THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that The Lords authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to extend the power of Recorders to appoint Deputies in certain cases.

An Act to repeal certain enactments relating to newspapers, pamphlets, and other publications, and to printers, typefounders, and reading-rooms.

An Act to amend the Act of the twenty-fifth and twenty-sixth years of Victoria, chapter eightythree, section nine, by extending the age at which orphan and deserted children may be kept out at nurse.

An Act to extend to burial-grounds the provisions of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter twenty-eight, intituled "An Act to render more simple and effectual the titles by which congregations and societies for purposes of religious worship or education in England and Ireland hold property for such purposes."

An Act to render valid certain title deeds for Inam lands.

An Act to amend the law for licensing beerhouses, and to make certain alterations with respect to the sale by retail of beer, cider, and wine.

An Act to afford facilities for the establishment and maintenance of public parks in Ireland.

An Act to legalize certain marriages celebrated at Park Gate Chapel, and to change the name of the district chapelry annexed to the chapel of Cowgill.
