

southern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the house and premises called or known as Number 10, Worcester-terrace, and extending thence northward across the last named road to and along the middle of the last described wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence forming the south-western boundary of the house and premises called or known as Number 18, Walton-crescent, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last described wall or fence to a boundary stone inscribed 'O. St. B. D. C. 1869, No. 2,' and placed at the north-western end of the same wall or fence on the southern side of the street or road called or known as Walton-crescent, and extending thence north-westward and in a direct line across the last named street or road to and along the middle of the wall or fence forming the south-western boundary of the house and premises called or known as Number 17, Walton-crescent to the junction of the last described wall or fence with the wall or fence which divides the said house and premises called or known as Number 17, Walton-crescent, from the house and premises called or known as Number 1, Wellington-street, and extending thence north-eastward for a distance of six yards or thereabouts along the middle of the last described wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence, which forms the north-eastern boundary of the last-named house and premises, and extending thence north-westward for a distance of fifty yards or thereabouts along the middle of the last described wall or fence to a boundary stone inscribed 'O. St. B. D. C. 1869, No. 3,' and placed at the north-western end of the same wall or fence, in the south-eastern angle formed by the junction of Wellington-street aforesaid with the street or road, which passes between the houses called or known as Clarendon-buildings on the one side, and the house and premises called or known as the Grey Coat School on the other side, and extending thence north-westward to and along the middle of the last described street or road, and along the middle of Union-street to the junction of the last-named street with Jericho-road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named road to its junction with the street or road, which leads past the front of the houses called or known as Cranham-terrace, and extending thence north-westward for a distance of eighty-five yards or thereabouts along the middle of the last described street or road to its north-western end opposite to a boundary stone inscribed 'O. St. B. D. C. 1869, No. 4,' and placed on the south-western side of the same street or road at the north-eastern end of the wall or fence which forms the north-western boundary of the house and garden called or known as Number 1, Cranham-terrace, and extending thence south-westward for a distance of thirty-eight yards or thereabouts along the middle of the last described wall or fence to its south-western end on the boundary, which originally divided the parish of Saint Giles, Oxford, from the parish of Saint Thomas, Oxford aforesaid, and continuing thence still south-westward for a distance of one hundred and forty-three yards or thereabouts along the last mentioned original parish boundary (thereby passing along the north-western side of the buildings and premises known as Harrison's Tallow Works), to the junction in the middle of the Oxford Canal aforesaid, of the said original parish boundary with the boundary, which at present divides the said parish of Saint Thomas, Oxford, from the new parish of Saint Paul, Oxford aforesaid.

"Save and except from the above described

part of the said new parish of Saint Paul, Oxford, all that territory situate between Great Clarendon-street and the street or road called or known as Portland-place upon which the buildings and premises known, as, 'Saint Paul's Boys' School,' are placed."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Oxford.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the second day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Michael, situate within the township of Carleton, in the parish of Pontefract, in the county of York, and in the diocese of York.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Michael, situate within the township of Carleton as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of York (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Pontefract, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Michael, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Michael, Carleton.'

"And, with the like consent of the said William, Archbishop of York, (testified as aforesaid), we,
