#### Whitehall, December 19, 1868.

The Queen has been gleased to give and grant unto William Bradshaw, of the Lower Lee, within the township of Over Wyersdale, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, Gentleman, only son and heir of Thomas Bradshaw, late of Lancaster, in the said County Palatine, Gentleman, who was the second son of Robert Bradshaw, late of Lancaster aforesaid, Gentleman, by Mary Ann, his wife, all deceased, Her Royal licence and authority that he and his issue may, in compliance with a proviso contained in the last will and testament of Richard Hathornthwaite, late of the Lower Lee aforesaid, Gentleman, deceased, take and henceforth use the surname of Hathornthwaite only in lieu and instead of that of Bradshaw, and that he and they may take and bear the arms of Hathornthwaite, such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's said College of Arms.

Board of Trade, Whitehall, December 24, 1868.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, an extract from the "Moniteur," containing a Decree, dated 17th December, 1868, of which the following are the Articles :--

ART. 1. The re-exportation, after being dyed or printed, of tissues temporarily admitted free of duty, must be effected within four months from the date of their importation.

ART. 2. Our Minister of Agriculture, Commerce, and Public Works, and our Minister of Finance are charged each in his own department with the execution of the present Decree.
