WHEREAS in pursuance of "The Bishops' Resignation Act, 1869," a representation has been made to Her Majesty by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Archibald Campbell, by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan, at the instance of the Right Reverend Charles Richard, by Divine permission Bishop of Winchester, within the said province of Canterbury, that the said Bishop is desirous of resigning his Bishopric, by reason that he is incapacitated by permanent physical infirmity from the due performance of his duties as Bishop; and whereas Her Majesty is satisfied of such incapacity, and that the said Bishop has canonically resigned; and whereas it has also been made to appear to Her Majesty that there are three residences appertaining to the said See, and that there will be no inconvenience occasioned by assigning one of them to the said late Bishop, and also that the said late Bishop has undertaken during such time as he may occupy the episcopal residence hereinafter mentioned to insure and keep insured against fire the said episcopal residence, in the sum of six thousand and three hundred pounds at the least, and to pay over all sums received under such insurance to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in trust to be applied to the reinstatement of the said residence, and also (in addition to any dilapidations which may be payable by him the said late Bishop, his executors or administrators, in respect of his past occupation) that he and his executors and administrators shall pay the like dilapidations, or

sums in the nature of dilapidations, in respect of his future occupation of the said episcopal residence :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased hereby to declare the said Bishopric of Winchester to be vacant, and upon divers special grounds appearing unto Her Majesty, and among others upon the special grounds herein appearing, to assign to the said late Bishop for his residence during his life the episcopal residence of Farnham Castle, with the gardens and park appertaining thereto, heretofore occupied by him. And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Winchester.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of "The Bishops' Resignation Act, 1869," a representation has been made to Her Majesty by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Archibald Campbell, by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan, at the instance of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Robert John, Baron Auckland, by Divine permission Bishop of Bath and Wells, within the said Province of Canterbury, that the said Robert John, Baron Auckland, is desirous of resigning his Bishopric by reason that he is incapacitated by permanent physical infirmity from the due performance of his duties as Bishop; and whereas Her Majesty is satisfied of such incapacity, and that the said Bishop has canonically resigned; and whereas it has also been made to appear to Her Majesty that the said late Bishop is dangerously ill, and that a convenient residence can be found for his successor, and also that the said late Bishop has undertaken to pay such instalments and interest as may become payable to the Governors of the bounty of Queen Anne during such time as he may occupy the episcopal residence hereinafter mentioned, in respect of the mortgage of the estates of the said Bishopric, effected under the provisions of the Orders of Her Majesty in Council, bearing date respectively the sixth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and the tenth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, for the alteration and improvement of the said episcopal residence; and also during such his occupation to insure and keep insured against fire the said episcopal residence in the sum of six thousand four hundred and twenty-five pounds, at the least, and to pay over all sums received under such insurance to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in trust, to be applied to the reinstatement of the said residence, and also in addition to any dilapidations which may be payable by him the said late Bishop, his executors or administrators, in respect of his past occupation; that he and his executors or administrators shall pay the like dilapidations or sums in the nature of dilapidations in respect of his future occupation of the said episcopal residence.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased hereby to

declare the said Bishopric of Bath and Wells to be vacant, and upon divers special grounds appearing unto Her Majesty, and among others upon the special grounds herein appearing, to assign to the said late Bishop, for his residence during his life, the episcopal residence at Wells, with the appurtenances heretofore occupied by him. And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Bath and Wells.

WHEREAS by "The Thames Conservancy Act, 1857," it is enacted that the Conservators of the River Thames shall have power and authority, from time to time, to make bye-laws for the regulation, management, and improvement of the River Thames, and the navigation thereof, in the manner thereby provided, and to impose penalties, not exceeding five pounds, for the breach or non-performance of such bye-laws :

And whereas by the forty-seventh section of the said Act, it is enacted that no such bye-laws shall be in force until the same have been sent to the Lord Chief Justice of the Court of Queen's Bench, the Lord Chief Justice of the Court of Common Pleas, and the Lord Chief Baron of the Court of Exchequer, and shall have been approved by one of them :

And whereas by the thirty-first section of "The Thames Conservancy Act, 1864," it is enacted that from and after the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, section forty-seven of "The Thames Conservancy Act, 1857," shall be repealed, and that bye-laws, made after the commencement of such repeal, under the authority of either of the said recited Acts, shall not have any force unless and until they are allowed by Order of Her Majesty in Council :

And whereas by the sixty-fifth section of the last-mentioned Act, it is enacted, that from and after the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, the Conservators of the River Thames may from time to time make bye-laws (inter alia) for the protecting, preserving, and regulating of the fisheries of the River Thames, and the preservation of the fish therein; for the prohibition of the use of nets and apparatus improper to be used for taking fish; for determining the times during which the taking of any particular or specified kind of fish shall not to be practised :

And whereas by the forty-first section of "The Thames Navigation Act, 1866," it is enacted that from the passing of the said Act the Conservators of the River Thames shall have the same or the like powers and authorities over and with respect to the Thames and Isis from Staines to Cricklade as they have, by virtue of the Thames Conservancy Acts, 1857 and 1864, over and with respect to the Thames below Staines :

And whereas by the forty-second section of the same Act it is enacted that the provisions of the said Conservancy Acts of 1857 and 1864, respecting bye-laws shall extend and apply to bye-

laws for the purposes of the Upper Navigation Acts, or the said Thames Navigation Act, 1866:

And whereas by the twelfth section of "The Thames Conservancy Act, 1867" (which is to be read as one with the Thames Conservancy Acts, 1857 and 1864, and the Navigation Act of 1866), it is enacted that the said Conservators shall have full power and authority to make such rules, regulations, and bye-laws as to them may seem necessary for the purpose of regulating the passage of steamers and other vessels and boats on the River Thames on the occasion of any regatta, boat-race, public procession, or ship-launch, or any other occasion when large crowds may assemble thereon:

And whereas the said Conservators have, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the said last recited Acts, made and submitted for the allowance of Her Majesty in Council certain bye-laws for regulating boat races on, and for protecting, preserving, and regulating the fisheries in, the Upper River Thames, or River Thames and Isis, from the City Stone near Staines to Cricklade:

And whereas the said bye-laws have been duly published in accordance with the said recited Acts, and it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the said bye-laws (as set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed) are reasonable and proper:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by "The Thames Conservancy Act, 1864," and of every other power enabling Her in that behalf, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to allow the said bye-laws.

Schedule referred to in the above Order.

PRELIMINARY.

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Upper Thames Bye-Laws of 1869.

2. These bye-laws shall come into operation the day after the same are allowed by Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council (which time is in these bye-laws referred to as the commencement of these bye-laws).

3. These bye-laws extend and apply only to the River Thames, or the Rivers Thames and Isis, from the city-stone near Staines to Cricklade (which part of the river is in these bye-laws called the Upper River); and nothing in these bye-laws shall affect the rules, orders, and ordinances made by the Court of the Mayor and Aldermen of the city of London the fourth day of October, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-five (relative to fishing in the River Thames below the city-stone aforesaid), or the rule, order, or ordinance made by the Conservators of the River Thames the twenty-third day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty, amending those rules, orders, and ordinances, or any other rule, order, or ordinance, or bye-law, applying to the River Thames below the city-stone aforesaid, and in force at the commencement of these bye-laws.

4. In these bye-laws, except where otherwise provided, words have the same meaning and effect as in the above-mentioned Acts.

5. The provisions of these bye-laws, and penalties imposed thereby, and remedies for enforcement thereof, shall be deemed to be in addition to, and not in substitution for, any statutory provision

in force at the commencement of these bye-laws, and penalties imposed thereby, and remedies for enforcement thereof.

Boat-races, &c.

6. Any vessel being on the Upper River on the occasion of any boat-race, regatta, public procession, or launch of any vessel, or on any other occasion when large crowds assemble thereon, shall not pass thereon so as to impede or interfere with the boat-race, regatta, procession, or launch, or endanger the safety of persons assembling on the river, or prevent the maintenance of order thereon; and the master of every such vessel, on any such occasion as aforesaid, shall observe the directions of the officer of the Conservators engaged in superintending the execution of this bye-law; and if any such master fails in any respect to comply with the requirements of this bye-law, or does anything in contravention thereof, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these bye-laws, and shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Fisheries.

7. Subject to the reservation of rights in these bye-laws contained, every net or engine, except a net of one of the descriptions following, shall be deemed a prohibited net or engine within these bye-laws; that is to say:—

(a.) A cast net not exceeding five yards in circumference, to be used in obtaining bait only to be employed in angling, the sack or purse thereof not being more than fourteen inches in depth when extended to the utmost.

(b.) The common drop round minnow net, not exceeding three feet in diameter.

(c.) A small landing net, to be used for securing fish taken in angling.

(d.) A hand net, to be used for removing fish from the well of a boat, or for carrying or preserving fish after capture.

8. The following respective periods shall be deemed to be the fence season in the upper river; that is to say:—

(a.) For salmon, salmon trout, and trout, the period between the tenth day of September in each year and the thirty-first day of March following, both inclusive.

(b.) For pike, jack, perch, roach, rudd, barbel, bream, chubb, carp, tench, grayling, gudgeon, pope, dace, crayfish, bleak, minnow, and every kind of fish known as river fish (except salmon, salmon trout, and trout), the period between the fourteenth day of February in each year and the thirty-first day of May following, both inclusive.

9. It shall not be lawful for any person, as regards the Upper River, to do any of the following things; that is to say:—

(a.) To fish with, use, trawl, lay, or set a prohibited net or engine.

(b.) To have in his possession while on the Upper River, or near thereto, a prohibited net, unless he shows to the satisfaction of the Justice before whom he is charged, that he had not the same in his possession with intent, at the time of such possession, to fish with, use, trawl, lay, or set the same in the River.

(c.) To fish for, or take, or attempt to take any fish by using unbaited hooks, or a wire, or snare for the purpose of foul hooking, commonly called snatching or snaring.

(d.) To fish for, or take, or attempt to take any fish except in the day time, that is to say, between

the beginning of the last hour before sunrise, and the end of the first hour after sunset.

(e.) To fish for or take, or attempt to take, or to have in his possession any fish within the fence season for the same.

(f.) To buy or sell any fish that has been, within the fence season for the same, taken in the Upper River knowing the same to have been so taken.

(g.) To wilfully fish for, or take, or attempt to take, or wilfully disturb any fish when spawning.

(h.) To wilfully take, destroy, or spoil any spawn, fry, or brood of fish.

And if any person does anything in contravention of this bye-law he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

10. Where a prohibited net or engine is seized under any of the above-mentioned Acts, or these bye-laws, the same may be burnt or otherwise destroyed by order of the justice before whom the same is brought, without prejudice to the infliction of a penalty on, or other remedy against, the person offending in relation to the net or engine.

11. It shall not be lawful for any person to take or kill in the Upper River any fish of the following kind of less than the respective sizes following, the same being measured from the eye to the end of the tail, that is to say:—

or to take or kill in the Upper River any salmon of less weight than four pounds, or any salmon trout or trout of less weight than one pound, and if any person does anything in contravention of this bye law he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

12. Nothing in these bye laws shall prevent any person, provided he has the previous consent of the Conservators in writing, under their common seal, from obtaining fish for purposes of artificial propagation or scientific purposes, or from having in his possession salmon roe or trout roe for any of those purposes, or from taking or attempting to take salmon or trout when spawning or near the spawning beds.

13. Nothing in these bye laws except the provisions relative to the fence season shall take away or abridge any right of the owner or occupier of a private fishery, or any person having a private right of fishing, or having authority in writing in this behalf from any such owner, occupier, or person to fish for, or to take, or attempt to take fish by means of nets, commonly called cast nets and cray fish nets, or by grig or ground weels for eels, or by night-lines, or by means of eel bucks or stages, so far as the same can be legally used, or with a special license from the Conservators in writing, under their common seal, but not otherwise, by means of a net commonly called a hoop-net, having a mesh of not less than two inches from knot to knot when wet, or eight inches all round, and not being more than six yards long, or with the like special license as aforesaid, but not otherwise, by means of a net commonly called a drag net, having a mesh of not less than two inches from knot to knot when wet, or eight inches all round.

WHEREAS by the 397th section of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," it is enacted that Her Majesty may, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time, reduce all or any of the dues for the time being payable in respect of existing or future lighthouses, buoys, or beacons for the time being under the management of the General Lighthouse Authorities (that is, the Corporation of the Trinity House of Deptford Strond (hereinafter called "The Corporation"), the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses, and the Commissioners of Irish Lights), and may also, by and with the like advice, from time to time increase or vary any of such dues, so that no dues payable in respect of any lighthouse, buoy, or beacon existing at the time when this Act comes into operation are made to exceed the amount which has at any period previous to such time been received in respect thereof, or to which the said dues might, during any part of such period as last aforesaid, lawfully have been raised:

And whereas by the 404th section of the same Act it is further enacted that each of the General Lighthouse Authorities shall have power within its jurisdiction (among other things) to alter any existing lighthouse, and to vary the character thereof, or the mode of exhibiting lights therein:

And whereas at the time "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," came into operation a lighthouse was existing on Caldy Island, within the jurisdiction of the Corporation, and is now under their management, and certain dues have been till the present time levied in respect thereof:

And whereas the Corporation have recently varied and greatly improved the character of the said lighthouse, and the mode of exhibiting the light therein:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that it is reasonable and proper that the dues hitherto levied in respect of the said light should be abolished, and that the dues hereinafter specified should in lieu thereof be levied on all vessels deriving benefit from the said light.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said recited Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that from and after the day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty nine, the dues hitherto levied in respect of the said lighthouse on Caldy Island shall cease to be levied, and that in lieu thereof there shall be paid in respect of the said lighthouse, the following tolls namely:—

- (1.) For every vessel, whether British or foreign, which shall cross either an imaginary line drawn from St. Gowan's Head, to the northernmost point of Lundy Island, or an imaginary line drawn from Worm's Head, to the northernmost point of Lundy Island, the toll of three-sixteenths of a penny per ton of the burden of every such vessel for each time of passing or deriving benefit from the said light if on an oversea voyage, and the toll of one-sixteenth of a penny per ton of the burden of every such vessel for each time of passing or deriving benefit therefrom if on a coasting voyage; provided that any vessels crossing both the said imaginary lines on one and the same voyage shall be chargeable only with one toll:

(2.) For every vessel, whether British or foreign, when proceeding coastwise from any one port in Carmarthen Bay to any other port in the same Bay, the toll of one-sixteenth of a penny per ton of the burden of every such vessel, for each time of passing or deriving benefit from the said Light.

The said tolls shall be levied by the Corporation of the Trinity House of Deptford Stroud, subject to the regulations and exemptions contained in the New Consolidated Table of Light Dues, sanctioned by an Order in Council, dated the First day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and to the gross abatement or discount of fifty per cent. mentioned in an Order in Council, dated the twenty-ninth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight.

WHEREAS by "The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1855," it was enacted that in any case in which any lighthouse, buoy, or beacon had been, or should be thereafter, erected or placed on or near the coasts of any British possession, by or with the consent of the Legislative Authority of such possession, Her Majesty might, by Order in Council, fix such dues in respect thereof to be paid by the owner or master of every ship which passes the same, or derives benefit therefrom, as Her Majesty might deem reasonable, and might in like manner, from time to time, increase, diminish, or repeal such dues, and that from the time specified in such Order for the commencement of the dues thereby fixed, increased, or diminished, the same should be leviable throughout Her Majesty's dominions in manner thereafter mentioned:

And whereas a light vessel was, by and with the consent of the Legislative Authority of the colony of Ceylon, placed on the Little Basses Rock, in the said colony, and a light exhibited therein:

And whereas by Order in Council, dated the eighteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, Her Majesty was pleased to direct that the dues to be paid in respect of ships passing and deriving benefit from the said light vessel, as in the said Order in Council appearing, should be one penny per ton of the burden of every such ship:

And whereas it is proposed to construct a lighthouse on the Great Basses Rock, near the Little Basses Rock, in the said colony of Ceylon, and preparations are now being made to construct such lighthouse, and a temporary light is to be exhibited there by the end of March one thousand eight hundred and seventy:

And whereas the consent of the Legislative Authority of Ceylon has been given to such erection and exhibition:

And whereas by "The Basses Lights Act, 1869," the Public Works Loan Commissioners are required, for the purpose of constructing the said lighthouse, to advance out of the moneys at their disposal which are available for advances under "The Harbours and Passing Tolls &c. Act, 1861," a sum or sums not exceeding in the whole seventy thousand pounds, and the Commissioners

of Her Majesty's Treasury are authorized to guarantee jointly with the Secretary of State for India, the principal and interest of the said advances:

And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury shall not give the said guarantee until the dues to be paid in respect of the Great Basses Lighthouse and Little Basses Lightship have been fixed by Order in Council at such rate as they may think sufficient:

And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that so long as any money is due to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury in respect of the sums advanced for the Little Basses Lightship the said dues shall not be altered without the consent of those Commissioners:

And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that the dues levied under the authority of the principal Acts in respect of the lighthouse on the Great Basses Rock, and in respect of the lightship near the Little Basses Rock, after deducting any expenses incurred in collecting the same, shall form one fund, which shall be applied for the purpose of paying the expenses incurred in erecting and maintaining such lighthouse and lightship, and for no other purpose whatever:

And whereas the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury consider that a due at the rate of one penny half-penny per ton to be paid by all ships passing and deriving benefit from the Great Basses Lighthouse and the Little Basses Lightship will be sufficient.

And whereas certain money is due to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury in respect of the sums advanced for the Little Basses Lightship, and those Commissioners consent to the alteration of the said dues in manner herein appearing:

And whereas it is expedient that from the time at which a temporary light is exhibited at the Great Basses Rock, the due now leviable in respect of the Little Basses Lightship, under the Order in Council of the eighteenth of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, should cease, and that one due at the rate of one penny half-penny a ton should be levied in respect of both the said Little Basses Lightship and the Great Basses Lighthouse:

And whereas the several classes of ships following; that is to say:

Every ship which in the same voyage by the southward of Ceylon shall cross a line drawn from the southernmost point of Ceylon to the north-westernmost point of the Island of Sumatra, and also a line from the southernmost point of Ceylon, to Cape Gardafui, on the eastern coast of Africa, and *vice versa*:

Every ship which, in any voyage to or from any place in the Maldivé Islands, shall cross a line drawn from the southernmost point of Ceylon to the north-westernmost point of Sumatra:

Every ship which in any voyage from any port on the eastern coast of Africa, south of Cape Gardafui, or from any port in Madagascar, Bourbon, Mauritius, or any island adjacent to the same, including the Seychelles and the Chagos Islands, or in any voyage in which such ship shall have rounded the Cape of Good Hope eastward, shall cross a line drawn from the southernmost point of Ceylon to the southernmost point of the coast of Tenasserim, and shall, between the first day of April and the thirtieth day of September, both included, arrive at any port situate north of such line:

Every ship which, having departed between the first day of October and the thirty-first day of

March, both included, from any port situate to the northward of such light, and also to the westward of the ninetyeth meridian of longitude east from Greenwich, in any voyage to any port on the eastern coast of Africa south of Cape Gardafui, or to any port in Madagascar, Bourbon, Mauritius, or any island adjacent thereto, including the Seychelles and the Chagos Islands, or in any voyage in which such ship shall round the Cape of Good Hope westward, shall cross the latitude of the said light on the eastward side of the said light, will pass the said lightship at the Little Basses Rock and the said light at the Great Basses Rock, and will derive benefit therefrom:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Acts, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that from and after the exhibition of the said temporary light, the dues leviable in respect of the said light vessel upon the Little Basses Rock, under the said Order in Council of the 18th May, 1865, shall cease; and that from and after such exhibition the dues in respect of the Great Basses Lighthouse and the Little Basses Lightship, to be paid for every such ship as aforesaid, shall be one penny half-penny per ton of the burden of every such ship, for every such voyage as aforesaid.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in such churchyard be postponed as follows; viz. :—

In *Prittlewell Churchyard* to the thirty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy.
