March, both included, from any port situate to the northward of such light, and also to the westward of the ninetieth meridian of longitude east from Greenwich, in any voyage to any port on the eastern coast of Africa south of Cape Gardafui, or to any port in Madagascar, Bourbon, Mauritius, or any island adjacent thereto, including the Seychelles and the Chagos Islands, or in any voyage in which such ship shall round the Cape of Good Hope westward, shall cross the latitude of the said light on the eastward side of the said light, will pass the said lightship at the Little Basses Rock and the said light at the Great Basses Rock, and will derive benefit therefrom:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Acts, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that from and after the exhibition of the said temporary light, the dues leviable in respect of the said light vessel upon the Little Basses Rock, under the said Order in Council of the 18th May, 1865, shall cease; and that from and after such exhibition the dues in respect of the Great Basses Lighthouse and the Little Basses Lightship, to be paid for every such ship as aforesaid, shall be one penny half-penny per ton of the burden of every such ship, for every such voyage as aforesaid.

And whereas by an Order in Council, bearing date the seventeenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, it was directed that burials should, with certain exemptions therein specified, be discontinued in the churchyard hereinafter mentioned, from the time specified in such Order; and whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the time for discontinuing burials in the said churchyard be postponed;

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in such churchyard be postponed as follows; viz.:—

In Prittlewell Churchyard to the thirty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

HEREAS the Right Honourable Henry Austin Bruce, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned, ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representations, has, under the provisions of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws con-"cerning the burial of the dead in England "beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to " amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead "in the Metropolis," made representations stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued in them, with the following modifications, viz.:-

COLEY, HALIFAX. — Forthwith wholly in the church of Coley, in the parish of Halifax; and also in the churchyard, except in now existing vaults and walled graves, in which each coffin shall be embedded in charcoal, and separately enclosed by brickwork or stonework properly cemented, and except in family earthen graves which can be opened without the exposure of coffins, or the disturbance of remains.

BATLEY, YORKSHIRE.—Forthwith wholly in the burial-ground of the Wesleyan Chapel at Staincliffe, in the parish of Batley, Yorkshire, except in vaults or walled graves completed before the first of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, in which each coffin shall be embedded in charcoal, and separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

STAINTON, YORKSHIRE.—Forthwith wholly in the church of Thornaby, in the parish of Stainton, Yorkshire; and also in the churchyard, after the first of December next, except for the burial of the widowers and widows of those already buried therein.

STOKESLEY, YORKSHIRE.—Forthwith wholly in the church of the parish of Stokesley, Yorkshire; and also in the churchyard, except in vaults and walled graves completed before the first of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, in which each coffin shall be embedded in charcoal, and separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

ALVERSTOKE, HANTS.—In the Old Burial-ground at the Haslar Hospital, Gosport.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representations, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the twenty-third day of December next:

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representations one month before the said twenty-third day of December.
