WHEREAS the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council have, by a licence, bearing even date herewith, sanctioned the holding of an Exhibition and Sale of Cattle at the Agricultural Hall, in the parish of Islington, in the county of Middlesex, on the sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, and tenth days of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine:

Now, therefore, the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding anything in The Metropolitan Contagious Diseases (Animals) Order of August, 1869, or in any other Order of the Privy Council, cattle which have been exhibited at the Exhibition may be moved alive out of the Metropolis, with the licence of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, which licence such Commissioner is hereby empowered to grant, and, if he thinks fit, to revoke.

2. Such licence shall only be granted upon the production of a Certificate of Health, signed by one of the Veterinary Surgeons of the Exhibition,

certifying that such cattle do not exhibit any indication of infectious or contagious disease; and also of a Certificate, subjoined to the Certificate of Health, and signed by the person appointed as

The cattle shall be conveyed, without stopping, from the Exhibition out of the Metropolis in properly constructed cattle-vans, or, if they are moved out of the Metropolis by railway, then they shall be conveyed in such cattle-vans, without stopping, to the railway-station, and there be transferred from such vans directly to the railway-truck.

4. If any such cattle, while in the Metropolis, come, accidentally or otherwise, in contact with any cattle other than cattle which have been exhibited at the Exhibition, they shall not be moved out of the Metropolis, but shall be slaughtered within its limits.

5. All cattle which are exhibited at the Exhibition, and are not moved out of the Metropolis

under this Order, shall be slaughtered on or before the twenty-third day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the 397th section of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," it is enacted that Her Majesty may, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time, reduce all or any of the dues for the time being payable in respect of existing or future light-houses, buoys, or beacons for the time being under the management of the General Lighthouse Authorities (that is, the Corporation of the Trinity House of Deptford Strond (hereinafter called "The Corporation"), the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses, and the Commissioners of Irish Lights), and may also, by and with the like advice, from time to time increase or vary any of such dues, so that no dues payable in respect of any lighthouse, buoy, or beacon existing at the time when this Act comes into operation are made to exceed the amount which has at any period previous to such time been received in respect thereof, or to which the said dues might, during any part of such period as last aforesaid, lawfully have been raised :

And whereas by the 404th section of the same Act it is further enacted that each of the General Lighthouse Authorities shall have power within its jurisdiction (among other things) to alter any existing lighthouse, and to vary the character thereof, or the mode of exhibiting lights therein :

And whereas at the time "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," came into operation a lighthouse was existing on *Caldy Island*, within the jurisdiction of the Corporation, and is now under their management, and certain dues have been till the present time levied in respect thereof :

And whereas the Corporation have recently varied and greatly improved the character of the said lighthouse, and the mode of exhibiting the light therein :

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that it is reasonable and proper that the dues hitherto levied in respect of the said light should be abolished, and that the dues hereinafter specified should in lieu thereof be levied on all vessels deriving benefit from the said light.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said recited Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that from and after the eleventh day of *November*, one thousand eight hundred and sixty nine, the dues hitherto levied in respect of the said lighthouse on *Caldy Island* shall cease to be levied, and that in lieu thereof there shall be paid in respect of the said lighthouse, the following tolls namely :—

- (1.) For every vessel, whether British or foreign, which shall cross either an imaginary line drawn from *St. Gowan's Head*, to the northernmost point of *Lundy Island*, or an imaginary line drawn from *Worm's Head*, to the northernmost point of *Lundy Island*, the toll of three-sixteenths of a penny per ton of the burden of every such vessel for each time of passing or deriving benefit from the said light if on an oversea voyage, and the toll of one-sixteenth of a penny per ton of the burden of every such vessel for each time

of passing or deriving benefit therefrom if on a coasting voyage ; provided that any vessels crossing both the said imaginary lines on one and the same voyage shall be chargeable only with one toll :

- (2.) For every vessel, whether British or foreign, when proceeding coastwise from any one port in *Carmarthen Bay* to any other port in the same Bay, the toll of one-sixteenth of a penny per ton of the burden of every such vessel, for each time of passing or deriving benefit from the said Light.

The said tolls shall be levied by the Corporation of the Trinity House of Deptford Strond, subject to the regulations and exemptions contained in the New Consolidated Table of Light Dues, sanctioned by an Order in Council, dated the First day of *November*, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and to the gross abatement or discount of fifty per cent. mentioned in an Order in Council, dated the twenty-ninth day of *February*, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight.

(Purchase by them of Hyde, Werneth, and Newton Waterworks; Construction of New Works; Supply of Water to Hyde, Werneth, Newton, and Godley; Levying of Rates; Borrowing of Money; Powers as to Manchester Corporation Waterworks; Repeal and Amendment of Acts).

effect the following, or some of the following, among other objects:—

1. To vest in the Local Board for the district of Hyde, in the county palatine of Chester (herein called "The Local Board"), or to authorise, or provide for, the vesting in them (upon such terms and conditions, and as from such periods as have been, or may be, agreed upon, or as may be fixed by, or under the provisions of the Bill) of the waterworks belonging to Thomas Mottram, of Hyde, in the county palatine of Chester, Gentleman, and whereby Hyde, Werneth, Newton, and Godley, all in the said county palatine of Chester, are now supplied, or partially supplied, with water, and of all or some of the lands, works, mains, pipes, property, real or personal, and effects, powers, estate, rights and privileges, duties and liabilities of the said Thomas Mottram in respect of his said waterworks, and to confirm any agreement already made, or which may be hereafter made, between the Local Board and the said Thomas Mottram, touching the transfer of the waterworks to the Local Board.
