THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from the Acting British Consul-General at Caracas, reporting that by a Circular of the 8th June last, the Venezuelan Government have declared the port of Maracaibo closed to the importation of foreign merchandize, but that vessels which had left their port of lading before receiving information of this determination would be permitted to enter.

A period of ten days has, in addition, been granted to vessels loading or under charter for Maracaibo to complete their cargoes, it being understood that material of war is not to form any part of such cargoes.

**LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.**

**NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ACT BY THE TOWNSHIP OF PENISTONE, IN THE COUNTY OF YORK.**

WHEREAS notice in writing was duly given to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that the Local Government Act, 1858, had been adopted by the township of Penistone, in the county of York; now, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do, hereby, under the provisions of the said Act, issue the following notice and Order:—

That the Local Government Act, 1858, was duly adopted by the township of Penistone, in the county of York aforesaid; and I do also order, that though such township is a place with a population of less than 3,000, by the last census, it has appeared to me that by reason of the special circumstances of the case, it is expedient that the said township should be allowed to adopt the said Act. I do hereby approve of such adoption; and do further order, that such Act shall, from and after the 18th day of July, 1869, have full force of law within the said township of Penistone, and that nine members constitute the Local Board.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent for the time being of the vicarage
