

(LIVERPOOL.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 10th day of August, 1869.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the the part of the Port of Liverpool, in the county of Lancaster, within which foreign cattle may be landed for slaughter, as follows:—

All that space in the borough of Liverpool, bounded on the western side by the River Mersey, and on all other sides by a line commencing on the eastern bank of the said river at the south-western extremity of the northern pier head of the Sandon Basin, and running eastward along the northern boundary of the water of the Sandon Basin and of the Sandon Dock to the north-eastern corner of the Sandon Dock, thence along a straight fence due east to the western fence of the Regent-road, thence northward along the last-mentioned fence to the line of the northern side of Sandhills-lane, thence eastward along the northern side of Sandhills-lane to the south-eastern side of the Dock Branch of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway, thence in a south-westerly direction, along the south-eastern boundary of the said branch railway, to the western side of Great Howard-street, thence westward along the southern side of the branch railway, across Fulton-street, to the eastern side of the High Level Railway, near the Wellington Dock, thence in a south-westerly direction, straight across the High Level Railway, to the south-eastern corner of the sheds on the south side of the Wellington Dock, thence westward in a straight line along the southern side of the said sheds, and by a continuation of the same straight line to the River Mersey, all which space is coloured green on the plan of part of Liverpool, deposited for the purposes of an Order of Council of the twenty-third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough of Liverpool.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that *The Lords authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the*

Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to apply a sum out of the Consolidated Fund and the Surplus of Ways and Means to the service of the year ending the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and to appropriate the supplies granted in this session of Parliament.

An Act to amend the New Parishes Acts and Church Building Acts.

An Act to enable military offenders to be confined in Millbank Prison.

An Act to amend the Contagious Diseases Act, 1866.

An Act to amend in certain respects the Act for the better government of India.

An Act to define the powers of the Governor-General of India in Council at meetings for making laws and regulations, for certain purposes.

An Act for the more effectual prevention of crime.

An Act to amend the law relating to the warehousing of wines and spirits in customs and excise warehouses, and for other purposes relating to customs and inland revenue.

An Act for facilitating the payment of dividends on the public stocks, and for making regulations with respect thereto.

An Act for empowering the Public Works Loan Commissioners to advance a sum not exceeding two hundred and fifty thousand pounds for the improvement of the harbour of Galle, in the colony of Ceylon.

An Act to enable the Secretary of State in Council of India to raise money in the United Kingdom for the service of the Government of India.

An Act to facilitate the borrowing money in certain cases for the purpose of "The Sanitary Act, 1866," and the Acts amending the same; and for other purposes.

An Act to amend "The Sanitary Act, 1866," so far as the same relates to Ireland.

An Act to amend "The Metropolitan Commons Act, 1866."

An Act for repealing part of an Act of the first year of the reign of their Majesties King William and Queen Mary, intituled "An Act to vest in the two Universities the presentations of benefices belonging to Papists," and for securing uniformity in the law relating to the residence of spiritual persons upon their benefices, and to the penalties and forfeitures consequent on non-residence.

An Act for authorizing a guarantee of a loan to be raised by Canada for a payment in respect of the transfer of Rupert's Land.

An Act for making further provision respecting the borrowing of money by the Metropolitan Board of Works; and for other purposes connected therewith.

An Act for amending the charitable trusts Acts.

An Act for the relief of archbishops and bishops when incapacitated by infirmity.

An Act to prevent the adulteration of seeds.

An Act to prohibit for a limited period the importation, and to restrict and regulate the carriage, of nitro-glycerine.

An Act to amend the Law relating to the Abandonment of Railways and the Dissolution of Railway Companies.
