THE Queen has been pleased to grant unto Benjamin Blaydes Haworth, of Derwent Bank, in the parish of Malton, in the North Riding of the county of York, Esquire, in the Commission of the Peace and a Deputy Lieutenant for the East Riding of the said county, and Lieutenant-Colonel Commandant of the 1st Administrative Brigade of the East Riding of Yorkshire Artillery Volunteers, Her Royal licence and authority that he and his issue may, in compliance with a clause contained in the last will and testament of his late father Benjamin Haworth, of Hull Bank House, in the parish of Cottingham, and of Rowleston Hall, in the parish of Mappleton, both in the East Riding of the county of York, Esquire, deceased, assume and use the surname of Booth, in addition to and after that Haworth, and that he and they may assume and use the arms of Booth quartered in the first quarter with those of Haworth; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's said College of Arms.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a despatch from Lieutenant-Colonel Stokes, R.E., British Commissioner in the Danube, forwarding Regulations for the Registration of vessels employed as Lighters in the Lower Danube, a copy of which is subjoined.

THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION OF THE DANUBE.

(Translation.)

REGULATION for the Registration of vessels employed as Lighters on the Lower Danube.

The European Commission of the Danube, with a view to facilitate for commerce, and notably for maritime insurers, the means of knowing the

state of sea-worthiness of vessels employed as lighters on the Lower Danube, enacts the following provisions:—

ARTICLE 1.

The captains, masters, proprietors, or owners of all sailing or steam vessels, barges, or other transports, destined to serve as lighters on the Lower Danube, will be permitted to have their vessels registered in a book kept by the European Commission of the Danube for this purpose, it being incumbent on them to comply with the conditions laid down by the present regulation.

This registration will be compulsory for lighters licensed conformably with Article 83 of the Regulations of Navigation and Police applicable to the Lower Danube, dated 2nd November, 1865.

ARTICLE 2.

The demand for registration must be made in writing, and will contain choice of domicile for the demander, at one of the ports of the Lower Danube, situated between Ibraila and the Mouth, the port of Ibraila included.

Every vessel for which registration shall have been demanded will be visited, within a fortnight of the date of demand, by a commission of surveyors, composed of technical men, in number of three at least and five at most, appointed for this purpose by the European Commission of the Danube.

These surveyors will perform their office at Galatz, at Ibraila, or at Sulina, according to circumstances.

ARTICLE 3.

The examination by surveyors will have notably for object to test:—

- The staunchness of the vessel;
- The nature, the quality, and condition of materials employed in its construction;
- The date of its building;
- The probable length of time during which the vessel may be considered as a first-class vessel;
- The draft of water of the vessel when fully laden;
- The quantity of merchandize, expressed in quarters of wheat, which it can carry without danger.

The result of each survey will be written down in a minute of proceedings, and signed by all the

surveyors who shall have taken part in such survey. This minute will be deposited in the archives of the European Commission.

ARTICLE 4.

The register in which the vessels surveyed will be inscribed shall be kept at the head office of the European Commission at Galatz.

This register will contain:—

The names of all vessels, or their numbers, if they should have no name;

Their nationality;

The names of their owners;

The date of their survey;

Their date of building, and that of their last having undergone thorough repair;

The indication of their materials of construction (wood or iron);

That of their rigging, and, for steam-vessels, the power of their engines;

The indication of their draft of water when fully laden;

And that of the class in which every vessel shall have been ranged by the report of the surveyors, with indication, in the case of first class vessels, of the probable time during which they are likely to continue in this classification.

Mention will also be made in this register, opposite the name of every vessel which shall have been inscribed, of every collision, stranding, or other accident which may have happened to it after its registration, and which may have been of a nature to affect its staunchness.

ARTICLE 5.

Vessels which, according to the reports of the Commission of Survey, shall be in an unfit state to navigate, cannot be inscribed upon the register spoken of in the preceding article, and they will be officially struck out, if, subsequently to inscription, they should fall into this state.

ARTICLE 6.

Every vessel registered will receive a certificate containing the particulars inscribed in the register. This certificate will be signed by the Secretary-General of the European Commission of the Danube, and will bear the seal of the said Commission.

It must be presented every year for the Visa of the Secretary-General, in default of which it will cease of right to be valid.

ARTICLE 7.

Vessels admitted to registration and provided with the certificate spoken of in the preceding Article, will have the right to bear upon a visible point of their hull the mark A 1, for vessels of the first class, and A 2, for vessels of the second class.

ARTICLE 8.

The captains, masters, proprietors, or owners of all vessels which, after having been admitted to registration, shall suffer damages of any kind, will be bound to make a circumstantial declaration of the same without delay to the European Commission, depositing the certificate of registration, and to submit, if it is judged necessary, to a fresh survey having for object to decide if the vessels which have suffered damage are still in a fit state to navigate.

ARTICLE 9.

As regards vessels of the first class, in any case a fresh survey must be held before the ex-

piration of the term for which such vessels shall have been admitted into this class according to the surveyor's reports. In default of this renewed survey, the said vessels will of right pass into the second class immediately after the expiration of the term for which they were classed.

ARTICLE 10.

If a vessel inscribed upon the Register of Lighters should change its flag, its owner, name or number, the change must be notified in writing within the delay of eight days to the European Commission, in order that mention of the change may be made upon the register and upon the vessel's certificate.

ARTICLE 11.

An extract, certified as true copy of the register kept conformably with Article 4 of the present Regulation, may be communicated every three months, to maritime insurers who may demand the same in writing.

ARTICLE 12.

Every vessel which shall be found navigating on the Lower Danube, below Isaktcha, bearing one or the other of the marks determined by Article 7 of the present Regulation, without having been inscribed upon the Register of Lighters conformably with Article 4, shall be liable to a penalty of one hundred francs at least and of three hundred francs at most.

The same penalty shall be applicable to a vessel navigating below Isaktcha, which shall continue to bear one or other of the said marks after having been struck out of the register, or which shall bear the mark A 1, without having been admitted by the surveyors into the category of vessels of the first class.

ARTICLE 13.

Every vessel navigating below Isaktcha, which, after having suffered damage of any kind, shall continue to bear one or other of the marks determined by Article 7 hereinabove, without the declaration prescribed by Article 8 having been made, or before the fresh survey, judged necessary in consequence of such damage, shall have been held, shall be liable to a penalty of twenty-five francs at least, or of one hundred francs at most.

The same penalty shall be applicable to a vessel which shall continue to bear the mark A 1, without fresh survey, after the expiration of the delay for which it shall have been admitted into the first class, according to the surveyor's report.

ARTICLE 14.

Every vessel bearing one or other of the marks determined by Article 7 hereinabove, which shall have changed its flag, its owner, name, or number, and which shall be found navigating upon the Lower Danube, below Isaktcha, without the declaration prescribed by Article 10 hereinabove having been made within the delay fixed, shall be liable to a penalty of twenty-five francs at least, and of fifty francs at most.

ARTICLE 15.

Shall be excluded from the register kept in conformity with Article 4 of the present regulation, every vessel in the case of which there shall have been collusion, or attempt at collusion between the surveyors charged with the examination prescribed by Article 3 and the parties interested, with the view to procure the registration of a vessel notwithstanding its state of non-sea-

worthiness, or to cause it to be fraudulently admitted into or continued in the category of vessels of the first class.

ARTICLE 16.

The Captain of the Port of Sulina, the Inspector-General of the Navigation of the Lower Danube, or the Agents placed under their orders, are charged with the execution of the present Regulation, in all that concerns the application of the penalties prescribed by Articles 12, 13, and 14, for offences committed or proved within the limits of the jurisdiction of each of these two authorities.

ARTICLE 17.

The application of the penalties imposed by the present regulation will be regulated, in general, and notably in all that concerns repetitions of offences and appeals, by the provisions of Articles 104, 106, 108, and 110 of the Regulations of Navigation and Police, applicable to the Lower Danube, dated 2nd of November, 1865.

ARTICLE 18.

Every vessel inscribed in the register kept in conformity with Article 4 hereinabove, will pay a tax of thirty francs, from which will be deducted a sum of three francs to cover the expenses of printing and publication. The residue will be divided among the surveyors charged to examine the vessel, according to the resolutions which the European Commission shall take in this respect.

The amount of this tax will be deposited in the cash office of the Commission at Galatz, together with the demand of registration prescribed by Article 2 hereinabove.

No tax whatever will be due, when in consequence of an accidental damage, and in conformity with Article 8 hereinabove, a fresh survey of a registered vessel shall be proceeded with.

ARTICLE 19.

The present Regulation shall enter into force on the 1st of August, 1869.—Done at Galatz the 20th of April, 1869.

The Islands of St. Thomas, Martinique, and Guadalupe; Carpeachy, in Yucatan; Belize, in Honduras; Vera Cruz, Alvarado, Tampico, Matamoros, and Tuspan, in Mexico; San Juan, in Nicaragua; Chagres, Aspinwall, and Porto Bello, in Central America; Maracaibo, in Venezuela; Laguayra, Island of Trinidad, Rio de Janeiro, Para, and Cayenne, in South America; and Nassau, New Providence.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Manila, inclosing copies of two Decrees of the Spanish Provisional Government, the one reforming the Customs Duties in the Philippines, the other relating to the introduction and repairing of vessels in those islands.

The following are the Articles of these Decrees :—

(Translation.)

ART. I. The Reform of the Customs' Tariffs of the Philippines, which was effected and brought into operation by the suppressed General Finance Superintendency, in compliance with the Royal Order of 21st November, 1860, is approved, with the modification that, for all operations of revenue, the metrico-decimal system shall be followed, and woollen fabrics shall be classified by weight like the rest, instead of the dues being graduated by lineal measure of the pieces.

ART. II. The modifications resolved on by the said Superintendency in some portions of the Tariff, in this form, are approved of.

Lot 35. Duty on Geneva spirits, wormwood, or others, including the outside case; the duty is retained as in the tariff, but the outside cases shall be taxed separately.

The Intendency, taking the opinion of the Administration of the Department, will grant a proportionate reduction in the duty on this article, which, as such reform is contrary to the usual practice of Custom-houses, will be submitted to the Supreme Government without, however, preventing it from being at once put in force *ad interim*.

Lot 268. Impure carbonate of soda, reducing the valuation of 16, assigned by the tariff, to 8.

Lot 1035. Smooth corduroys and velvets, worked or stamped, are taxed at the rate of 260 escudos per quintal, instead of 520, as fixed in the said lot.

Lot 298. Barley, stripped of the husk, pearled or peeled: the valuation is reduced to 24 escudos per quintal, instead of 1½ dollars per lb., as fixed in the tariff.

Lot 1004. Cotton, crimson, cochineal colour for weaving.

Lot 1005. Cotton, white, raw, or of other colours, for weaving.

Lot 1006. Cotton, yellow, rose colour, or green, for weaving.

The merging of these three lots into 1005 being stated in the following form.

Spun cotton for weaving, raw, white, or coloured, per quintal, 120 escudos; dues 7 or 14 per cent., according to the flag when proceeding from abroad, or 3 or 8 per cent. respectively if the export be national (Spanish).

Tariff of Mixed Woven Stuffs.

The addition to this tariff of the cloths, fine lastings, cashmeres, and serges, of wool and cotton by halves in warp and woof, at the valuation of 75 cents of a dollar per square yard; valuation in future will be modified by unity of weight, according to Article 1 of this decree.

The explanation referring to the conditions of light stuffs, in the sense that any cloth which between every two threads admits another of the same thickness, shall be considered as light stuff not pressed close.

And the declaration of freedom from export duty of the coal from the mines of Ceba.

ART III. The Intendency will dedicate itself in preference to the new reform of the tariff, reducing by 50 per cent. all the charges mentioned therein above 3 to 8 per cent., the average scale of duty; and by 50 per cent., the differential duty on foreign flags, which shall be sustained for the space of two years, to be counted from the time this decree is endorsed by the "cumplase," both charges being suppressed at the end of that term.

ART. IV. That in the new tariff the export dues on all articles charged therewith be suppressed; the exporters, nevertheless, being still compelled to declare the goods which they export, their quality and quantity, and it being the duty of the Customs' administrations to supervise and make note thereof, in order to frame the commercial statistics of the Archipelago.

ART. V. The tax of 2 per cent. upon European goods imported in Spanish ships, proceeding from the ports of Asia and Oceania, and that of 1 per cent. on those proceeding from Singapore, are suppressed likewise.

ART. VI. The Intendency, on consulting with the Councils of Tariffs and Finance, will merge into one sole tax, to be called "discharge due," and which shall be paid according to the tonnage (ton of 1000 kilogrammes) of the goods discharged, all the duties known at present by the name of light, cleansing, anchorage, shipment, and discharge, and others of the kind; managing so

that the amount of the new tax may represent the due equivalent of those suppressed; different scales being drawn up for ships navigating the high seas, for coasters, and among them for ships measuring less than twenty tons. When a vessel, from distress or other cause, is forced to transfer its cargo to another, or to discharge for the purpose of re-shipping it after, it will not pay the duty which is only to be exacted on goods discharged for introduction into the Islands.

ART. VII. The discharge due will be collected by the Custom-house, the amounts, in common with all other general taxes, being paid into the public Treasury.

ART. VIII. The Customs' administration of Manila will at once take charge, with the character of central administration of that branch, of the dispatch of the business confided for that purpose, to that of taxes; the chief of the latter department retaining, nevertheless, the title of Inspector of the Revenue, and with the duty of conducting the proceedings of invalidity or complaint against the decisions of the former.

ART. I. The introduction of ships of all classes into the Philippine Isles, of wood as well as of iron hulls, is permitted on their satisfying the following duties:—

Those of wood, up to the burden of	Escudos.
100 tons, of a cubic metre, will	
pay per metrical ton	13
From 101 to 300 tons, Idem	10
From 301 tons, upwards, Idem	5
Those with hull of iron whatever	
their burden	5

ART. II. When foreign vessels have been repaired in the Archipelago, and put in a perfectly navigable state, and their owners desire to nationalise them, they will pay only four escudos per ton, if the repairs cost more than three times the value of the ship's purchase-money, and eight escudos if it should be more than double and should not amount to treble.

ART. III. The tons of a cubic metre treated of in the preceding Articles, shall be what the ships measure in bulk, without any deduction of space or compartment below decks. But the duties on all instruments, machinery, tools, and utensils, referred to in Notes 20 and 21 of the Customs' Tariff in force in the Peninsula, are included in the dues thus fixed per ton.

ART. IV. Every Spanish ship may be freely careened and surveyed in any foreign place.

ART. V. Owners of Spanish ships may freely sell or hypothecate them to countrymen or foreigners, to which end Article 592 of the Commercial Code is abrogated.

ART. VI. Ships may be manned by the number of men agreed upon by the owner and captain, in accordance with Article 24, tit. 10, of the existing Registry Laws, and with the 1° and 4° of the Royal Decree of the 27th November, 1867. When the captain or owners cannot find a sufficient number of Spanish seamen in a foreign port, the crew may be completed with foreigners, with the consent of the Consul or of the Naval Authorities.

ART. VII. Materials of all kinds imported for the construction, careening, or repair of iron or wooden ships, of whatever tonnage; finished

material necessary for their armament, and material introduced for the construction and repair of marine steam-boilers, whatever be the system or forces of the said apparatus, will pay the dues fixed in the Customs' Tariff. But the dues will be returned to the constructors and manufacturers upon their petition, when the introduction and employment of the said materials and effects in the aforesaid constructions or repairs of ships, machines, or boilers shall have been proved.

ART. VIII. For the reimbursement of the dues the weight or volume of the material or effects as noted in the tariff, will be compared with the weight or volume shewn by the made or completed work, so that the proportion of dues corresponding to waste or dismantled parts, which result from the construction or transformation thereof on their application to the works aforesaid, goes to the benefit of the revenue.

ART. IX. Articles 387, 390, and 391 of the Instructions of the Philippine Customs are abrogated.
