WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the seventh day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, in the words following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church situate at Burleydam, in the chapelry of Wrenbury, in the parish of Acton, in the county of Chester, and in the diocese of Chester.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said chapelry of Wrenbury, in the said parish of Acton and of the parish of Audlem, in the county and diocese aforesaid, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches, of such chapelry and parish respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said chapelry of Wrenbury, in the parish of Acton aforesaid, and of the said parish of Audlem, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church, situate at Burleydam, as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of the said diocese of Chester, with the consent of John Tollmache, of Saint James's Square, in the city of Westminster, Esquire, the patron of the vicarage of the said parish of Acton, with the consent of the Reverend Robert Scarr Redfern, the vicar or incumbent of the same vicarage, and as such vicar or incumbent the patron of the perpetual curacy of the said chapelry of Wrenbury, and with the consent of the Right Honourable Wellington Henry Viscount Combermere, the patron of the vicarage of the said parish of Audlem (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said chapelry of Wrenbury, in the parish of Acton aforesaid, and of the said parish of Audlem, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry, for the said church, situate at Burleydam, as aforesaid, and that the same should be named "The Consolidated Chapelry of Burleydam," and that the right of presentation and

appointment to the church of such consolidated chapelry should belong to, and be exercised by, the said Wellington Henry Viscount Combermere, his heirs and assigns for ever.

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Burleydam, being:—

"All that portion of the chapelry of Wrenbury, in the parish of Acton, in the county of Chester, and in the diocese of Chester, and also all that contiguous portion of the parish of Audlem in the same county and diocese, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary, which divides the said chapelry of Wrenbury from the parish of Audlem aforesaid, at a point in the centre of Barnet Brook Bridge, that is, in the middle of the road leading from Aston, past Royle's Green, and Dodcott cum Wilkesley, to Market Drayton, and extending thence southward for a distance of three miles or thereabouts, along the middle of the said road, to its junction with the road leading to the Morrey, at or near to Wilkesley Lodge, which forms the northern entrance to Shavington Park, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last described road to the boundary dividing the said county of Chester from the county of Salop, and extending thence generally north-westward for a distance of seven miles, or thereabouts, along the said county boundary, to its junction on the western side of Combermere Park, with the boundary which divides the said chapelry of Wrenbury from the parish of Marbury, in the said county of Chester, and in the diocese of Chester, and extending thence north-eastward along the last-mentioned parish boundary (thereby following the wall or fence forming the western boundary of Combermere Park) as far as the point where the same parish boundary diverges to the north-west, and extending thence generally eastward along the middle of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of Combermere Park as aforesaid, as far as the point where the said wall or fence impinges upon the Whitchurch and Nantwich Road, near to the northern end of the road leading to Boldriding, and extending thence north-eastward, for a distance of half a mile or thereabouts along the middle of the said Whitchurch and Nantwich Road, to its junction with a certain cross road, leading past Moor Hall, into the road which leads from Aston to Market Drayton, as first mentioned, and extending thence first south-eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of the said cross road, to its junction with the road leading from Aston to Market Drayton as aforesaid, and extending thence southward, for a distance of three quarters of a mile or thereabouts, along the middle of the last described road, to the first described point in the centre of Barnet Brook Bridge aforesaid, where the said imaginary line commenced."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventh day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Hetton-le-Hole (some time part of the parish of Houghton-le-Spring) in the county of Durham and in the diocese of Durham, and out of the parish of Pitlington in the same county and diocese.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish of Hetton-le-Hole and of the said parish of Pitlington which are hereinafter mentioned and described (such portions not at present containing within their limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship) should be constituted a separate district in the manner hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the said parish of Houghton-le-Spring have become vested in us, under the provisions of and for the purposes of the herein-mentioned Acts, or of some of them, and we have in respect of such hereditaments and premises agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act, to the Incumbent of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted, so soon as one shall have been appointed and licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-mentioned Act, and to his successors, a grant of two hundred pounds per annum:

"And whereas the grant aforesaid will be made by an instrument to be executed by us under our common seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and

thirtieth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said parish of Hetton-le-Hole and of the said parish of Pitlington which are mentioned and described in the Schedule hereunder written, and which are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Lyons.'

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing scheme has reference.

"The District of Lyons, being:—

"All that portion of the parish of Hetton-le-Hole (some time part of the parish of Houghton-le-Spring), in the county of Durham and in the diocese of Durham, which is situate to the south and east of an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the parish of Dalton-le-Dale, in the same county and diocese, from the said parish of Hetton-le-Hole, at a point, at or near to Sandy Gate, where Salter's Lane is intersected by the road leading from Murton through Lyons to Hetton-le-Hole, and extending thence in a direction generally westward along the middle of the said road to the point where it crosses the line of the Elemore Colliery Railway, and extending thence southward for a distance of fifty-four chains, or thereabouts, along the middle of the said line of railway to a point near the Elemore Colliery, upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Hetton-le-Hole from the parish of Pitlington in the county and diocese aforesaid.

"And also all that portion of the said parish of Pitlington wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls, which is bounded on the north and on the north-east by the parish of Hetton-le-Hole as aforesaid, on the south-east by the new parish of Shotton-with-Haswell, in the county and diocese aforesaid, and on the remaining side, that is to say, on the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing at a boundary stone inscribed 'L. D. 1869, No. 1,' and placed upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Shotton-with-Haswell from the parish of Pitlington aforesaid, on the eastern side of a certain roadway and footpath which leads from Pig Hill to Elemore Vale, and extending thence north-westward to and along the middle of the said roadway and footpath to its junction with the road leading from Easington Lane to New Pitlington, and extending thence south-westward for a distance of nine chains and a half, or thereabouts, along the middle of the said road, to a point opposite to a boundary stone inscribed 'L. D. 1869, No. 2,' and placed on the north-western side of the same road, at the south-eastern end of the wall or fence dividing the premises belonging to the Hetton Coal Company, and known as Elemore Colliery as aforesaid, from the closes

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Durham.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation, as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Philip and Saint James, situate at Neston, in the parish of Corsham, in the county of Wilts, and in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Philip and Saint James, situate at Neston as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles John, Bishop of the said diocese of Gloucester and Bristol (testified by his having signed and sealed this representa-

tion), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Corsham, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Philip and Saint James, situate at Neston as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Philip and Saint James, Neston.'

"And with the like consent of the said Charles John, Bishop of the said diocese of Gloucester and Bristol (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at such church, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns, and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism, or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Philip, and Saint James, Neston, being:

"All that part of the parish of Corsham, in the county of Wilts, and in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls, which is bounded on the south by the 'parish of Atworth with South Wraxall annexed,' in the said county of Wilts, and in the diocese of Salisbury, on the west by the parish of Box, in the said county of Wilts, and in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol aforesaid; and on all other sides, that is to say, on the north and on the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the last-named parish from the parish of Corsham aforesaid, at a point in the middle of the lane leading from Wadswick, past West-park Barn, to Corsham, near to which said point a boundary stone inscribed 'N. St. P. and St. J. D. C., 1869, No. 1,' has been placed; and extending thence north-eastward, for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts along the middle of the said lane to its junction with Potley-lane; and extending thence first south-eastward along the middle of the last-named lane (thereby crossing over the Box Tunnel of the Great Western Railway), and then alternately north-eastward and northward, along the middle of the same lane, to the centre of the bridge which carries the same lane over the line of the Great Western Railway aforesaid; and extending thence north-eastward for a distance of thirty-one chains or thereabouts, along the middle of the said line of railway (thereby passing the Corsham Railway Station), to the centre of the bridge which carries the same line of railway over the lane leading from Pound Pill to Lipiat Farm, and extending thence south-westward, for a distance

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church, situate at Appleton-upon-Wiske as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of York, and with the consent of the Right Reverend Robert, Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon (testified by their having respectively signed and sealed this representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Great Smeaton which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church, situate at Appleton-upon-Wiske as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Appleton-upon-Wiske.'

"And, with the like consent of the said William, Archbishop of York, and of the said Robert, Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at such church, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns, and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices, should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism, or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

**THE SANITARY ACT, 1866, AND THE
SEWAGE UTILIZATION ACT, 1867.**

**ORDER FOR UNITING THE LOCAL BOARDS OF THE
BOROUGH AND PARISH OF FALMOUTH, IN THE
COUNTY OF CORNWALL.**

And the first meeting of the said Board shall take place on Monday, the 22nd day of February instant, at the office of the Local Board for the said borough.

And in the event of any Member so elected dying, refusing to serve, resigning, or retiring before the expiration of his period of office, the vacancy so caused shall be filled up within fifteen days after the first meeting of the Board following the vacancy, by fresh election from the Members of the Board from which the Member so dying, refusing to serve, resigning, or retiring, was originally elected.

And the expenses incurred by the said Joint Sewerage Board shall be defrayed out of a common fund to be contributed by the Component Districts, in proportion to the rateable value of each district, and computed yearly.
