NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ACTS BY OSWALD-TWISTLE, IN THE COUNTY OF LANCASTER.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 73.)—FRANCE—NORTH COAST.

Alterations in Lights and Buoys.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 16, dated 8th March, 1869, respecting an intended alteration in the lights and buoys between Calais and the Belgian frontier, on the North coast of France, the French Government has given further notice that the following alterations have been made:—

Lights.

Ruytingen light is a revolving red light eclipsed every thirty seconds, elevated 33 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 11 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric or by reflectors.

The light vessel is painted red, and is moored in 8 to 11 fathoms at low water, N. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. from Dunkerque lighthouse, in lat. $51^{\circ} 12' 52''$ N., long. $2^{\circ} 12' 9''$ East from Greenwich.

Dyck lights are two fixed white lights elevated 34 and 23 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 11 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric or by reflectors.

The light vessel is painted red, and is moored in about 11 fathoms at low water, N. by W. $\frac{1}{3}$ W., $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Gravelines lighthouse, in lat. $51^{\circ} 3' 8''$ N., long. $2^{\circ} 3' 29''$ East.

Snouw light is a fixed red light elevated 33 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 7 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric or by reflectors.

The light vessel is painted red, and is moored in 11 fathoms at low water, E.N.E., 5 miles from Gravelines light, in lat. $51^{\circ} 3' 32''$ N., long. $2^{\circ} 12' 35''$ East.

The above light vessels have the name painted on their sides in large white letters, and each mast is surmounted by a red skeleton ball.

Directions.—The Snouw and Dyck lights kept in line will indicate the position of Dunkerque roads.

The Dyck lights in line with the revolving light of Dunkerque, will indicate the direction to Dunkerque roads when coming from the westward.

The Dyck lights when kept a little to the left or to the eastward of the fixed light of Gravelines, will lead through the passage between the western point of Out-Ruytingen and the small bank to the westward of it.

The line between the fixed light at Gravelines and the Ruytingen light passes through the channel between West Dyck and Middle Dyck and the In-Ruytingen and Out-Ruytingen shoals.

Buoys.

The following nine iron buoys have been placed on the outer margin of the banks extending from the Bergues bank to the Riden of Calais:—

Bergues Bank.—No. 1. A black buoy with ball in 11 fathoms, N. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. from Dunkerque lighthouse, in lat. $51^{\circ} 16' 25''$ N., long. $2^{\circ} 18' 9''$ East.

Three buoys on the Great bank of Out-Ruytingen, viz.:—

North-East Buoy.—No. 3. A black buoy with diamond in $9\frac{3}{4}$ fathoms, N.N.W. from Dunkerque lighthouse, in lat. $51^{\circ} 12' 9''$ N., long. $2^{\circ} 9' 30''$ East.

Middle Buoy.—No. 5. A black buoy with a cylinder, near the middle of the bank in 9 fathoms, N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. from Dunkerque lighthouse, and N.E. by E. from Calais lighthouse, in lat. $51^{\circ} 9' 8''$ N., long. $2^{\circ} 5' 18''$ East.

South-West Buoy.—No. 7. A black buoy with cone, point upwards, in 8 fathoms, N. by W. from Gravelines Lighthouse, and N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. from Calais lighthouse, in lat. $51^{\circ} 7' 15''$ N., long. $1^{\circ} 59' 51''$ East.

Three buoys on the Little bank of Out-Ruytingen:—

North Buoy.—No. 2. A red buoy with a cone, pointing downwards, in $6\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms, N.N.W. from Gravelines lighthouse, and N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. from Calais lighthouse, in lat. $51^{\circ} 7' 24''$ N., long. $1^{\circ} 56' 28''$ East.

South Buoy.—No. 4. A red buoy with two cones joined at their points, in 11 fathoms, N.N.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W. from Gravelines lighthouse, and N.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ N. from Calais lighthouse, in lat. $51^{\circ} 6' 2''$ N., long. $1^{\circ} 55' 41''$ East.

West Buoy.—No. 9. A black and white chequered buoy with cone surmounted by a square, in $6\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms, N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. from Gravelines lighthouse, and N.N.E. (northerly) from Calais lighthouse, in lat. $51^{\circ} 5' 23''$ N., long. $1^{\circ} 51' 37''$ East.

Two buoys on the Riden of Calais, viz.:—

North-East Buoy.—No. 6. A red buoy, with a ball, in $5\frac{1}{4}$ fathoms, W. by N. $\frac{3}{4}$ N. from Walde lighthouse, and N.W. by N. from Calais lighthouse, in lat. $50^{\circ} 59' 40''$ N., long. $1^{\circ} 46' 59''$ East.

South-West Buoy.—No. 1. A black buoy, with a double C, in $6\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms, W. $\frac{3}{4}$ N. from

Walde lighthouse, and N.W. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., from Calais lighthouse, in lat. $50^{\circ} 58' 25''$ N., long. $1^{\circ} 45' 9''$ East.

West Bromwich Union.—Township of Oldbury.

To the Overseers of the Poor of the township of Oldbury, in the county of Worcester;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the township of Oldbury, in the county of Worcester, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons.

And whereas at a meeting of the Vestry of the said township of Oldbury, held at the Vestry of Christ Church, Oldbury, after public notice in that behalf, on Friday, the twenty-seventh day of August last, it was resolved,—

“That the present Vestry is too small and inconvenient, and that the Overseers of the said township be, and they are hereby authorized on obtaining the sanction of the Poor Law Board, to close the present Vestry, and to purchase the building situated in Tabernacle-street, Oldbury (and known as the People's Hall), for the purpose of holding any Vestry or other meeting, or for the transaction of any business of or relating to the township of Oldbury; and that the Overseers be further authorized (with the consent of the Poor Law Board) to purchase the said building, with the gas and other internal and external fittings, for the sum of three hundred pounds.”

And whereas the Overseers of the Poor of the said township have made their application, in writing, to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above resolutions.

Now, therefore, we, the Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, hereby order and direct as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—That so much of the said Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled “An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks,” as relates to the providing of a room or suitable buildings for the purpose of holding Vestry Meetings for the transaction of any business of, or relating to, the said township of Oldbury, shall forthwith be applied to, and be put in force within the said township.

ARTICLE II.—That a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

ST. GEORGE'S SQUARE, Pimlico.	Three Carriages. In St. George's Square, North side of Lupus Street, along the kerb next the railings of garden of St. George's Square, op- posite East end of St. Saviour's Church, in the parish of St. George, Hanover Square.
WARWICK SQUARE	Five Carriages. Along the kerb next the railings of the garden, West end of Warwick Square, opposite St. Gabriel's Church (leaving a clear space of thirteen feet for use of water cart), in the parish of St. George, Hanover Square.

To commence at the grating at the South-west corner of George Street and Gloucester Street, along the kerb on the South side of George Street towards Montagu Square as far as necessary for four hackney carriages to stand, horses' heads towards the East.

MANCHESTER STREET, Manchester Square.	Four Carriages. To commence at the South-east corner of George Street and Manchester Street, and extend along the kerb on the East side of Manchester Street towards Manchester Square as far as necessary for four hackney carriages to stand, horses' heads towards the North.
CORNWALL TERRACE MEWS, Clarence Gate, Regent's Park.	Four Carriages. To commence three feet East of the crossing from Upper Baker Street to the East side of Clarence Gate, Regent's Park, and extend along the garden railing on the North side of Cornwall Terrace Mews as far as necessary for four hackney carriages to stand, horses' heads towards Clarence Gate.
QUEEN STREET, Edgware Road.	Four Carriages. To commence opposite the first lamp post from the Edgware Road in Queen Street, and extend along the centre of the said street as far as necessary for four hackney carriages to stand, horses' heads towards the West.
CHARLES STREET, Middlesex Hospital.	Six Carriages. In the centre of the street between Berners Street and Wells Street.
FITZROY STREET	Six Carriages. In the centre of the street between Fitzroy Square and Euston Road.
GORDON SQUARE	Three Carriages. Close to the kerb opposite the Apostolic Church.
UPPER MONTAGUE STREET ...	Three Carriages. In the centre of roadway between Russell Square and Woburn Square.
COMMERCIAL ROAD EAST ...	Three Carriages. The horses' heads to face the West, the first horse's head opposite the door of the Victoria Coffee House, No. 35, Langley Place, Commercial Road; the carriages to extend thence Eastward along the centre of carriage way.
STEPNEY GREEN	Two Carriages. To commence at the crossing in the Mile End Road and extend along the kerbstone on the West side of Stepney Green as far as necessary for two hackney carriages to stand.
GREAT SUTTON STREET, Commercial Road East.	Four Carriages. To commence six feet from the crossing in Commercial Road East and extend along the centre of Great Sutton Street as far as necessary for four hackney carriages to stand.
NEW KENT ROAD	Six Carriages. To commence opposite the Crown and Anchor Public House, No. 118, New Kent Road, extending Eastward along the centre of road as far as necessary for six horses, horses' heads to be westward.
UPPER GRANGE ROAD, Bermondsey.	Four Carriages. To commence at lamp post in the centre of the North end of Upper Grange Road, Bermondsey, and extend Westward along the centre of the same road as far as necessary for four carriages, horses' heads to be Northward.
ST. PAUL'S ROAD, Highbury.	Two Carriages. To commence with horses' heads twenty-one feet from St. Mary's Road, along kerb on South side of St. Paul's Road, to within ten feet of Mr. Jessop's Yard.
ASHBY ROAD, Islington.	Two Carriages. To commence with horses' head nine feet from Essex Road, along kerb East side of Ashby Road.

ALMORAH ROAD, Islington.	Three Carriages. To commence with horse's head twenty-four feet from Haliford Street, along centre of Almorah Road.
HAGGERSTON RAILWAY STATION.	Three Carriages. To commence with horse's head ninety feet from Kingsland Road, along North side of Lee Street, to within forty feet of Railway Bridge.

RYE LANE, Peckham.	Three Carriages. Alongside the footway on the North side in front of Peckham Rye Railway Station.
DEPTFORD, Kent.	Four Carriages. To commence at the rear of the Urinal at the top of High Street, Deptford, and extend along the centre of the street as far as necessary for four Hackney carriages to stand.
FITZROY ROAD, Primrose Hill.	Three Carriages. Commencing fifteen yards from the crossing in the Regent's Park Road, and extending along the centre of Fitzroy Road towards Gloucester Road, horses' heads towards Primrose Hill.
HAVERSTOCK HILL	Three Carriages. Commencing ten feet from the College Road, Haverstock Hill, extending along centre of Eton Road towards Provost Road, horses' heads towards Haverstock Hill.
SOUTHAMPTON ROAD, Kentish Town.	Three Carriages. Commencing opposite Malden Road, extending along West side of Southampton Road towards Mansfield Road, horses' heads towards Maitland Park.
ABBAY ROAD, St. John's Wood.	Three Carriages. Commencing at lamp post nearest to Boundary Road, extending along kerb on East side of Abbey Road, keeping clear of water post, horses' heads towards Boundary Road.
GREEN HILL, Hampstead.	Three Carriages. Commencing at Green Hill, Hampstead, opposite the Brewery, extending along the embankment wall down the Hill, horses' heads towards Hampstead.

HORNTON STREET, Kensington Road.	Four Carriages. To commence at the South end of Hornton Street, Kensington Road, and extend by the kerb stone on the West side thereof as far Northward in Hornton Street as may be necessary for four hackney carriages to stand.
METROPOLITAN RAILWAY STATION, High Street, Kensington.	Two Carriages. At the hoarding by the kerbstone on the North side of the High Street, between the houses Nos. 2 and 6, Kensington Road, opposite the Kensington Station of the Metropolitan District Railway.
GREAT WESTERN ROAD, Kensington Crescent.	Six Carriages. To commence twelve feet Eastward from the centre gate leading to Kensington Crescent, and extend by the kerbstone next the railings on the South side of the Great Western Road as far Eastward as may be necessary for six hackney carriages to stand.
NEW ROAD, Hammersmith.	Three Carriages. To commence by the wall opposite the Old Crucible Works, and extend Westward by the footway as far as may be necessary for three hackney carriages to stand.
THE GROVE, Hammersmith.	Three Carriages. To commence at the North Gate of the Metropolitan and Great Western Company's Coal Wharf, in "The Grove," Hammersmith, and extend by the footway against the dead wall on the East side of "The Grove" as far Southwards as may be necessary for three hackney carriages to stand.
QUEEN STREET, Hammersmith.	Four Carriages. To commence four yards from the junction of Bridge Road and Queen Street, and extend by the kerbstone on the West side of Queen Street as far Southwards as may be necessary for four hackney carriages to stand.
OLD BROMPTON ROAD, Kensington.	Six Carriages. To commence at the iron grating fifteen yards West from the corner of Onslow Gardens (late and better known as Swan Lane), and extend by the kerbstone next the railings of the enclosure of Onslow Gardens on the South side of the Old Brompton-road, Kensington, as far in a Westerly direction as may be necessary for six hackney carriages to stand.
