Board of Trade, Whitehall, August 14, 1869.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, containing an Imperial Decree

concerning the importation of merchandize destined for temporary admission.

The following are the Articles of this Decree which bears date 28th July last:—

ART. 1. Merchandize destined for temporary admission may be imported by sea under all flags, subject to the conditions determined by the Decrees and Ordinances put in execution by the Article 5 of the Law of the 5th July, 1836.

ART. 2. The Minister of Agriculture and Commerce and the Minister of Finance, are charged, each in that which concerns him, with the execution of the present Decree.
