REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at one o'clock.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of a Notice, which has been issued by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs in the Colony of Victoria, prohibiting the importation into that Colony of the following goods, and warning Importers and others that any evasion of the law renders the goods liable to forfeiture:—

Goods absolutely Prohibited to be Imported.

Books, wherein the copyright shall be first subsisting, first composed or written, or printed in the United Kingdom or in Victoria, and printed or reprinted in any other part of the world, as to which the proprietor of such copyright, or his agent, shall have given to the Commissioner a notice in writing that such copyright subsists, such notice also stating when such copyright will expire.

Coin, viz.—False money or counterfeit sterling.
 Coin of the realm, or of any British possession, or any money purporting to be such, not being of the established standard in weight or fineness.

Extracts, essences, or other concentrations of coffee, chicory, tea, malt, hops, or tobacco, except essences, or preparations of tobacco, to be employed for sheepwashing purposes, only upon which last-mentioned essences, or preparations, duty shall be paid, as on shipwash tobacco, according to a standard, to be fixed by the Governor in Council.

Blasphemous, indecent, or obscene prints, paintings, books, cards, lithographic, or other engravings, or other blasphemous, indecent, or obscene articles.

Infected cattle, sheep, or other animals, and hides, skins, horns, hoofs, or any other part of cattle, or other animals which the Governor in Council may prohibit; in order to prevent any infectious or contagious distemper or disease.

Spirits (not being perfumed or medicinal spirits) unless in ships of fifty tons burden at least, and in casks or other vessels capable of containing liquids, each of such casks or other vessels being of the size or content of fourteen gallons at the least, and duly reported, or in glass bottles, or stone bottles, not exceeding the size of three pint bottles, and being really part of the cargo of the importing ship, and duly reported.

Snuff or tobacco, unless in ships of fifty tons burden at least, and in whole and complete packages, each containing not less than sixty pounds nett weight, and not containing any other goods, and unless into such ports as are or may be approved by the Governor in Council for the importation and warehousing of tobacco.

Cigars, unless in ships of fifty tons burden at least, and in packages containing not less than sixty pounds nett weight, or not less than ten thousand in number each, and not containing any other goods, and unless into such ports as are or may be approved as last aforesaid.

Opium, unless in ships of fifty tons burden at least, and in whole and complete packages, each containing not less than forty-five pounds nett weight, and not containing any other goods, and unless into such ports as are or may be approved of by the Governor in Council, for the importation and warehousing of opium.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from the Acting Consul-General, at Caracas, inclosing copy and translation of a Decree of the National Congress of Venezuela, bearing date 29th April last, which imposes an additional duty of 20 per cent. upon merchandise imported into that Republic, to meet the extraordinary expenses incurred on account of the Revolution.

The following are the Articles of this Decree which have reference to British Trade and Shipping:—

ART. 1. For the term of twenty months an extraordinary contribution of 20 per cent. on the import duties collected at all the Custom-houses of the Republic, is hereby established.

ART. 2. This contribution shall be paid cash down at all the Custom-houses on all merchandise, the Consular certificates of which shall have been issued at a later date than that of the present decree.

ART. 3. The National Executive is hereby authorized, for the public benefit, to free from the

additional impost such articles of food as, in their judgment, they shall consider ought to be exempted.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, an extract from the "Journal Officiel," containing a Decree of the French Government relative to the suppression of Differential Dues in French Guiana.

The following are the Articles of this Decree which bears date 19th May last :—

ART. 1. The differential duties established by Art. 2 of the Decree of the 24th December, 1864, upon merchandize imported into French Guiana by foreign vessels, are hereby suppressed.

ART. 2. The Minister of Marine and of the Colonies is charged with the execution of the present Decree, which shall be inserted in the *Bulletin des Lois* and in the *Bulletin Officiel de la Marine*.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires and Consul-General at Lima, inclosing an extract from the "El Nacional," of the 26th April last, with reference to a request that had been preferred by the Guano Consignees in Great Britain, with reference to some of the clauses of the Contract relative to the last loan which had been made by the Peruvian Government.

The following is the translation of the Extract in question :—

"The Consignees of Guano in Great Britain solicited the Government to explain the meaning of some of the clauses of the Contract relating to the last loan which they had made, and in conformity with this request it has been declared that the Standard Exchange is forty-four and a half-pence, and that when the term of the Consignation (Agreement) has expired the Government shall be able to choose between paying in money the necessary sum for the service of the Anglo-Prussian debt, or leaving to the Consignees the exclusive sale of the Guano, for the purpose of applying its product towards that object."

TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her Majesty, chapter 96, for the regulation of the duties of postage, certain scales of weight and rates of postage were fixed and made chargeable and payable upon or in respect of letters, newspapers, Parliamentary proceedings, and printed papers transmitted and forwarded by the post, and various regulations were made for facilitating the transmission of such letters and papers by the post, and by the same Act powers were given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury from time to time, by Warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of postage therein mentioned.

And whereas further powers were given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, by another Act of Parliament passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her Majesty, chapter 85, for giving further facilities for the transmission of letters by post, and for the regulating the duties of postage thereon, and for other purposes relating to the Post Office.

And whereas the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers vested in them, in and by the said before-mentioned Acts, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, have from time to time, by divers Warrants under their hands, authorized and directed that packets consisting of printed papers, or of books, publications, or works of literature or art, or of patterns or samples of merchandize, might be transmitted by the post between the United Kingdom and Her Majesty's colonies and possessions and certain foreign countries at certain rates of postage, and under and subject to certain conditions, regulations, and restrictions in and by the said several Warrants respectively specified and mentioned.

And whereas it is expedient to reduce the postage now chargeable on certain of the several packets transmitted as hereinbefore respectively mentioned.

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers reserved to us in and by the hereinbefore recited Acts of Parliament, and each of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners (by the authority of the statute in that case made and provided) order, direct, and declare as follows; that is to say:—

1. That all packets consisting of printed papers or of books, publications, or works of literature or art, whether British, colonial, or foreign, or of printed votes and proceedings of the Imperial Parliament, or the Colonial Legislatures, or of patterns or samples of merchandize not exceeding two

ounces in weight, posted in the United Kingdom addressed to any of the several colonies, countries and places mentioned and specified in the first schedule hereunder written, and respectively transmitted by the post from the United Kingdom to any of the several colonies, countries, and places mentioned and specified in the first schedule hereunder written, by the respective routes, and in the manner in the said first schedule also mentioned under the authority of any Warrant or Warrants of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury now in force relating thereto, shall, in lieu of being charged with the respective rates of postage payable thereon, under such respective Warrant or Warrants for such transmission thereof respectively as hereinbefore mentioned, be charged with the rates of postage following; that is to say:—

On every such packet, if not exceeding one ounce in weight, there shall be charged and taken an uniform rate of postage of one penny;

And on every such packet, if exceeding one ounce and not exceeding two ounces in weight, there shall be charged and taken an uniform rate of postage of two pence.

2. That all packets consisting of printed papers, or of books, publications, or works of literature or art, whether British, colonial, or foreign, or of printed votes and proceedings of the Imperial Parliament or the Colonial Legislatures, or of patterns or samples of merchandize, not exceeding two ounces in weight, posted in the United Kingdom, addressed to any of the several colonies, countries, and places mentioned and specified in the second schedule hereunder written, and respectively transmitted by the post from the United Kingdom to any of the several colonies, countries, and places mentioned and specified in the second schedule hereunder written by the respective routes, and in the manner in the said second schedule also mentioned, under the authority of any Warrant or Warrants of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury now in force relating thereto, shall, in lieu of being charged with the respective rates of postage, payable thereon under such respective Warrant or Warrants for such transmission thereof respectively as hereinbefore in this clause mentioned, be charged with the rates of postage following; that is to say:—

On every such packet, if not exceeding one ounce in weight, there shall be charged and taken an uniform rate of postage of two pence;

And on every such packet, if exceeding one ounce and not exceeding two ounces in weight, there shall be charged and taken an uniform rate of postage of fourpence.

3. All such packets as are mentioned in this Warrant shall remain subject in every respect (save as is in this Warrant mentioned) to the several orders, regulations, conditions, and restrictions now in force and applicable thereto, and the several Warrants hereinbefore referred to shall (save in so far as the same are respectively altered or affected by this present Warrant) continue in full force and effect.

4. The Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury may, by Warrant under their hands, duly made at any time hereafter, alter, repeal, revoke, or modify the rates of postage hereby fixed or altered, or the regulations hereby made, and may make and establish any new or other rates or regulations in lieu thereof.

5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.
