PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Rooms, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that a letter from the Lady who is to make the presentation, stating it to be her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's appro-

bation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that a letter from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, stating it to be his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at these Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

HER Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received intelligence from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Lima, that three British subjects named as follows:—Martin, an Engineer; Sunderland, a Carpenter; and Hill, a Blacksmith; have been drowned in the Lake of Titicaca, in the Province of Puno, Peru, through the capsizing of a small boat in which they were returning from a visit to the Island of Esteves.

MR. CORBETT, Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires in Central America, has transmitted to the Earl of Clarendon the following translation of the two first Articles of a Decree issued by the Government of Honduras, laying down certain

rules respecting the bonds, bills, and other documents pertaining to the public debt of that Republic.

(Translation.)

Articles I. and II. of the Decree of the President of Honduras, 18th December, 1868,

Art. I. All holders of Government bonds, bills, on the Treasury, or other documents pertaining to the Internal Debt of the National Treasury, are peremptorily required to present them to the Comptrollers of the Revenue of the Republic, within the term of three months from the present date, under the strict penalty of losing their securities. Those, however, who are residing outside of the Republic shall have a term of six months, with the same penalty.

Art. II. These documents shall be "visé"ed at the Intendances of the Provinces, and at the custom houses of the maritime ports, and, if found legitimate, shall have put upon them the stamp of the office, an acknowledgment of presentation, the date and the signature of the Comptroller.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received intelligence through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Her Majesty's Minister at Buenos Ayres, that on the occasion of the opening of the railway from Rosario to Cordova, towards the end of 1869, the Argentine Government have determined to hold an Exhibition of the Arts and Products of that Republic at Cordova, for the purpose of developing its external and internal commerce.

In this Exhibition, the opening of which has been fixed for the 17th April, 1870, will also be admitted machinery introduced from abroad, as well as agricultural implements that are applied or can be applied usefully in that country.

For every 1000 kilos of cargo destined for the port of Carthagena 10 reals, and 2½ reals for the works of the port.

These dues include everything, so that a vessel taking in cargo pays no more either at Carthagena or at any other port on the coast, and vessels entering in ballast pay no dues at all.

SOLDIERS' BALANCES UNCLAIMED

IN pursuance of the "Regimental Debts Act, 1863," notice is hereby given, that Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department has available, for distribution amongst the next of kin, the sum of money set opposite to the name of each of the deceased soldiers named in the list which is published with this notice in the "London Gazette," and the "Army List," and is also to be seen at the Quarters of the several Staff Officers for the Recruiting and Pension Service throughout the United Kingdom.

Applications from persons supposing themselves entitled as next of kin should be addressed by letter to "The Under-Secretary of State, War Office, London, S.W.," and marked outside "Soldier's Effects."

No application can be attended to which does not state the dates and places of the soldier's birth, enlistment, and death, and the name of his regiment; his regimental number should also be stated if known.

Should these particulars furnished by the applicant not agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then within three calendar months the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicants' inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.—Dated this 25th day of March, 1869.
