THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Circular issued by the Italian Government on the 20th November last, which requires all vessels leaving the Ports of the United Kingdom for Italy, to provide themselves with a bill of health from the Italian Consular Authorities.

In accordance with this Decree all vessels arriving in Italian Ports from the United Kingdom without a Consular Bill of Health, render themselves liable to the penalties imposed by the Ministerial Decree of the 29th April, 1867; the suspension of pratique being limited, however, to 24 hours in the case of vessels provided with any other bill of health.

(No. 7.)—SOUTH ATLANTIC OCEAN.

Ice Bergs.

LARGE numbers of Ice bergs and detached masses of ice having been fallen in with in the months of September and November, 1869, by vessels homeward bound round Cape Horn;—extending in the 42nd meridian of West longitude as far north as the parallel of $42\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ South latitude: it is recommended that vessels taking this route should sight, or pass a moderate distance eastward of the Falkland islands, and should not steer eastward of a N.E. by N. course (true) until northward of the parallel of 40° .

By a reference to the Admiralty Ice chart of the Southern Hemisphere (No. 1241) it will be seen that Ice bergs and drift ice have been met with in the months of March and April between the meridians of 20° and 25° West as far north as 40° , and as it appears that exceptionally large quantities of ice are now adrift in the South Atlantic, vessels bound eastward round the Cape of Good Hope are cautioned accordingly.

(No. 8.)—UNITED STATES—LAKE MICHIGAN.

Fixed Light at Mainstee Harbour.

THE United States Government has given notice, that, from the opening of the navigation in

the spring, a light will be exhibited from a light-house recently erected on the north side of the north pier of Mainstee harbour, Lake Michigan.

The light will be a *fixed* white light, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 12 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fifth order.

The tower is 45 feet high, painted white, and attached to the keeper's dwelling; it is 19 yards from the channel side of the pier, and 287 yards from the middle point of the entrance.

Information has been received, that there is now only 11 feet water on the bar of Richibucto river, which is gradually filling up. The beacons which were the leading marks over the bar, and the North beacon have been removed.

The buoys in the river are *red* on the star-board, and *black* on the port hand, going in.
