REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a

Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that a letter from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, stating it to be his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at these Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at one o'clock.

A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS We have taken into consideration the state of the Copper Coin of this Kingdom, and have deemed it expedient, with the advice of Our Privy Council, that all Copper Monies of this Realm commonly called a Penny, a Half Penny, a Farthing, and a Half Farthing, coined at Our Mint and current in Our dominions by virtue of any Proclamation prior to the seventeenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty, should be called in and re-coined: And whereas considerable quantities of the said Copper Monies before-mentioned have been

received and exchanged at Our Mint, so that only a small portion of such monies now remain in circulation :

We do therefore, by this Our Royal Proclamation, and with the advice of Our Privy Council, think proper to declare and command, and We do declare and command that no Copper Monies whatsoever (other than and except such Bronze Monies as are now current by virtue of Our Proclamation, bearing date the seventeenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty, or any Proclamation dated subsequently to the said seventeenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty,) shall be allowed to pass or be current in any payment whatsoever within the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland after the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.

Given at Our Court at *Windsor*, this thirteenth day of *May*, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, and in the thirty-second year of Our reign.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the powers vested in Her Majesty by an Act of Parliament passed in the session of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, chapter ninety-four, entitled an "An Act to remove doubts as to the exercise of power and jurisdiction by Her Majesty within divers countries and places out of Her Majesty's dominions, and to render the same more effectual," Her Majesty was pleased by an Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, to make provision for the due exercise of the power and jurisdiction which Her Majesty had in the dominions of the Emperor of China and in the dominions of the Tycoon of Japan: and whereas it is necessary at the present time that the provisions of the said Order should be made applicable to the Mikado of Japan, instead of to the Tycoon of Japan as therein set forth :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her Majesty by the aforesaid Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, is pleased by and with the advice of

Her Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows :

Wherever in the aforesaid Order of the ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, reference is made to the Tycoon of Japan, such reference shall, from and after the receipt of this present Order by Her Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary in Japan, be held to apply to the Mikado of Japan in place of the Tycoon :

And the Right Honourable the Earl of Clarendon and the Right Honourable the Earl Granville, two of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fourth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, in the words and figures following; that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for effecting an exchange of the patronage of the benefice (being a perpetual curacy or a vicarage) of Saint Bartholomew, Quorndon, situate in the county of Leicester, and in the diocese of Peterborough, and of the benefice (being a perpetual curacy or a vicarage) of Saint Peter, Mountsorrel, situate in the same county and diocese, for the patronage of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Fulbourn, All Saints, situate in the county of Cambridge, and in the diocese of Ely.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of, and to the said benefices of, Saint Bartholomew, Quorndon, and Saint Peter, Mountsorrel, and each of them, and the churches thereof respectively, is vested absolutely in the Master, Fellows, and Scholars of the College of Saint John the Evangelist, in the University of Cambridge, and their successors.

"And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of, and to the said benefice of, Fulbourn All Saints, is vested absolutely in the Right Reverend William Connor, Bishop of the said diocese of Peterborough, as such Bishop, and in his successors Bishops of the same diocese.

"And whereas the Reverend William Henry Bateson, Doctor in Divinity, the Master and the Fellows and Scholars of the said College of Saint John the Evangelist, in the University of Cambridge, and the said William Connor, Bishop of

the said diocese of Peterborough, have respectively signified to us their desire that the patronage of the said three benefices respectively, may be re-arranged, by way of exchange, in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

“And whereas we have made due enquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative values of the said benefices and patronage, and we do hereby certify to your Majesty that the circumstances and present values of the said three benefices respectively are as set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed.

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the said William Henry Bateson, the Master, and the Fellows and Scholars of the said College of Saint John the Evangelist, in the University of Cambridge, and with the consent of the said William Connor, Bishop of the said diocese of Peterborough (in testimony of which consent to this scheme the said Master, Fellows, and Scholars have affixed their common or corporate seal, and the said Bishop hath affixed his signature and episcopal seal), we humbly recommend and propose that, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and to the said benefice of Saint Bartholomew, Quorndon, and the church thereof, and also the whole advowson or perpetual right of patron-

age of and to the said benefice of Saint Peter, Mountsorrel, and the church thereof, shall, and each of them shall, be assigned and transferred from the said Master, Fellows, and Scholars of the said College of Saint John the Evangelist, in the University of Cambridge; and their successors; in whom as aforesaid the same are now vested, and shall, and each of the same two advowsons shall, become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may be exercised by the said William Connor, Bishop of the said diocese of Peterborough, and his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever; and that in exchange for the same two advowsons or perpetual rights of patronage of and to the said two lastly-named benefices and the churches thereof, the advowson or perpetual patronage of the said benefice of Fulbourn All Saints shall be assigned and transferred from the said William Connor, Bishop of the said diocese of Peterborough, and from his successors; and shall become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may be exercised by, the said Master, Fellows, and Scholars of the said College of Saint John the Evangelist, in the University of Cambridge, and their successors for ever.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them; in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church situate at Millbrook, in the parish of Maker, which said parish is situate partly in the county of Devon, and partly in the county of Cornwall, and wholly in the diocese of Exeter.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church situate at Millbrook aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Maker which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church situate at Millbrook as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Millbrook.'

"And with the like consent of the said Henry, Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, should be solemnized or performed at such church, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns, and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Millbrook being:—

"All that part of the parish of Maker, situate partly in the county of Devon, and partly in the county of Cornwall, and wholly in the diocese of Exeter, which is comprised within and is bounded by an imaginary line, commencing at a boundary stone, inscribed 'M. D. C. 1869, No. 1,' and placed at or near the south-western end of the premises known as Woodpark Ropewalk, at a point on the south-eastern side of the road which leads along the southern shore of Millbrook Lake, from Woodpark, past the northern side of the house and grounds called Westpark to Millbrook; and extending thence, first south-westward and then westward for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts, along the middle of the said road, to a boundary stone inscribed 'M. D. C. 1869, No. 2,' and placed at or near to the junction of the same road, with the road which leads from Anderton House past the western side of Westpark aforesaid to Maker Heights; and extending thence south-westward and in a direct line for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts, to a boundary stone inscribed 'M. D. C. 1869, No. 3,' and placed on the north-eastern side of the road which leads from Millbrook by Mount Pleasant to Maker, at a point in the middle of the south-western end of the fence which divides the close numbered 343 upon the map of the Ordnance survey, of the said parish of Maker, published in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, and upon the map hereunto annexed, from the close numbered 344 upon

the same maps; and extending thence almost due west, and in a direct line for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to a boundary stone inscribed 'M. D. C., 1869, No. 4,' and placed on the north-eastern side of the road leading from Millbrook to Kingsand, at a point in the middle of the south-western end of the fence dividing the close numbered 328 upon the said maps from the close numbered 327 upon the same maps; and extending thence, still westward, but with a slight inclination to the north, and in a direct line, for a distance of twenty-four chains, or thereabouts (thereby passing to the south of Millbrook Church, and crossing the road leading from Millbrook to Radford), to a boundary stone inscribed 'M. D. C. 1869, No. 5,' and placed on the southern side of the road leading from West-street, Millbrook, to Tregantle, at a point in the middle of the north-western end of the fence which divides the close numbered 289 upon the said maps from the close numbered 290 upon the same maps; and extending thence, north-eastward, and in a direct line, for a distance of eight chains, or thereabouts, to a boundary stone inscribed 'M. D. C. 1869, No. 6,' and placed on the northern side of the road which connects Saint Andrew-street, Millbrook, with the road leading to Tregantle as aforesaid, at a point in the middle of the south-eastern end of the fence dividing the close numbered 284 upon the said maps from the close numbered 304 upon the same maps: and extending thence, north-eastward, and in a direct line, for a distance of twenty chains, or thereabouts, to a boundary stone inscribed 'M. D. C. 1869, No. 7,' and placed on the eastern side of the road called or known as Blindwell-hill, at a point in the middle of the western end of the fence which divides the close numbered 184 upon the said maps from the close numbered 185 upon the same maps; and continuing thence, still north-eastward, and in a direct line, for a distance of twelve and a-half chains, or thereabouts to a boundary stone inscribed 'M. D. C., 1869, No. 8,' and place on the western side of the road leading from Newport-street to Inwork Mill, at a point in the middle of the north-eastern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 188, upon the said maps from the close numbered 191, upon the same maps; and extending thence, first north-eastward to and then alternately north-westward and north-eastward along the middle of the last-described road, to its junction with the road which leads along the northern shore of Millbrook Lake aforesaid, and which is called or known as 'The Garrets,' at or near to which point of junction a boundary stone inscribed 'M. D. C., 1869, No. 9,' has been placed; and extending thence, south-eastward, and in a direct line, for a distance of forty-seven and a half claims or thereabouts across Millbrook Lake, to the first described boundary stone on its southern shore, where the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Exeter.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty four; of the Act of the fifth year of His Majesty King George the Fourth, chapter one hundred and three; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Philip and Saint James, situate in the parish of Leckhampton, in the county of Gloucester, and in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol.

"Whereas it has been represented to us that the said church of Saint Philip and Saint James, situate in the said parish of Leckhampton, was built by subscription under and by virtue of the powers or authorities for such purpose contained in the secondly hereinbefore-mentioned Act, and that such church was, in or about the year one thousand eight hundred and forty, duly consecrated.

"And whereas it has been further represented to us that the several persons whose individual subscriptions to the fund raised for the erection of such church amounted to fifty pounds and upwards, did, in accordance with the powers or authorities contained in the Act lastly referred to, elect from among themselves, three trustees as the life trustees of the same church, for the several purposes contemplated by the same Act.

"And whereas it has been further represented to us, that the Reverend Charles Brandon Trye, Clerk, the patron and also the rector or incumbent of the rectory of the said parish of Leckhampton, the Reverend John Edwards, Clerk, of the Priory, Prestbury, in the said county of Gloucester, and the Reverend Charles Henry Watling, Clerk, the rector or incumbent of the rectory of the parish of Tredington, in the county of Worcester, and in the diocese of Worcester, are now the majority of the surviving subscribers entitled under the provisions of the lastly-mentioned Act, to elect the trustees of the said church of Saint Philip and Saint James, situate in the parish of Leckhampton aforesaid.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Philip and Saint James, situate in the said parish of Leckhampton.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles John, Bishop of the said diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, as such Bishop, with the consent of the said Charles Brandon

Trye, the patron and also the rector or incumbent of the rectory of the said parish of Leckhampton; and with the consents of the said John Edwards; and of the said Charles Henry Watling, and with the consent of the Reverend William Henry Hutchinson, the minister or incumbent of the said church of Saint Philip and Saint James, situate in the said parish of Leckhampton (testified by their having respectively signed and sealed this representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Leckhampton, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Philip and Saint James, situate in the parish of Leckhampton as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Philip and Saint James, Leckhampton.'

"And, with the like consent of the said Charles John, Bishop of the said diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, of the said Charles Brandon Trye, John Edwards, Charles Henry Watling, and William Henry Hutchinson (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at such church, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns, and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices, should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism, or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet."

The **SCHEDULE** to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Philip and Saint James, Leckhampton, being:—

"All that part of the parish of Leckhampton, in the county of Gloucester, and in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, which is bounded, on the south-west, partly by the parish of Badgeworth, in the said county and diocese, and partly by the hamlet of Up Hatherley, in the parish or parochial chapelry of Cheltenham, in the same county and diocese; on the north, partly by the said hamlet of Up Hatherley, and partly by the new parish of Saint Mark, Cheltenham, the district chapelry of Christ Church, Cheltenham, and the parish or parochial chapelry of Cheltenham aforesaid, all in the county and diocese aforesaid; on the east, partly by the new parish of Saint Luke, Cheltenham, in the same county and diocese; and on the remaining side, that is to say, on the south-east, by an imaginary line, commencing upon the boundary which divides the last-named new parish from the parish of Leckhampton aforesaid, at a point in the middle of Naunton-lane; and extending thence, south-westward, for a distance of five chains, or thereabouts, along the middle of the said lane to its junction with the Bath turnpike road; and extending thence, southward, for

a distance of six and a half chains, or thereabouts, along the middle of the said turnpike road to its junction with Moorend-road; and extending thence, south-westward, along the middle of the last-named road to its junction with the new road leading to Fullwood Park; and extending thence, north-westward, along the middle of the said new road to its junction with the Painswick turnpike road; and extending thence, south-westward, for a distance of seventy-three chains, or thereabouts, along the middle of the last-named turnpike road to the boundary which divides the said parish of Leckhampton from the parish of Badgeworth aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the respective Registrars of the said diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, at Gloucester and at Bristol.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have in pursuance of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter forty one, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council, a scheme, bearing date the twenty-second day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty nine, in the words following; that is to say:—

We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of your Majesty, chapter forty-one, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for setting out and constituting a district for spiritual purposes, and annexing such district to the consecrated church of Saint Matthew, Ardwick, situate within the limits of the new parish of Saint Thomas, Ardwick (some time part of the parish of Manchester), in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester.

Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district for spiritual purposes should be set out and constituted for and annexed to the said church of Saint Matthew, Ardwick, situate within the limits of the new parish of Saint Thomas, Ardwick, as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend James Prince, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester, testified by his having signed and sealed this scheme, we humbly recommend and propose, that all those portions of the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Ardwick, and of the new parish of Saint Stephen, Chorlton-upon-Medlock

(also some time part of the parish of Manchester aforesaid), which are respectively described in the schedule hereunder written, and are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, be severed and disannexed from the same new parishes respectively, and shall be set out and constituted for and annexed to the said church of Saint Matthew, Ardwick, situate within the limits of the new parish of Saint Thomas, Ardwick as aforesaid, and shall become and be a district for spiritual purposes, and shall be named 'The District of Saint Matthew, Ardwick.'

"And we further recommend and propose; that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or to any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the herein-named Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Matthew, Ardwick being:—

"All those contiguous portions of the new parish of Saint Thomas, Ardwick, and of the new parish of Saint Stephen, Chorlton-upon-Medlock, both which said new parishes were respectively some time part of the original parish of Manchester, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester, all which said portions of such new parishes are bounded on the north-east for the most part by the new parish of Saint Mark, Gorton, also some time part of the said parish of Manchester, and on all other sides, that is to say, on the remaining part of the north-east, on the north-west, on the south-west, and on the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point near Ardwick Station, at the junction of the line of the Manchester and Sheffield Railway with the line of the London and North-Western Railway, where the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mark, Gorton, from the new parish of Saint Thomas, Ardwick aforesaid, meets the boundary dividing the last named new parish from the new parish of Saint Silas, Ardwick, also some time part of the original parish of Manchester aforesaid; and extending thence, north-westward, along the last described boundary, to a point in the centre of the bridge which carries the line of the London and North-Western Railway aforesaid over the southern end of Chancery-lane: and extending thence, southward, for a distance of thirteen chains and a-half, or thereabouts, to and along the middle of the street or road called or known as Summer-place, to a point opposite the eastern end of the wall forming the southern boundary of the Ardwick Cemetery; and extending thence, westward, to and along the middle of the said wall to a point at the entrance to the said cemetery in the middle of the north-eastern end of Ford-street; and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named street, to its junction with Hyde-road; and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named road, to its junction with Syndall-street; and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named street, to the boundary at the junction of the same street with Stockport-road, which divides the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Ardwick, from the new parish of Saint Stephen, Chorlton-upon-Medlock aforesaid; and extending

thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named road, thereby following in part the last-described boundary, to the junction of the same road with Grey-street; and extending thence first north-eastward and then eastward, along the middle of the last-named street to its junction with South-street; and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named street, to the boundary at the junction of the same street, with the street or road called or known as Richmond-grove East, which divides the said new parish of Saint Stephen, Chorlton-upon-Medlock, from the new parish of Saint John, Longsight, also some time part of the original parish of Manchester aforesaid; and extending thence north-eastward along the last-described boundary to a point in the middle of the London and North-Western Railway aforesaid, where the same boundary meets the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Stephen, Chorlton-upon-Medlock, from the new parish of Saint Mark, Gorton aforesaid."

And whereas a draft of the said scheme has in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore firstly mentioned Act been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the respective new parishes out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to the said scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS the Commissioners appointed for the purposes of the Act nineteenth and twentieth Victoria, chapter eighty-eight, intitled "An Act to make further provision for the good government and extension of the University of Cambridge, of the Colleges therein, and of the College of King Henry the Sixth, at Eton," on the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, in execution of the powers given to them by the said Act, made certain statutes for the future government and regulation of the University of Cambridge, repealing and in substitution for the then existing royal statutes of the said University, except in so far as any of such existing statutes are retained in force by the provisions of the said new statutes, and such new statutes were, on the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, duly approved by Her Majesty in Council: And whereas by the said Act, nineteenth and twentieth Victoria, chapter eighty-eight, it is, amongst other things, provided that every statute made in pursuance of the pro-

visions of the said Act by the University, or by any College, or by the Commissioners therein mentioned, should be subject to repeal, amendment, and alteration from time to time by the University or College, as the case might be, with the approval of Her Majesty in Council: And whereas the said University has thought it expedient to alter and amend the said statutes so made by the said Commissioners, and has for that purpose framed and made a statute (a copy whereof is hereto annexed), and the said University has by petition humbly prayed Her Majesty in Council that She would be graciously pleased to approve the amendment and alteration of the said statutes so made by the said Commissioners, by means of the said statute so framed and made by the said University: And whereas Her Majesty was graciously pleased to refer the said petition to a Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, for their report thereon, and such Committee, on the eighth day of May, reported to Her Majesty that Her Majesty might, if She so pleased, properly approve the said amendment and alteration, by means of the aforesaid statute so made by the said University. Now, therefore, Her Majesty, having taken the said alteration and amendment by the said statute into consideration, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to declare, and doth hereby declare, Her approval of the same.

Statute referred to in the foregoing Order in Council.

"1. Notwithstanding anything expressed or contained in the statutes of the University framed and sanctioned in accordance with the provisions of the Act of Parliament, 19 and 20 Vict., c. 88, it shall be lawful for the University to admit as Students to matriculate and to confer degrees on persons who may not be members of any College or Hall or of any Hostel.

"2. The functions assigned to the Head or Prælector of a College, or to the Principal of a Hostel in cap. I, sec. 3, and cap. III, sec. 1, of the said statutes so framed and sanctioned as aforesaid shall be exercised in respect of such Students by a Member or Members of the Senate who shall be specially appointed from time to time for that purpose, but the said statutes shall in all other respects be deemed to apply and extend to such Students as well as others.

"3. In addition to the provisions of the said statutes the University shall have power from time to time to frame and enforce such Rules as may be deemed expedient for the admission, government, discipline, and instruction of such Students, and for the payments to be made by them.

"4. The University shall have power to make special provision for the temporary or permanent removal from the University of any such Student if at any time such removal shall appear necessary or expedient, anything contained in the said statutes notwithstanding.

"5. The University shall have power from time to time to appoint a Board or Syndicate, to consist of such persons as may be determined by Grace of the Senate for the purpose of exercising and carrying into effect the powers and provisions of this statute, or any of them, subject to such Rules and Regulations as the University may from time to time prescribe, and all the acts of the Board for such purposes shall be deemed to be acts of the University.

And whereas the Local Board of Health for the district of Epsom, in the county of Surrey, established under the Public Health Act, have, under the provisions of the said recited Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the twentieth and twenty-first years of Her Majesty's reign, presented a petition to Her Majesty in Council, stating, amongst other things, that the said district of Epsom is co-extensive with the district for which it is proposed to provide a burial-ground, and that no Burial Board has been appointed for such district, and that an Order in Council has been made for closing the burial-ground therein mentioned within the said district, subject to the exception or qualification therein set forth, and praying that the said Local Board of Health may be the Burial Board for the said district of Epsom:

And whereas notice of such petition, and of the time when Her Majesty was pleased to order the same to be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, has been duly published as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Local Board of Health for the said district of Epsom, in the county of Surrey, shall be a Burial Board for the

district of such Local Board, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the twentieth and twenty-first years of Her Majesty's reign.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England, beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," it is enacted that, in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of one of such Secretaries of State, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial ground or places of burial should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require), that after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time, as circumstances may require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered; provided also, that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas the Right Honourable Henry Austin Bruce, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued in them, with the modifications hereinafter specified:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by Her Order in Council of the seventeenth day of March last, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of

Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the thirtieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no new burial-ground shall be opened in the undermentioned parishes, without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials in the said parishes shall be discontinued (except as is herein otherwise directed), as follows : viz. —

MORETON IN THE MARSH.—Forthwith wholly in the church, and in the churchyard, except in now existing vaults and walled graves which can be used without baling out water, and in which each coffin shall be separately enclosed by stone or brickwork properly cemented.

WESTBURY-UPON-TRYM.—Forthwith wholly in the Parish Church.
