And whereas it hath been represented that it would be to the advantage of the public if certain alterations were made in some of the districts of the Courts, as specified or set forth in the aforesaid order:

Her Majesty, having taking the premises into consideration, is thereupon pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine:

So much of the district of the Middlesex County Court, holden at Edmonton, as is included within a line drawn from the point where the eastern boundary of the county of Middlesex joins the boundary of the county of Hertford, thence westward along the northern boundary of the said county of Middlesex, until it crosses the New River, thence southward along the middle of the said river to Carterhatch-lane, thence eastward along the middle of Carterhatch-lane until it reaches the turnpike-road leading from Edmonton to Waltham Cross, thence southward along the said road to Green-street, thence along the middle of the road in Green-street to the Great Eastern Railway and across such railway to Millmarsh or Wildmarsh-lane, thence eastward along such lane to the River Lee Navigation, thence across the River Lee Navigation to Green-lane, thence eastward along the middle of such lane to the eastern boundary of the county of Middlesex, and thence northward along the said boundary to the point first described, shall be within and form part of the County Court of Essex, holden at Waltham.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Penkridge, of the parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Peter, Wolverhampton (consisting chiefly of the township of Hatherton), in the county and diocese aforesaid, and of the parish of Brewood, in the same county and diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a dis-

tance from the several churches of such respective parishes or parochial chapelries aforesaid.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Penkridge, of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Peter, Wolverhampton, and of the said parish of Brewood, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church called Christ Church, situate at Gailey as aforesaid.

And whereas the Reverend James Alexander Fell, the vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Penkridge is entitled as such vicar or incumbent to nominate a minister to serve the said church called Christ Church, situate at Gailey as aforesaid.

Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George Augustus, bishop of the said diocese of Lichfield, as such bishop, and also as the patron in right of his see both of the rectory of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Peter, Wolverhampton, and of the vicarage of the said parish of Brewood, and with the consent of the Right Honourable Edward Richard, Baron Hatherton, the patron of the vicarage of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Penkridge, and with the consent of the said James Alexander Fell (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Penkridge, of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Peter, Wolverhampton, and of the said parish of Brewood, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church, called Christ Church, situate at Gailey as aforesaid, and that the same should be named "The Consolidated Chapelry of Christ Church, Gailey-cum-Hatherton," and that the right of presentation and appointment to the church of such consolidated chapelry should belong to and be exercised by the said Edward Richard Baron Hatherton, and his heirs, and assigns for ever.

We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto, as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Christ Church, Gailey-cum-Hatherton, being:—

"All those several contiguous portions of the parish, or parochial chapelry, of Penkridge, of the parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Peter, Wolverhampton, and of the parish of Brewood, all in the county of Stafford, and in the diocese of Lichfield, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line, commencing upon the boundary, which divides the said parish or parochial chapelry of Penkridge from the parish or parochial chapelry of Cannock, in the said county and diocese, at the point in the centre of the bridge which carries the road leading from Hatherton to Teddesley over the stream or feeder which flows from Pottals Pool, through Horsemoor Wood into the Gailey Reservoir, and

extending thence first westward, then south-westward, and then southward along the middle of the said stream or feeder for a distance of one mile and a quarter, or thereabouts, to a point on the southern side of Horsemoor Wood aforesaid, in the centre of the bridge in Micklewood-lane, and extending thence generally north-westward for a distance of one mile and a quarter, or thereabouts, along the middle of the last named lane to a point in the centre of Otherton-lane-bridge, which carries Micklewood-lane aforesaid over the Staffordshire and Worcestershire Canal, and extending thence southward for a distance of rather more than half a mile along the middle of the said canal to a point in the centre of the bridge which carries the private road leading from the Watling-street-road past Gailey Farm and Rodbaston Hall to the Stafford and Wolverhampton turnpike road over the same canal, and extending thence generally north-westward for a distance of one mile and a quarter, or thereabouts, along the middle of the said private road to its junction with the Stafford and Wolverhampton turnpike road aforesaid, and extending thence southward for a distance of half a mile, or thereabouts, along the middle of the said turnpike road to the point, where it is intersected by the boundary, which divides the said parish or parochial chapelry of Penkridge from that detached portion of the parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Peter, Wolverhampton aforesaid, in which the farm house called or known as Kinvaston is situate, and extending thence first generally northward along the last described boundary (thereby following the course of Meer-lane), and then generally westward along the same boundary (thereby passing to the north of the farm house called or known as Kinvaston aforesaid), to the junction of the same boundary with the boundary in the River Penk, which divides the township and chapelry of Stretton, in the said parish or parochial chapelry of Penkridge from the said detached portion of the parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Peter, Wolverhampton, and extending thence southward along the last described boundary (thereby following the course of the said River Penk), to the junction of such boundary with the boundary which divides the said township and chapelry of Stretton from that part of the parish or parochial chapelry of Penkridge aforesaid, which is called or known as Water Eaton, and extending thence south-westward along the last described boundary (thereby continuing along the course of the River Penk aforesaid) to the point in the centre of Stretton Mill Bridge, which carries the said Watling-street-road over the River Penk aforesaid, at which point the last described boundary is joined by the boundary which divides the said parish or parochial chapelry of Penkridge from the parish of Brewood aforesaid, and extending thence eastward for a distance of half a mile, or thereabouts, along the last described boundary, thereby following the course of the Watling-street-road aforesaid, to its junction with the road which leads past Claygates to Catchem's End, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last described road to its intersection, near Claygates aforesaid, with the road which leads from Engleton Hall to Crateford, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last described road to its junction with the road which leads from Somerford past Crateford aforesaid towards the Staffordshire and Worcestershire Canal aforesaid, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last described road to the boundary, at the junction of the same

road with the Stafford and Wolverhampton turnpike road aforesaid, which divides the said parish of Brewood from the new parish of Saint Paul, Coven, in the county and diocese aforesaid, and continuing thence still eastward along the last described boundary to its junction with the boundary which divides the last named new parish from the parish or parochial chapelry of Penkridge aforesaid, and extending thence first south-eastward, and then eastward, along the last described boundary, to its junction with the boundary which divides the last named parish or parochial chapelry, from the parish or parochial chapelry of Shreshill, in the county and diocese aforesaid, and extending thence generally eastward along the last described boundary, to its junction with the boundary which divides the last named parish or parochial chapelry from the township of Hatherton in the parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Peter, Wolverhampton aforesaid, and continuing thence still eastward along the last described boundary, (thereby following for the most part the course of Suredon Brook) to the junction of the same boundary with the boundary which divides the said township of Hatherton from the parish or parochial chapelry of Cannock aforesaid, and extending thence first northward, then north-eastward, and then westward, along the last described boundary, (thereby passing to the west of Wedges Mills, and crossing the turnpike road leading from Cannock to Penkridge,) to the junction of such boundary, on the western side of the road which leads from Hatherton to Huntington, with the boundary which divides the last named parish or parochial chapelry from the parish or parochial chapelry of Penkridge aforesaid, and extending thence first north-westward, and then generally northward, along the last described boundary to the first described point, in the centre of the bridge, which carries the road leading from Hatherton to Teddesley over the stream or feeder which flows from Potals Pool through Horsemoor Wood into the Gailey Reservoir as aforesaid, at which point the said imaginary line commenced.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John the Evangelist, situate at Hoyland Swaine, in the parish of Silkstone, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas, at certain extremities of the said parish of Silkstone, and of the parish or parochial chapelry of Cawthorne, in the county and diocese aforesaid, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population, which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parish and parochial chapelry or parish respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said parish of Silkstone and of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Cawthorne should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint John the Evangelist, situate at Hoyland Swaine aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Robert, Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon, as such bishop, and also as the patron in right of his see of the vicarage of the said parish of Silkstone, and with the consent of John Spencer Stanhope, of Cannon Hall, in the county of York, Esquire, the patron of the perpetual curacy of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Cawthorne (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Silkstone, and of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Cawthorne, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint John the Evangelist, situate at Hoyland Swaine as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Hoyland Swaine,' and that the right of presentation and appointment to the church of the said consolidated chapelry should belong to and be exercised by the said John Spencer Stanhope, his heirs and assigns for ever.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Hoyland Swaine, being:—

"All that portion of the parish of Silkstone, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon,

which is comprised within, and is co-extensive with, the limits of the township of Hoyland Swaine, and also all that contiguous portion of the parish, or parochial chapelry, of Cawthorne, in the same county and diocese, which is bounded on the south by the said township of Hoyland Swaine, on the north-west for the most part by the new parish of Denby, in the county and diocese aforesaid, and on all other sides, that is to say, on the remaining part of the north-west, and on the north-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Denby from the parish or parochial chapelry of Cawthorne aforesaid, at a point in the middle of the stream called or known as Rons Cliff Dyke, near the bridge which carries the footpath leading from Hazel House to Heald Head over the said stream, at which point the said boundary diverges to the north-west from the same stream, and extending thence north-eastward for a distance of twenty-two and a half chains, or thereabouts, along the middle of such stream to a point in the centre of the bridge which carries Heald-lane over the same stream, and extending thence in a direction generally southward for a distance of nine chains, or thereabouts, along the middle of the said lane to its junction with the footpath which leads from Heald Head aforesaid past Pashley-green to Cawthorne North-lane, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-described footpath to its junction with Cawthorne North-lane aforesaid, and extending thence south-westward for a distance of six and a half chains, or thereabouts, along the middle of the last-named lane to a point opposite to a boundary stone inscribed "H. "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of his Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Anne, situate at Duddeston, within the limits of the new parish of Saint Matthew, Duddeston-cum-Nechells, in the county of Warwick, and in the diocese of Worcester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient, that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Anne, situate at Duddeston as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Duddeston-cum-Nechells, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Anne, situate at Duddeston as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Anne, Duddeston.'

"And with the like consent of the said Henry, Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester

(testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at such church, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism, or for the registration thereof.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty's reign, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, sections three, five, and seven, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty, the following scheme relating to the endowment of the see of Lincoln.

"Whereas by the said Act it is enacted that, on the avoidance from time to time of any see after the assignment of an endowment for the same, our Estates Committee may, if they shall think fit, revise the arrangement in force in relation to such endowment, and for that purpose enquire into the state and productiveness of such endowment, and if such endowment, in the judgment of the Committee, will secure a net annual income exceeding that named for the Archbishop or Bishop as aforesaid, or will not secure the full amount of such annual income, such Committee may report thereon to us, and that we shall, if we think fit, make an arrangement by vesting part of the lands and hereditaments constituting such endowment in us, or by assigning lands and hereditaments by way of addition to such endowment, or by means of annual or other payments to or by us, as the case may require, which may secure, in the judgment of the said Committee, to the Archbishop or Bishop who may succeed upon that avoidance, the net annual income named for the archbishop or bishop of such see, by any Act of Parliament or Order in Council then in force, or as near thereto as circumstances will allow: Provided always, that if a difference of opinion as to the value or sufficiency of the estates which such committee may propose to leave or to assign to any see, shall arise between the archbishop or bishop thereof and the said committee, such difference shall be settled by arbitration before such arrangement as is last-mentioned shall be made.

"And whereas by an Order of your Majesty in Council made under the provisions of the said Act, bearing date the fourth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and duly published in the London Gazette, on the sixth day of the same month, the lands and hereditaments specified and described in the schedule to the said Order, were assigned as the endowment of the see of Lincoln, and now constitute the endowment of the said see.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Christopher, the present Bishop of Lincoln, succeeded to the said see on an avoidance thereof, which occurred on or about the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.

"And whereas our Estates Committee have upon such avoidance revised the arrangement in force in relation to the endowment thereof, and for that purpose have enquired into the state and productiveness of such endowment and have reported to us that such endowment will, in their judgment,

secure a net annual income exceeding that named for the Bishop of the said see by the hereinbefore recited Order of your Majesty in Council, being the Order now in force in relation to such income, videlicet, five thousand pounds per annum, and that the arrangement embodied in the recommendations hereinafter contained will secure, in their judgment, to the said Bishop a net annual income of five thousand pounds, or as near thereto as circumstances will allow.

"And whereas the lands and hereditaments comprised in the schedule marked A, annexed to this scheme, are part of the hereditaments assigned as the endowment of the said bishoprick of Lincoln by the hereinbefore mentioned Order of your Majesty in Council, dated the fourth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four.

"And whereas the lands and hereditaments particularly described in the schedule marked B, annexed to this scheme, are vested in us for an estate of fee simple in possession.

"And whereas no difference of opinion has arisen between the said Bishop and the said Committee, as to the fact that the estates which the said Committee propose, should be left and assigned respectively to the said see, are sufficient (after a certain expenditure shall have been made in improving the same, as is hereinafter mentioned) to produce the net average annual income of five thousand pounds and no more.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Christopher, Bishop of Lincoln, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, we humbly recommend and propose, with a view to securing to the said Bishop the said net annual income of five thousand pounds, that upon the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly published Order, the lands and hereditaments particularly described in the schedule marked A annexed to this scheme, estimated to produce the net average annual income of four hundred and fifty pounds, or thereabouts, with their appurtenances, and all the right, title, estate, and interest therein of the said Bishop of Lincoln, and his successors, shall be and become transferred to and vested in us and our successors, and that we shall be entitled to the rents, profits, and proceeds of the same from and after the sixth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

"And we also recommend and propose, with a view to the securing of such net annual income as aforesaid, that upon such publication as aforesaid of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, and without any further conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly published Order the land particularly described in the schedule marked B annexed to this scheme, estimated to produce the net average annual income of one hundred and fourteen pounds, or thereabouts, with its appurtenances, and all our right, title, and interest therein, shall be and become vested in the said Bishop of Lincoln and his successors, and that the said Bishop shall be entitled to the rents, profits, and proceeds thereof from and after the said sixth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

"And we further recommend and propose that we shall provide a sum of seven hundred and thirteen pounds to be expended to our satisfaction by the Bishop of Lincoln, in the erection of new cottages and farm buildings, or in the improvement of existing buildings, or in irrigation upon the lands which, by this scheme, are proposed and recommended to be the endowment of the said

see, such expenditure being necessary in order to render the same lands suitable for producing permanently a net average annual income of five thousand pounds as aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament.

“Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said district parish of Bilton-with-Harrogate, which is hereinafter mentioned and described (such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship), should be constituted a separate district in the manner hereinafter recommended and set forth.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intitled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England, beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," it is enacted that, in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of one of such Secretaries of State, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-ground or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground

shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require), that after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time, as circumstances may require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered; provided also that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such parish;

And whereas the Right Honourable the Earl of Clarendon, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned, ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued in them, with the modifications hereinafter specified:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by Her Order in Council of the seventh day of October last, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the twenty-second day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no new burial-ground shall be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials in the said parishes shall be discontinued (except as herein otherwise directed), as follows; viz.:—

ALL SAINTS, NORWOOD. — Forthwith wholly in the church of All Saints, Norwood, in the parish of Croydon, and also in the churchyard, except for the burial of the families of those who owned family vaults or graves on the first of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, and that before burial such ownership be established to the satisfaction of the churchwardens; also that interments be conducted according to the Regulations directed in the Order of the first of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and that twenty-four hours' notice of any intended burial be given by the Sexton to the Sanitary Inspector of Croydon.

OUTWELL. — Forthwith wholly in Outwell churchyard on the first of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, except in walled graves existing on the first of August,

one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, and except in other graves for the burial of the widowers or widows of those already buried in the churchyard.

LOUGHOR, LLANELLY.—Forthwith wholly in the church of Loughor, and also in the churchyard, except in graves not less than five feet deep, which can be opened without the exposure of coffins or the disturbance of remains.
