THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, and shall continue in force till the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

2. This Order extends to Great Britain only.

3. In this Order words have the same meaning as in The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869.

4. All the provisions contained in The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, relating to pleuro-pneumonia shall apply and have effect with respect to foot-and-mouth disease: Provided nevertheless, that for the purposes of this Order, the rules for foot-and-mouth disease contained in the Schedule to this Order shall be in substitution of the pleuro-pneumonia rules contained in the seventh schedule to The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, and for the purposes of this Order section fifty-five of the said Act shall be read and have effect as if the word "ten" were inserted in place of the word "thirty."

5. The forms given in the eighth schedule to The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, with such variations as circumstances require, may be used by an inspector for the purposes of this Order.

6. Nothing in this Order shall affect the operation of the provisions contained in Article 21 of

The Metropolitan Contagious Diseases (Animals) Order of August, 1869, relating to foot-and-mouth disease.

SCHEDULE.

Rules for Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

1. These rules are to have effect with respect to any field, stable, cow-shed, or other premises infected by foot-and-mouth disease.

2. Animals affected with foot-and-mouth disease, or herded with animals so affected, are not to be moved from such field, stable, cow-shed, or other premises, or from any land or building contiguous thereto in the same occupation, except either for immediate slaughter, according to regulations to be from time to time made by the Local Authority for insuring such slaughter, or if not for immediate slaughter, under a licence signed by an officer of the Local Authority appointed to issue licences in that behalf.

3. Sheds and places used by animals affected with foot-and-mouth disease are forthwith, after being so used, to be cleansed and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Local Authority.

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Order of the Privy Council bearing date the tenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, relating to the Port of Portsmouth, shall be read and have effect as if so

much of the said Order, as is here recited, were omitted therefrom, namely :—

“ Also all that space in the borough of Portsmouth, being part of the quay or wharf belonging to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Portsmouth, lying between the water of that part of the Harbour of Portsmouth, called the Inner Camber, and a line commencing at the water at the north-eastern point of the said Inner Camber, and running in a straight line due east for a distance of thirty yards to the Town Wall, thence in a southerly direction for a distance of one hundred and five yards along the western side of the Town Wall, thence in a north-westerly direction for a distance of twenty-four yards to the water of Inner Camber.”

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of North Shields, in the county of Northumberland, as a part thereof within which foreign cattle may be landed for slaughter, as follows:—

All that space in the town of Tynemouth lying between the sea or the River Tyne and a line commencing at the water at the eastern end of the bridge adjoining and on the south side of the borough of Tynemouth Gas Works, and running northward along the eastern boundary of the borough of Tynemouth Gas Works and the eastern wall of the North Shields Baths to the north-eastern corner of the said baths, thence continuing northward along the western boundary of the Iron Foundry and Flour Mills, and the eastern side of the street or road called Tanner's Bank to the southern boundary of the property of the North Eastern Railway Company, thence eastward for a distance of sixty yards along the southern boundary of the property of the North Eastern Railway Company, thence in a southerly direction along the eastern boundary of garden ground belonging to His Grace the Duke of Northumberland to a point on the sea bank forty yards north-east of the northern end of the Cholera Hospital, all which space is coloured pink on the plan of part of the town of Tynemouth deposited at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the Office of the Town Clerk of the borough of Tynemouth.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

By the Lord Lieutenant-General and General Governor and Privy Council of Ireland.

SPENCER.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the Session of the Eleventh and Twelfth Years of the Reign of Her present Majesty, Queen

Victoria, Chapter 107, which has been continued by subsequent Acts of Parliament still in force, certain Powers and Authorities are given to make such Orders and Regulations as are therein mentioned, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of Contagious or Infectious Diseases among Cattle, Sheep, Horses, Swine, and other Animals :

And whereas by an Act of Parliament passed in the Session of the Twenty-ninth Year of the Reign of Her said Majesty, Chapter 4, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Lord Lieutenant, or other Chief Governor or Governors of Ireland, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council in Ireland, shall and may exercise the aforesaid Powers and Authorities, and also from time to time make such Orders and Regulations as to him or them may seem necessary for the purposes in said several Acts mentioned :

And whereas a Contagious and Infectious Disorder now exists extensively among Cattle in Great Britain, and in some Foreign European States, which is generally designated the Foot and Mouth Distemper :

And whereas it is expedient to take measures for preventing such Disease from extending to that portion of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland called Ireland :

Now We, John Poyntz, Earl Spencer, Lord Lieutenant-General and General Governor of Ireland, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council in Ireland, do hereby Order and Direct—

That from and after the day of the date of the publication of this Order in the *Dublin Gazette*, it shall not be lawful to import into, or land from any Sea Board of any Port or place in that part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland called Ireland, any Bull, Ox, Cow, Heifer, Calf, Sheep, Ram, Lamb, Goat, Kid, Swine, or any Ruminant Animal from any part of Great Britain, or any other Country, save and except Spain or Portugal ; but this Order shall not apply to Adult Rams brought to the Port of Dublin from Great Britain for breeding purposes, provided that every such Adult Ram imported to the Port of Dublin from Great Britain for breeding purposes shall be accompanied with a Declaration in the Form annexed hereto, made before one of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace at the Port of the Embarkation in Great Britain of such Adult Ram, by the Consignor or Consignors of the same, to the effect that such Adult Ram has not been in contact with any Bull, Ox, Cow, Heifer, Calf, Sheep, Ram, Lamb, Goat, Kid, Swine, or any Ruminant Animal affected with a Contagious or Infectious Disease, and has not been on lands, or in any premises or place, on or in which there had been at any time during the Three Months immediately preceding its entry thereon or therein, any Bull, Ox, Cow, Heifer, Calf, Sheep, Ram, Lamb, Goat, Swine, or other Ruminant Animal affected with Contagious or Infectious Disease ; and the said Declaration shall, together with such Adult Ram, be delivered to the Captain of the Vessel wherein such Adult Ram shall be embarked, and until such delivery of such Declaration no such Ram shall be allowed on board such Vessel, and the said Declaration shall be by such Captain delivered to the Collector of Customs or one of his Officers at the Port of Debarcation before the landing of such Ram or Rams shall be permitted.

And We do hereby further order that any and every Ship-Owner, Ship-Agent, Ship-Captain, or

other person offending against this Order, shall, by virtue of said Acts, for every such offence, forfeit and be liable to a penalty of Twenty Pounds sterling; and if in any case the number of Bulls, Oxen, Cows, Heifers, Calves, Sheep, Rams, Lambs, Goats, Swine, or other Ruminant Animals, imported contrary to this Order be more than Four, a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds sterling for each such Animal imported may be

imposed instead of the said penalty of Twenty Pounds sterling.

(5th and 6th William IV., cap. 62), intituled "An Act to repeal an Act of the present Session of Parliament, intituled An Act for the more effectual Abolition of Oaths and Affirmations taken and made in the various Departments of the State, and to substitute Declarations in lieu thereof; and for the more entire suppression of Voluntary and Extra-Judicial Oaths and Affidavits, and to make other provisions for the abolition of unnecessary Oaths.
