THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Madrid, copy of a Decree issued by the Spanish Government on the 17th instant, relative to the laws concerning anonymous Companies in Spanish Colonies.

The following are the Articles of this Decree:—

ART. 1. The Decree and Regulation of 19th October, 1853, concerning the constitution of anonymous Companies, the Royal Order of 8th September, 1857, and all Decrees and Orders subsequently issued on the same subject, are hereby abrogated in Cuba, Porto Rico, and the Philippines.

ART. 2. The Commercial Code is re-established in everything concerning the constitution and organization of anonymous Companies.

ART. 3. The Government inspection of the anonymous Companies now in existence shall cease six months after the publication of this Decree in the Official Gazettes of the Habana, Porto Rico, and Manila, to which end the Companies may, during the said space of time, make in their organization, statutes, and regulations, such reforms as the shareholders in general meeting may think proper.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Ealing, in the county of Middlesex;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Ealing, in the county of Middlesex, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons.

And whereas, at a meeting of the vestry, held at the vestry room, Ealing, after public notice in that behalf, on Friday, the 14th day of May last, it was resolved:—

“That the Poor Law Board be requested to issue an Order under their seal of office, directing that the Act passed on the 5th August, 1850, 13 and 14 Vict., c. 57), entitled ‘An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the appointment of Vestry Clerks,’ shall be applied to and put in force within this parish, as regards that portion of it only which relates to the appointment of Vestry Clerk.”

And whereas the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above resolution.

Now, therefore, we, the Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say;—

ARTICLE I.—That so much of the said Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled “An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the appointment of Vestry Clerks,” as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish of Ealing.

ARTICLE II.—That the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish shall, unless the Poor Law Board otherwise direct, pay to the officer for the time being appointed to the said office of Vestry Clerk for the said parish, under the authority of the Statutes in such behalf and this Order, for the performance of the duties of such office, a salary of twenty pounds per annum.

ARTICLE III.—That the salary of such Vestry Clerk shall be payable up to the day on which he ceases to hold such office, and no longer, and shall be paid by quarterly payments at the several quarters ending at the usual feast days in the year, namely, Christmas Day, Lady Day, Midsummer Day, and Michaelmas Day, with a proportionate sum to be paid to his executors or administrators, in case he shall die while holding such office.

And at the request of the Churchwardens and Overseers, we hereby prescribe and direct—

ARTICLE IV.—That the said Vestry Clerk shall perform all the duties specified in the said Act, except the following, namely, those which require him—

To make out all the entries in the Rate Books subsequent to the allowance of each rate, and to give the notices thereof required by law;

To prepare and issue the necessary process for recovering of arrears of such rates respectively before the Justices, and procure the summons to be served, and to attend the Justices thereon, and advise the Churchwardens and Overseers as to the recovery of such arrears;

To attend the Audit of Accounts of the Overseers, and conduct all correspondence arising therefrom;

To ascertain and make out the list of persons liable to serve on Juries, and to cause them to be printed and duly published and returned to the Justices;

To give notices for claims to vote for Members of Parliament, and to make out list of Voters, and get the same printed and published and duly returned according to law, and to attend the Court for revising them, and to prepare, make out, and publish the Burgess lists and the lists of Constables;

To advise the Churchwardens and Overseers in all the duties of their offices, and also to perform such other duties and services of a like nature as the said Commissioners for administering the Laws for the relief of the Poor in England from time to time, at the request of the Churchwardens or Overseers of any such parish, or otherwise, shall prescribe and direct to be performed by such Vestry Clerk.

ARTICLE V.—That a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
