount of the salaries which under the provisions thereof should for the time being be paid to the officers of the said establishment, should be paid out of the Mercantile Marine Fund. And whereas the said recited enactment was repealed by "The Merchant Shipping Repeal Act, 1854," but the

operation of the said Order in Council was reserved. And whereas by "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," which came into operation on the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, it was, amongst other things, enacted, that Her Majesty might from time to time, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, fix the establishment to be maintained by each of the said General Lighthouse Authorities on account of the Services of Lighthouses, Buoy, and Beacons, and also as regards the Trinity House, on account of the service of Lastage and Ballastage in the River Thames, or the annual or other sums to be paid out of the said fund in respect of such establishments; and that if it appeared that any part of the establishments of the said Lighthouse authorities was maintained for the purposes of such duties, and also for other purposes, Her Majesty might, by the like Order, fix and from time to time alter the portion of the expense of such establishments to be paid out of the said fund. And whereas by "The Dublin Port Act, 1867," it was, among other things, enacted, that on the passing thereof the Port of Dublin Corporation should be deemed to be severed from the Corporation for preserving and improving the Port of Dublin, and thenceforth the name of the first-mentioned Corporation should be "The Commissioners of Irish Lights," and the name of the secondly-mentioned Corporation should be "The Dublin Port and Docks Board," and each of these Corporations should be deemed to be a separate and distinct body corporate, with perpetual succession and a distinct common seal. And whereas it is expedient that the establishment by the said recited Order fixed to be maintained as aforesaid by the Port of Dublin Corporation be no longer maintained, and that a new establishment be maintained by the Commissioners of Irish Lights, no part of which shall be maintained for purposes other than the services of the lighthouses, buoys, and beacons :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the power vested in Her by "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to fix, and doth hereby fix, that in lieu of the establishment directed by the said Order in Council of the eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, to be maintained by the Port of Dublin Corporation, on account of the services in the firstly recited Act and in the said Order mentioned, that the following establishment

shall be maintained by the Commissioners of Irish Lights, that is to say :

The establishment of the Commissioners of Irish Lights shall consist of the officers named in the schedule hereto, at the salaries, the minimum, annual increase, and maximum of which are respectively mentioned in the same schedule :

And Her Majesty, by virtue and in further exercise of the power so vested in Her as aforesaid, and by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to fix, and doth hereby fix, that the foregoing portion of this present Order in Council shall not affect or apply to the offices at present held and the salaries at present enjoyed by such of the officers of the existing establishment as are paid wholly or partially out of the Mercantile Marine Fund :

And Her Majesty, by virtue and in further exercise of the power so vested in Her as aforesaid, and by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to fix, and doth hereby fix, that from and after the date of this Order the entire amount of the salaries which shall at the date of this present Order in Council be payable to such of the officers of the existing establishment as are paid either wholly or partially out of the Mercantile Marine Fund, and the entire amount of the salaries which under the provisions of this present Order in Council shall for the time being be payable to the officers of the establishment of the Commissioners of Irish Lights, shall be payable out of the Mercantile Marine Fund.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Guatemala, reporting that in order to provide means for the payment of a sum of 8,000 dollars, which the Government of Honduras has engaged to pay annually to the Panama Steam Ship Company, the President of that Republic has published a Decree, dated 9th September last, which imposes a duty of 3 per cent, upon gold and silver bullion when exported, the marc of silver being valued at 8 dollars, the ounce of refined gold at 15 dollars, and the ounce of unrefined gold at 10 dollars.

**IN THE MATTER OF THE FACTORY ACTS
EXTENSION ACT, 1867.**

WHEREAS due proof has been made to the satisfaction of me, the undersigned, Gathorne Hardy, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that the customs of the Trades carried on in the Factories specified in the Schedule hereto, require that the children, young persons, and women working in such Factories should be employed between the hours hereinafter mentioned: Now I, the said Gathorne Hardy, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the twelfth Article of the Schedule annexed to the Factory Acts Extension Act, 1867, do by this, my Order, give permission to the occupiers of the said Factories to employ the children, young persons, and women working in such Factories between the hours of seven o'clock in the morning and seven o'clock in the evening, or between eight o'clock in the morning and eight o'clock in the evening, instead of between the hours of six o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the evening, subject to the conditions in the said Act contained.

(No. 109.)—WEST INDIES—HONDURAS GULF.

Fixed Lights on Mauger Cay

THE Colonial Government at British Honduras has given notice, that lights have been exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Mauger cay, north of Turneffe islands, at the northern approach to Belize.

The lights are three fixed white lights facing to the N.E. and S.W., the two lower lights elevated 49 feet, and the upper light 53 feet, above the level of the sea. In clear weather they should be seen from a distance of 13 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses.

The lighthouse is 57 feet high, and constructed of iron; the upper part is painted black and the lower part white. The lights can be seen above the trees from all points of the compass, but the lighthouse is seen from seaward alone from N.E. to S.W. by W. It stands in lat. 17° 37½' N., long. 87° 45½' West of Greenwich.
