**T**HIS day, the Right Honourable George, Lord de Tabley, Lord Justice Sir George Markham Giffard, and James Stansfeld, Esquire, were, by Her Majesty's command, sworn of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took their places at the Board accordingly.

**W**HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty,

dated the third day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by your Majesty's Order in Council, dated the sixteenth of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, a scale of establishment and salaries is fixed for the Officers and others in your Majesty's Naval Hospital at Greenwich, which does not include the appointment of a Visitor and Governor; we humbly beg leave to represent to your Majesty that in consequence of the recent death of Admiral of the Fleet Sir James Alexander Gordon, G.C.B., who long held the office of Governor, we are of opinion that it is desirable to select an Officer of your Majesty's Navy of rank not lower than that of Vice-Admiral to be 'Visitor and Governor' of the Hospital, to whom we may from time to time assign such duties as may be thought fit.

"We further beg leave to submit that the salary attached to this office should be £1,200 per annum to an Admiral, and £1,000 per annum to a Vice-Admiral.

The Lords Commissioners of your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence with this proposal."

Her Majesty having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the 6th and 7th years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to remove doubts as to the exercise of power and jurisdiction by Her Majesty within divers countries and places out of Her Majesty's dominions, and to render the same more effectual," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it is and shall be lawful for Her Majesty to hold, exercise, and enjoy any power or jurisdiction which Her Majesty now hath, or may at any time hereafter have, within any country or place out of Her Majesty's dominions, in the same and as ample a manner as if Her Majesty had acquired such power or jurisdiction by the cession or conquest of territory:

And whereas Her Majesty hath power and jurisdiction in the dominions of Her Majesty the Queen of Madagascar:

And whereas it is expedient to make provision for the due and effectual exercise of such power and jurisdiction:

1. Now, therefore, in pursuance and by virtue of the said recited Act of Parliament, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Her Majesty's Consuls appointed to reside in the dominions of the Queen of Madagascar shall have full power and authority to carry into effect,
