DECLARATION regulating certain points connected with the execution of the Convention concluded at Paris, November 8, 1864, relative to Drawbacks on Sugar.

[Signed at Paris, December 27, 1869.]

Déclaration.

LES Gouvernements de la Grande Bretagne, de Belgique, de France, et des Pays-Bas, désirant régler, d'un commun accord, diverses questions se rattachant à l'exécution de la Convention du 8 Novembre, 1864, sur le régime des sucres, les Soussignés, dûment autorisés à cet effet, et après avoir pris connaissance du Protocole final signé le 5 Octobre de la présente année, par les Commissaires des quatre Gouvernements réunis en Conférence à La Haye, sont convenus des dispositions suivantes :—

ARTICLE I.

Le délai accordé au Gouvernement Français par la Déclaration du 4 Novembre, 1868, pour établir une corrélation exacte entre les droits à percevoir sur les sucres bruts et les rendements fixés par la Déclaration du 20 Novembre, 1866, est prolongé jusqu'au 30 Juin, 1871.

ARTICLE II.

Provisoirement, le droit à l'importation en France des sucres raffinés provenant des autres Etats Contractants demeure fixé à quarante-huit francs quatre-vingts centimes (48f. 85c.)

ARTICLE III.

La limite d'exportation des vergeoises provenant des sucres admis sous le régime de l'importation temporaire, fixée par le second alinéa de l'Article X de la Convention du 8 Novembre, 1864, est reportée du type No. 10 au type No. 7.

ARTICLE IV.

Chacun des Gouvernements Contractants aura la faculté de subdiviser les classes de sucre brut mentionnées à l'Article I de la Convention du 8 Novembre, 1864, et de créer des sous-types correspondant à ces subdivisions, sans pouvoir, toutefois, modifier la limite de l'une des classes actuelles, ni abaisser le rendement moyen des diverses qualités de sucre que ces classes comprennent.

ARTICLE V.

Le présent arrangement sera exécutoire à partir du 1er Janvier, 1870.

En foi de quoi les Soussignés ont dressé la présente Déclaration, qu'ils ont revêtue du cachet de leurs armes.

Declaration.

THE Governments of Great Britain, Belgium, France, and the Netherlands, being desirous to regulate, by common agreement, certain questions connected with the execution of the Convention of the 8th of November, 1864, relating to the sugar system, the undersigned, duly authorized to that effect, and after having taken cognizance of the final Protocol signed on the 5th of October of the present year, by the Commissioners of the four Governments assembled in Conference at the Hague, have agreed upon the following arrangements :—

ARTICLE I.

The period granted to the French Government by the Declaration of the 4th of November, 1868, for establishing an exact correlation between the duties to be levied on raw sugars and the yields fixed by the Declaration of the 20th of November, 1866, is extended to the 30th of June, 1871.

ARTICLE II.

Provisionally, the duty on the importation into France of refined sugars coming from the other Contracting States remains fixed at forty-eight francs eighty-five centimes (48f. 85c.)

ARTICLE III.

The limit of exportation of pieces produced from sugars admitted under the system of temporary importation, which was fixed by the second paragraph of Article X of the Convention of the 8th November, 1864, is lowered from Standard No. 10 to Standard No. 7.

ARTICLE IV.

Each of the Contracting Governments shall be at liberty to subdivide the classes of raw sugar

mentioned in Article I of the Convention of the 8th of November, 1864, and to create sub-standards corresponding to such subdivisions, without, however, having the power to modify the limit of any one of the actual classes, nor to lower the average yield of the different qualities of sugar comprised in those classes.

ARTICLE V.

The present arrangement shall come into execution from and after the 1st of January, 1870.

In witness whereof the undersigned have drawn up the present Declaration, and have affixed to it the seal of their arms.

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the part of the Port of Glasgow, in the county of Lanark, within which foreign cattle may be landed for slaughter, as follows:—

All that space in the city of Glasgow lying within a line commencing on the south bank of the River Clyde, at a point at the south-west corner of Glasgow Bridge, thence westward along the said bank of the said river to the western side of the Ferry steps near the northern end of the street or road called West-street;

thence in a southerly direction for a distance of forty-three yards to the north-western corner of the Clyde-View-buildings; thence in an easterly direction along the southern side of the street or road called Clyde-place to the western side of the street or road called Dale-street; thence in a southerly direction along the west side of the said street to the south side of the street or road called Cook-street; thence in an easterly direction along the south side of the said street to the west side of the street or road called Eglinton-street; thence in a southerly direction along the west side of the said street to the north side of the street or road called Victoria-street; thence in a westerly direction along the north side of the said street to a point opposite the western boundary of the South Side Slaughter-houses; thence in a southerly direction to the north-west corner of the said Slaughter-houses; thence along the western side of the said Slaughter-houses to the south-west corner thereof; thence along the southern side of the said Slaughter-houses to the south-east corner thereof; thence along the eastern side of the said Slaughter-houses to the north-east corner thereof; thence in an easterly direction along the south side of Victoria-street to a point where the said line intersects the eastern boundary of Eglinton-street; thence northward along the east side of Eglinton-street to a point on the said line which is intersected by the continuation of the north side of Cook-street; thence in a westerly direction and along the north side of Cook-street till it meets the eastern side of Dale-street; thence northward along the east side of Dale-street to the south side of Clyde-place; thence eastward along the said side of Clyde-place to the west side of Bridge-street; thence northward to the said south-west corner of Glasgow-bridge aforesaid, all which space is coloured pink on the plan of part of the city of Glasgow, deposited at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the city of Glasgow.
