NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 8.)—BALTIC—GULF OF FINLAND.

Fixed Light at Hangö Head Road.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 101, dated 28th October, 1868, the Russian Government has given notice that the light at the entrance of Hangö Road, therein mentioned, has been exhibited since the 7th day of November, 1868.

The light is a *fixed* light, showing *red* from the entrance of the roads, or when bearing from N.N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. round by West and South to S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., and *white* towards the anchorage from S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. to E. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. It is elevated 40 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of seven miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric.

The light is exhibited from a lantern on an iron pillar at the northern extremity of Gustafs-svard Island; its position is in lat. $59^{\circ} 48' N.$, long. $22^{\circ} 57' \frac{1}{2}$ East from Greenwich.

The light will be exhibited from the 1st August to the 1st May.

Directions.—Vessels entering Hangö Road should keep within the limits of the red light, and anchor when in sight of the white light.
