WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent for the time being of the vicarage of Howden, in the county of York, and in the diocese of York, one yearly sum or stipend of one hundred and twenty pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the twenty-sixth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that the annual sum or stipend so granted by us to the Incumbent of the said vicarage of Howden, shall be paid only upon the production to us on or after the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year, of a certificate under the hand of the Archbishop of the said diocese of York, that an Assistant Curate, duly licensed by such Archbishop, has been employed within the parish of Howden aforesaid, during the half year then ended, and is in receipt of a salary after a rate of not less than one hundred and twenty pounds per annum: Provided also, that such yearly sum or stipend shall continue payable as aforesaid so long only as may to us appear to be expedient under the circumstances from time to time affecting the said vicarage of Howden.
