Revolving Light on Quiriquina Island.

THE Chilean Government has given notice, that from the 1st June, 1869, a light has been exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on

the northern point of Quiriquina Island, in Conception Bay.

The light is a *revolving* white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy ever *thirty seconds*; the duration of light being 9 seconds, and that of eclipse 21 seconds. It is elevated 213 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 15 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fourth order.

The tower, which is round, white, and 36 feet high, is attached to the north-east corner of the keeper's dwelling. The position, as given, is in lat. 36° 36' 18" S., long. 73° 6' 5" west from Greenwich.

Fixed red Light at Drago Harbour.

THE Danish Government has given notice, that on and after the 1st day of August, 1869, a *fixed red light* will be exhibited from the extremity of the north pier of Drago Harbour, and will continue to be shown throughout the year, with the following exemptions, viz.,—during the summer months, May, June, and July, and when ice renders entry to the harbour impossible.

The light will be visible from N.N.E., round by East to S.S.W., and in clear weather should be visible from a distance of two miles.

(No. 54.)—BLACK SEA—DANUBE ENTRANCES.

Lights and Buoyage.

THE following information has been received from Commander James F. Prowse, of H.M.S. "Cockatrice":—

In the Admiralty List of Lights for Mediterranean and Black Sea for 1869, the light numbered 506 does not exist. The light numbered 504 in the same list is wrongly placed on Admiralty Chart, Cape Kaliakra to Odessa, No. 2231; but its correct position will be found in Admiralty Light List, viz., on a small sandy island south of Olinka Island, in lat. 44° 51' 5" N., long. 29° 36' 52" West of Greenwich.

The common buoy which formerly marked the deepest channel on the bar of the Sulina branch of the River Danube has been replaced by a bell buoy.

MEDITERRANEAN—ITALY—GULFS OF TARANTO AND ST. EUFEMIA.

Fixed and Flashing Light on St. Vito Point.

The Italian Government has given notice, that on and after the 10th August, 1869, a new light will be exhibited from a tower on St. Vito Point, in the Gulf of Taranto.

The light will be a white light, varied by *flashes* every *two minutes*, elevated 150 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of about 20 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the third order.

The tower is white, octagonal, 118 feet high, and rises from the centre of the keeper's dwelling; the position as given is in lat. 40° 25' 12" N., long. 17° 9' 6" East.

The lighthouse is visible from seaward in all directions, and serves as a guide for vessels entering or leaving the Gulf of Taranto.

Fixed and Flashing Light on Cape Suvero.

Also, that from the 1st of August, 1869, a new light will be exhibited from a building on Cape Suvero, in the Gulf of St. Eufemia.

The light will be a white light, varied by *flashes* every *two minutes*, elevated 141 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of about 18 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fourth order.

The tower is white, octagonal, and rises 9 feet above the keeper's dwelling, which is a white rectangular building of two stories.

The lighthouse is visible from seaward in all directions, and serves as a guide for vessels entering or leaving the Gulf of St. Eufemia.

(No. 55.)—MEDITERRANEAN.—SPAIN, EAST COAST.

Extension of Mole at Valencia.

THE Hydrographic Department at Madrid has given Notice, that on the 1st June, 1869, the eastern mole of the port of Valencia had attained a length of 65 yards in an E.S.E. direction. Judging by the work already executed, it is expected that in every six months an additional length of 65 yards will be completed, until the mole shall have attained a length of 437 yards.

The light exhibited from this mole is always on the angle formed by the old mole, and the one now building.

Temporary Light at Alicante.

Also, a temporary light has been exhibited on the extremity of the western mole now building at the port of Alicante.

The light is a *fixed green* light, elevated 26 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of about 2 miles.

The light will be shifted as the work advances, and will always indicate the extremity of the mole.

ADRIATIC.—COAST OF ITALY.

Fixed Light at Brindisi Harbour.

Discovery of the Josephine Bank.

THE Swedish Legation, in London, has forwarded to the Admiralty the following information respecting the discovery of a bank of soundings in the North Atlantic, by Captain Ankererona, of the Swedish Corvette *Josephine*, in July, 1869.

Whilst in the general track between the English channel and Madeira, about 80 leagues westward of Cape St. Vincent, soundings were obtained on a bank hitherto unknown; and the result of an examination places the northern end of the bank, with average soundings of 300 fathoms, in lat. $36^{\circ} 51'$ N., long. $14^{\circ} 13'$ West of Greenwich, and thence it extends South (magnetic) for a distance of $13 \frac{1}{2}$ miles, with an average breadth of about five miles.

Depths varying from 100 to 150 fathoms, occupy an extent of $8 \frac{3}{4}$ miles in a north and south direction, with a width of $4 \frac{1}{2}$ miles.

The least water obtained, 99 fathoms, is in lat. $36^{\circ} 42'$ N., long. $14^{\circ} 7'$ W., and about three miles from the southern extremity; this portion of the bank consisting of pieces of lava covered with coral, whilst towards the north the bottom is composed of yellow sand, intermixed with broken shells. During the examination stones were brought up, the largest weighing as much as 57 lbs.

This extensive bank of soundings is situated at a distance of 175 miles, N. 43° E. (true) of the assigned position of the Eight Stones, a danger searched for in vain by several of H.M. ships, said to be three leagues in extent from east to west, and even with the surface of the water, and which, from the date of its alleged discovery in

1732, had until lately retained a place in the Charts.
