THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Guatemala, reporting that in order to provide means for the payment of a sum of 8,000 dollars, which the Government of Honduras has engaged to pay annually to the Panama Steam Ship Company, the President of that Republished a Decree, dated 9th September last, which imposes a duty of 3 per cent, upon gold and silver bullion when exported, the marc of silver being valued at 8 dollars, the ounce of refined gold at 15 dollars, and the ounce of unrefined gold at 10 dollars.
