THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Decree signed by the President of the Republic of Salvador on the 1st of June last, abolishing the export duty on gold and silver coin.

The following is a translation of the sole Article of the Decree :—

Articles LX. and LXI. of Law I., Book VIII., "Chap. V of R.P.," as far as they relate to the duty imposed upon the exporting of gold and silver coin are abrogated, it being thus declared free from all impost, while the above-mentioned Articles wherein they relate to jewellery and gold or silver bullion remain in force.

SANITARY ACT, 1866.

ORDER SETTLING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE SPECIAL DRAINAGE DISTRICT OF WIMBORNE MINSTER, IN THE COUNTY OF DORSET.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Sanitary Act, 1866, a special drainage district, consisting of a portion of the parish of Wimborne Minster, in the county of Dorset, has been formed by the vestry of the said parish of Wimborne Minster.

And whereas under the said Act an appeal has been duly made to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and signed by ratepayers resident within the said parish, praying me to annul the formation of the said special drainage district, or to modify the boundaries thereof, as to me might seem fit.

And whereas, after inquiry into the subject matter of the aforesaid appeal, held by Robert Morgan, Esq., the Inspector appointed by me for the purpose, and report thereon made by him, and after full consideration of the said appeal and report, I do hereby, under the powers conferred on me by the Sanitary Act, 1866, direct that from and after the date of this present Order, the special drainage district of Wimborne Minster shall comprise the area included within the boundary line on the plan accompanying the Inspector's report, and described as follows:—

The boundaries commence at the point A on the plan, in the centre of the River Stour at Canford Bridge, on the London and South-Western Railway, thence proceeds westward along the centre of the said river to B, opposite to the confluence of the rivers Stour and Allen, thence westward along the north side of the said River Allen to C, thence crossing the said River Allen, and westward along the south side of fields numbered 344, 280, 331, 328, and 327, to D in the centre of the River Stour near to Jullian's Bridge, thence northward and westward along the centre of the said River Stour to E, thence northward along the west side of field numbered 2170 to F, on the south side of the road from Wimborne to Pamphill, thence along the south side of the said road to G, on the Blandford turnpike-road, thence crossing the said road and eastward along the north side of the Cemetery-road and Stone-lane to H, thence along the west and north sides of the field numbered 111 to I, on the west side of the River Allen; thence crossing the said river and eastward along the south side of fields numbered 1702, 1701, and 1700 to J, on the road from Wimborne to Cranborne; thence south-eastward along the north side of fields numbered 526, 518, and 519 to K; thence southward along the east side of fields numbered 519 and 513 to L; thence eastward along the north side of fields numbered 499, 500, and 501 to M; thence southward along the east side of fields numbered 501 and 504, to the Ringwood-road from Wimborne to Leigh; thence crossing the said road and along the east and north sides of field numbered 562 to N, on the London and South-Western Railway; thence southward along the east side of the said railway to O; thence along the north and east sides of field numbered 561 to P, in the centre of the River Stour; thence westward along the centre of the said river to the starting point at A, thus completing the boundaries.
