REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to

be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at one o'clock.

THE following Address of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, having been transmitted by John Earl of Stair, K.T., Her Majesty's Commissioner, to the Right Honourable Henry Austin Bruce, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has been by him presented to the Queen, which Address Her Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously:—

May it please your Majesty,

WE, your Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland, convened in this General Assembly, have received with the liveliest gratitude your Majesty's most gracious letter. The expression of the affectionate regard in which your Majesty holds the Presbyterian Church by law established among the people of Scotland, cannot be otherwise than in the highest degree gratifying to us, and we rest with the utmost confidence in your Majesty's repeated assurances to former Assemblies that your Majesty will uphold the Church in the full

enjoyment of all its just rights and privileges. We earnestly trust that, under the guidance and blessing of our great King and Head, the proceedings on which we are about to enter shall be conducted in a spirit of prudence and charity, and so as in no respect to forfeit the confidence which your Majesty has kindly been pleased to repose in our loyalty and attachment, and it is our fervent supplication at the Throne of Grace that in all our deliberations we may be so directed as to be instrumental in furthering the interests of true religion, the well-being and efficiency of the Church of Scotland, and the highest good of the whole community.

Your Majesty's Royal Warrant for two thousand pounds, to be applied in promoting the religious instruction of the Highlands and Islands, has been most gratefully received, and it shall be our anxious endeavour to carry out thereby the beneficent object for which it has been granted.

We hail with grateful satisfaction the appointment of the Right Honourable the Earl of Stair, Knight of the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle, as your Majesty's High Commissioner and Representative in this Assembly, a nobleman possessing many hereditary and personal claims on our esteem, and who, as an Elder in our National Church, and a friend of her interests and just rights, commands our very special regard.

That the Supreme Governor among the Nations, the God and Father of Our Lord Jesus Christ, may vouchsafe to your Majesty the choicest gifts of His providence, and the inestimable riches of His grace; that He may abundantly bless their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales and all the several Members of the Royal Family; that your Majesty may be blessed in your children and your children's children; and that, after a long and prosperous reign, the Almighty may confer upon your Majesty a Crown of unfading glory is the very earnest prayer of,

May it please your Majesty, your Majesty's most faithful, most loyal, and obedient subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland met in General Assembly.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Guatemala, enclosing a Decree issued by the Government of that Republic, and bearing date 27th March last, which fixes the value of foreign gold and silver coins within that country.

The following are the Articles of the Decree:—

ART. I. That the gold and silver coins included in the following Tariff shall be received at the Treasury and Public Offices, at the prices and value expressed in the same Tariff.
