AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 15th day of September, 1869.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS one of the Royal Mail Steam Packet Company's vessels, called the "Atrato," has lately arrived, from the West Indies, and has been directed to proceed to, and remain under quarantine at, the Motherbank, off the Isle of Wight, and during and in the course of her voyage from the West Indies, the Yellow Fever, being a dangerous and infectious disease, appeared on board the said vessel, and attacked persons on board thereof, and the said vessel arrived under alarming and suspicious circumstances; and whereas several sick persons who were on board the "Atrato," on her arrival, have since been ordered to be removed to the Quarantine Lazarette or Hulk called the "Menelaus," lying at the Motherbank:

And whereas it is expedient to make provision for the disposition of the other persons remaining on board the said ship:

Now, therefore, the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, in exercise of the powers vested in them, do hereby order,—

1. That the said vessel, called the "Atrato," shall remain and continue at the Motherbank aforesaid, until the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, or any two or more of them, shall make further order.

2. That the persons now on board the said vessel called the "Atrato," not ordered to be removed to the "Menelaus," shall be removed to the ship called the "Edgar," or the ship called the "Æolus," unless ordered to remain on board the "Atrato," by the Medical Superintendent of Quarantine at Southampton.

3. That all persons so removed on board the "Menelaus" Quarantine Hulk, or who shall hereafter be removed on board the said Hulk, or on board the "Edgar," or the "Æolus," and who shall have been on board the "Atrato," shall be kept and detained on board the said Hulk, or the "Edgar," or the "Æolus," until the Lords of the Council, or any two or more of them, shall make further order.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the

Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

*Board of Trade, Whitehall,

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Madrid, inclosing a copy and translation of a Decree, issued by the Spanish Government on the 4th instant, which permits the importation into Spain of books printed in Spanish in foreign countries, on payment of the corresponding Tariff Dues.

The following are the Articles of this Decree:—

ART. 1. According to the bases for the Tariff, and to the Tariff now in force, paragraph 2 of Article 15 of the Law of Literary Copyright is hereby abrogated.

ART. 2. All works already printed, or hereafter to be printed in Spanish in foreign countries, may be imported into Spain, on payment of the proper duties according to the Customs Laws.

ART. 3. The Authors or Publishers of works printed in Spanish in foreign countries shall send to this Ministry (*the Ministry of Public Works*) a list of the works which they wish to import into Spain. This list shall be published in the "Gazette," and the importation shall not take place until fifteen days afterwards.

ART. 4. The dispositions of this Decree do not prejudice any of the questions now pending concerning literary copyright, and set on foot according to the previous laws.
