THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, containing an Imperial Decree

concerning the importation of merchandize destined for temporary admission.

The following are the Articles of this Decree which bears date 28th July last:—

ART. 1. Merchandize destined for temporary admission may be imported by sea under all flags, subject to the conditions determined by the Decrees and Ordinances put in execution by the Article 5 of the Law of the 5th July, 1836.

ART. 2. The Minister of Agriculture and Commerce and the Minister of Finance, are charged, each in that which concerns him, with the execution of the present Decree.

Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to accept the resignation of the Commission held by Captain H. J. Cowan Graham Bonar in the Fife Artillery Militia, and in consideration of his service to approve of his being granted a step of honorary rank on retirement and permitted to wear the uniform of the Regiment. Dated 4th August, 1869.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the session of Parliament holden in the third and fourth years of the reign of Her Majesty, chapter 96, for the regulation of the duties of postage, power is given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, from time to time, by Warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any

of the rates of British postage or inland postage payable by law on the transmission by the post of foreign or colonial letters or newspapers, or of any other printed papers, and to subject the same to rates of postage according to the weight thereof and a scale of weight to be contained in such Warrant, and from time to time, by Warrant as aforesaid, to alter or repeal any such altered rates, and make and establish any new or other rates in lieu thereof.

And whereas further powers are given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, by another Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the tenth and eleventh years of the reign of Her Majesty, chapter 85, for giving further facilities for the transmission of letters by post, and for the regulating the duties of postage thereon, and for other purposes relating to the Post Office.

And whereas it is expedient to reduce the rates of postage now chargeable on certain letters transmitted by the post from Cuba and Porto Rico to Spain, the Balearic and Canary Islands, in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers reserved to us in and by the said hereinbefore-recited Acts of Parliament, respectively, and each of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, by the authority of the statute in that case made and provided, order, declare, and direct as follows; that is to say:—

1. On every letter not exceeding one quarter of an ounce in weight posted in Cuba or Porto Rico, addressed to Spain or the Balearic or Canary Islands, and transmitted by the post from Cuba or Porto Rico to Spain or the Balearic or Canary Islands through the United Kingdom, the sea conveyance from Cuba or Porto Rico to the United Kingdom being by British packet boat, and the sea conveyance from the United Kingdom to Spain or the Balearic or Canary Islands being either via France or direct by British or Spanish packet boat, there shall be charged, taken, and paid an uniform rate of postage (British and foreign combined) of ten pence.

2. On every such letter so transmitted as hereinbefore-mentioned exceeding one quarter of an ounce in weight there shall be charged, taken, and paid the several further and additional and progressive rates of postage hereinafter-mentioned, that is to say:—

On every such letter exceeding one quarter of an ounce, and not exceeding one half of an ounce in weight, there shall be charged, taken, and paid two rates of postage;

And on every such letter exceeding one half of an ounce, and not exceeding three quarters of an ounce in weight, three rates of postage;

And on every such letter exceeding three quarters of an ounce, and not exceeding one ounce in weight, four rates of postage;

And for every additional quarter of an ounce in weight of any such letter above the weight of one ounce there shall be charged, taken, and paid one additional rate of postage, and every fractional part of such additional quarter of an ounce in weight shall be charged as an additional quarter of an ounce in weight, and each progressive and additional rate chargeable under this clause shall be estimated and charged at the sum which any such letter would be charged with under this Warrant if not exceeding one quarter of an ounce in weight.

3. Nothing herein contained shall be construed in anywise to annul, prejudice, or affect any of the exemptions or privileges granted by or under either of the hereinbefore recited Acts, or by or under any other Acts of Parliament relating to the Post Office, or to annul, prejudice, or affect any of the privileges to which officers, seamen, soldiers, and others employed in Her Majesty's Service, are by law entitled of sending and receiving letters by the post, subject to the regulations and restrictions made and in force for the time being in respect of the same.

4. The several rates of postage fixed by this present Warrant, on the letters transmitted by the post as herein respectively mentioned, shall be in lieu of those now chargeable thereon, under or by virtue of a certain Warrant of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, bearing date the 6th day of September, 1858, which last-mentioned rates are hereby repealed, revoked, and annulled.

5. The several terms and expressions used in this Warrant shall be construed to have the like meaning in all respects as they would have had if inserted in the said firstly hereinbefore recited Act.

6. The Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury may, by Warrant under their hands, duly made at any time hereafter, alter, repeal, or revoke any of the rates of postage hereby fixed or altered and may make and establish any new or other rates in lieu thereof, and may from time to time appoint at what time the rates which may be payable are to be paid.

7. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Saint Philip and Jacob Without, in the city and county of Bristol;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Saint Philip and Jacob Without, in the city and county of Bristol, according to the last census exceeds two thousand persons.

And whereas at a meeting of the Inhabitants of the said Parish, held at the Old Workhouse, Pennywell-road, within the said parish, pursuant to public notice in that behalf, on Monday, the 25th day of January last, it was resolved,—

“That the Poor Law Board be requested to
“issue an Order under their seal of office,
“directing that the Act passed in the 14th
“year of the reign of Her present Majesty,
“intituled ‘An Act to prevent the holding
“of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches,
“and for regulating the appointment of
“‘ Vestry Clerks,’ shall be applied to and
“put in force in this parish, as regards the
“whole of its provisions.”

And whereas the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above resolution.

Now, therefore, we, the Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say;—

ARTICLE I.—That the whole of the Act aforesaid shall forthwith be applied to, and be put in force within the said parish of Saint Philip and Jacob Without.

And at the request of the said Churchwardens and Overseers, We hereby prescribe and direct that the Vestry Clerk shall perform the following duties in addition to the duties set forth in the said Act; that is to say,—

1. To make out the Poor Rate for the said parish.
2. To make out any new valuation list or supplemental valuation list or lists that may be required.

ARTICLE II.—That the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish shall, unless the Poor Law Board otherwise direct, pay to the officer for the time being appointed to the said office of Vestry Clerk for the said parish, under the authority of the Statutes in such behalf and this Order, for the performance of the duties of such office, a salary of one hundred and fifty pounds per annum.

ARTICLE III.—That the salary of such Vestry Clerk shall be payable up to the day on which he ceases to hold such office, and no longer, and shall be paid by quarterly payments at the several quarters ending at the usual feast days in the year, namely, Michaelmas Day, Christmas Day, Lady Day, and Midsummer Day, with a proportionate sum to be paid to his executors or administrators, in case he shall die while holding such office.

ARTICLE IV.—That every person appointed to the office of Vestry Clerk in the said parish shall give the Guardians of the Poor of the Clifton Union, in the borough of the city of Bristol and county of the same city, and in the county of Gloucester, a bond, in the penal sum of two hundred and fifty pounds, in the names of himself and two sufficient sureties, conditioned for the due and faithful performance of the duties of the office; and every such officer shall give immediate notice to the said Guardians of the death, insolvency, or bankruptcy of either of such sureties, and shall, when required by the said Guardians, produce a certificate, signed by two householders, that his sureties are alive and believed by them to be solvent, and shall supply a fresh surety in the place of any such surety who may die or become bankrupt or insolvent:

Provided that the Guardians may, if they think fit, take the security of any Society or Company expressly authorized by statute to guarantee or secure the faithful discharge of the duties of any Poor Law Officer.

ARTICLE V.—That the Auditor of the District comprising the said Clifton Union shall, in the statement required by the General Order of the Poor Law Board, dated the fourteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, to be transmitted to the Poor Law Board of the securities of the officers of the said Union, include the name of the Vestry Clerk for the said parish of Saint Philip and Jacob Without for the time being, appointed under the authority aforesaid, together with the particulars in the said General Order required, and shall report thereon to the Board of Guardians of the said Union, in like manner as therein set forth with reference to the securities of other officers.

ARTICLE VI.—That a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
