In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that a letter from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, stating it to be his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

WHEREAS the Lords of Her Majesty's Privy Council by their Orders, dated respectively the twentieth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, the seventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and the twenty-third day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, did direct that every vessel coming from or having touched at the Port of Saint Thomas, or at any port or place lying between longitude fifty-two and one hundred degrees West of Greenwich, and between four and thirty-two degrees North latitude, shall come to an anchor at such place as may be appointed by the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs, for the purpose of having the state of the health of the crew of the vessel ascertained before such vessel shall be permitted to enter port;

And whereas, in the opinion of their Lordships, the necessity for the above-recited restrictions no longer exists;

Now, therefore, the Lords of the Council, in exercise of the powers vested in them, do hereby revoke the restrictions imposed by the above-named Orders of the twentieth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and the seventh day of March and the twenty-third day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
