## LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

ORDER SETTLING THE BOUNDARIES OF A DISTRICT, TO BE STYLED THE DISTRICT OF THE TOWN OF TONBRIDGE, IN THE COUNTY OF KENT, FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

WHEREAS a petition has been duly presented to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, from ratepayers resident within the town district of Tonbridge, in the county of Kent, praying me to settle and fix the boundaries of a district to be styled the "District of the town of Tonbridge," for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1858.

And whereas the said petition was duly signed, as required by the said Act, and set forth, likewise, the proposed boundaries of the district sought to be formed under its provisions; and inquiry has now been duly made by Arnold Taylor, Esquire, the Inspector appointed by me for such purpose, and he has reported to me thereon.

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, having taken the said Petition and Report into consideration, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Local Government Act, 1858, make order as follows:—

1. That from and after the date of this present Order, the boundaries hereinafter set forth and described and delineated on the plan referred to in, and accompanying, the said Inspector's Report to me, bearing date the 20th day of December, 1869, form and constitute the boundaries of the district to be called the "District of the town of Tonbridge," for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1858; and that the parts included in such boundaries so described and delineated shall, for the purposes of such Act, be deemed to be a place having a known and defined boundary, and may adopt the said Act accordingly.

The aforesaid boundary commences at the point A on the map accompanying the Inspector's report and on the easterly side of the turnpike road leading from Tonbridge to Shipbourne; thence it passes in a southerly direction, along and including such turnpike road, to the point B; thence in an easterly direction, along and including the cart road and shooting road in the plantation numbered 969 on the Ordnance map of Tonbridge, and southerly along the occupation road leading to Cage Farm to the point C; thence south-easterly, around and including the homestead and premises of Cage Farm, and along and including the approach road to Cage Farm, from the Hadlow turnpike road to the point D, on the boundary line separating the parishes of Tonbridge and Hadlow; thence easterly and southerly, following such parish boundary, to the point E; thence in a southerly direction, along and including the back mill stream and mill pool to the point F, on the easterly side of a private road known as the Postern-road; thence southerly, along and including such road, to the point G, at Cannon Bridge; thence north-easterly, along and including the towing path on the north side of the River Medway, to the point H, at Child's Lock; thence crossing the river, and including the lock, and southerly along and including the stream to and including the cottage and garden at Postern Bridge, numbered 168A on the Ordnance map of Tonbridge, to the point I, on the south side of the Postern-road; thence south-westerly, along and including the watercourse numbered 159 on such Ordnance map, to the point K; thence, easterly and southerly, including the properties numbered

157, 163, and 165 on such Ordnance map, to the point L, on the north side of the South Eastern Railway; thence, crossing such railway in a southerly direction, and along and including Lodge Oak-lane, and the cottage and garden numbered 362A on such Ordnance map, to the point M, on the south side of Tudely Lane; thence, westerly, along and including such lane, to the point N; thence, southerly, along and including the Hastings Turnpike-road, to the point O; thence, crossing such road, westerly, and along the southerly and westerly boundary of the property known as High Bank, to the point P; thence, westerly, and southerly, along the northerly boundary of the property numbered 382, and the easterly and southerly boundary fences of the properties numbered 407 and 406 on the Ordnance map of Tonbridge, to the point Q, at the footway leading across No. 406; thence, along and including such footway, to the point R; thence, along the northerly boundary fence of the property numbered 398, and the westerly boundary fence of such last-named property, and that numbered 422 on such Ordnance map, to the point S, at the boundary of the Southborough Special Drainage District; thence, westerly, along such boundary line, to the west side of the Turnpike-road leading to Tonbridge Wells, and northerly, along and including such last-named road, to the point T; thence, along the boundary fence dividing the property numbered 272 from the properties numbered 293 and 271 on such Ordnance map, and along the northerly boundary fence of such last-named property to the point U; thence in a north-westerly direction to the point V, on the south side of Brook-street-lane, and opposite the fence dividing the properties numbered 131 and 132 on such Ordnance map; thence south-westerly along and including the road leading to Bidborough to the point W; thence along the southerly and westerly boundary fence of the property numbered 244 on such Ordnance map, to the point X; thence westerly along an imaginary line which is taken to be throughout its length at a distance of one hundred yards south of the centre of the Haysden or Brook-street-road to the point Y; thence westerly along the northerly and westerly boundary fences of No. 120, and the southerly boundary fence of No. 116 on such Ordnance map, to the point Z, on the westerly side of the occupation road leading to Manor Farm; thence northerly along and including such last-named road, and the properties numbered 111, 110, and 109 on such Ordnance map, to the point A1, on the south side of the road leading to Bidborough; thence crossing such road, and including it and the occupation road numbered 107 on such Ordnance map, to the point B1, on the south side of such road; thence to the south side of the River Medway, and along but excluding such river to the point C1; thence southerly along the easterly boundary fence of the property numbered 117 on such Ordnance map, to the point D1, on the north side of Haysden or Brook-street-road; thence easterly along and including such last-named road, to the point E1, which is taken to be opposite point V; thence northerly along the westerly boundary fences of the properties numbered 132, 134, 136, 89, 68, 39, and 26 on such Ordnance Map, to the River Medway, and crossing such river to the point F1, on the north side thereof; thence easterly along and including the old course of such river, to the point G1; thence northerly along a water-course, forming the westerly boundary of the properties numbered 1183, 1136, and 1137 on such Ordnance Map, to the point H1,



at a footpath leading to Leigh; thence westerly along and including such footpath, to the point I 1; thence northerly along the westerly boundaries of the property numbered 910, and the westerly side of the roads numbered 883 and 854 on such Ordnance Map, to the point K 1; thence easterly and northerly along the south boundary of 855 and the easterly boundaries of the properties numbered 856 and 852 on such Ordnance Map, to the point L 1; thence easterly and southerly along the northerly and easterly boundaries of the property numbered 976 and the northerly boundaries of the properties numbered 1016, 1020, and 1021 on such Ordnance Map, to the point M 1, at the Hilden Brook; thence northerly along and including such brook, to the point N 1; thence northerly along the westerly boundary of the property numbered 984 and the westerly and northerly boundaries of the property numbered 948 on such Ordnance Map, to the point O 1; thence easterly, crossing an occupation road, and around and including the property numbered 949 on such Ordnance Map, and around and including the farm house and homestead of Little French Farm, to the starting point at A, so completing the boundary of the proposed district of Tonbridge.

2. That Mr. Joseph Snelling, Bookseller, Tonbridge, be Summoning Officer, and take forthwith all such steps as may be necessary under the herebefore recited Local Government Act, for convening a meeting of the ratepayers of the said Town District of Tonbridge, to decide as to the adoption of the Local Government Act, 1858, within the boundaries of such district, as fixed and settled by this present Order.

### SANITARY ACT, 1866.

ORDER SETTLING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE SPECIAL DRAINAGE DISTRICT OF STROUD END, IN THE PARISH OF PAINSWICK, IN THE COUNTY OF GLOUCESTER.

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Sanitary Act, 1866, a Special Drainage District, consisting of a portion of the parish of Painswick, in the county of Gloucester, has been formed by the Vestry, as the Sewer Authority of the said parish.

And whereas under the said Act, a memorial from ratepayers of the said parish of Painswick, has been duly presented to me as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, praying me to annul the formation of the said Special Drainage District, or to modify the boundaries thereof as to me might seem fit.

And whereas, after inquiry into the subject matter of the aforesaid Memorial, held by Robert Morgan, Esq., the Inspector appointed by me for the purpose and report thereon made by him, and after full consideration of the said Memorial and Report: I do hereby under the powers conferred on me by the Sanitary Act, 1866, direct, that from and after the date of this present Order the Special Drainage District of Stroud End, in the said parish of Painswick, shall comprise the area included within the boundary line on the plan and description accompanying the Inspector's Report as follows:—

The boundaries commence at the point A, on the plan accompanying the Inspector's Report, on

the boundary between the parishes of Painswick and Stroud, at about two hundred feet eastward of Wades Mill; thence westward, along the said parish boundary, to its junction with the boundary between the parishes of Painswick and Rodborough; thence westward, along the last-named boundary, to its junction between the parishes of Painswick and Stroud; thence northward, along the last-named boundary to B; thence eastward, along the north side of field numbered 1540 on the tithe map of the parish of Painswick, crossing the road from Gloucester, crossing field numbered 1473, crossing the old road from Painswick, and along the north side of field numbered 1538, to C, at the north-east corner of such field; thence southward along the east side of the said field, to D; thence along the north side of field numbered 1526, and enclosure numbered 1528, to E; thence north-eastward, across field numbered 1536, and along the north side of field numbered 1532; thence across fields numbered 1532 and 1533 (now one field) to F; thence north-eastward, across fields numbered 1482 and 1482, at a distance of 300 feet from the north side of Polly-lane, to G; thence along the north-east side of field numbered 1482 to Polly-lane; thence crossing the said lane, and along the north-east side of field numbered 1485; thence along the north side of fields numbered 1486, 1487, 1400 and 1402, to H; thence along the east-side of field numbered 1402 to I; thence along the north side of fields numbered 1390 and 1389, and the west side of fields numbered 1385, 1387, and 1386, to K; thence south-eastward, to the road between Stroud and Birdlip; thence along the east side of field numbered 1384, and crossing Wade's Mill Dam, to the starting point at A, thus completing the boundaries.
