## “METROPOLITAN PUBLIC CARRIAGE ACT, 1869.”

ORDER made in pursuance of “The Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869,” 32 & 33 Vict. cap. 115, by the Right Honourable Henry Austin Bruce, one of Her Majesty’s Principal Secretaries of State.

February 1, 1870.

In pursuance of the Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869, I order as follows :

1. In this Order the terms Hackney Carriage and Stage Carriage are used as respectively defined in the Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869 ; and the term Public Carriage includes both a Hackney Carriage and a Stage Carriage.

### *Regulations as to Licensing Hackney and Stage Carriages.*

2. Hackney Carriage Licences to be granted under the said Act, shall be in the Form contained in Schedule A to this Order, and Stage Carriage Licences to be granted under the said Act shall be in the Form contained in Schedule B hereto.

3. Hackney Carriage Licences and Stage Carriage Licences shall be granted by the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis ; but a Licence shall not be granted to any person under the age of 21 years, or to any person who shall have been previously convicted of felony ; and the said Commissioner shall be at liberty to refuse a Licence to any person who has been convicted of a misdemeanor, or who, having previously held a Licence for a Hackney or Stage Carriage, has had such former Licence revoked or suspended.

4. The application for a Hackney Carriage Licence shall specify, among other particulars, the sums which the applicant desires to have inserted in the Licence as the rates at which the Hackney Carriage, to which the Licence if granted will relate, shall ply for Hire by Distance and by Time respectively. Such Application shall be made in the Form contained in Schedule C hereto.

The application for a Stage Carriage Licence shall be made in the Form contained in Schedule D hereto.

The person applying for a Hackney Carriage Licence or a Stage Carriage Licence, shall pay for such Licence to the Receiver of the Metropolitan Police, or to some person appointed by the said Receiver, the sum of £2.

5. The application for a Licence on behalf of any Co-partnership or Company shall be made by and such Licence shall be issued to the senior partner, or to the Secretary or Manager of the Company, as the case may be ; and the person to whom the Licence shall be so issued shall be responsible for the observance of the conditions under which the Licence is granted, and shall be liable to all penalties for breaches of such conditions as if he were the person solely interested in the Licence.

6. Before the Licence is issued, the Public Carriage shall be brought to the Police Station of the District, and examined by the Inspector of Public Carriages. The said Inspector if he shall find the same to be fit for public use, shall cause a metal plate, bearing the number which is to distinguish such Public Carriage, to be fixed thereto in his presence, and shall sign a Certificate stating that such Public Carriage has been examined by him and found fit for public use, and specifying the number of persons which the said Public Carriage should be licensed to carry, and the number of the plate which has been affixed thereto. Such plate shall be fixed in the case of a four-wheeled Hackney Carriage on the back panel thereof ; in the case of a Hanson Carriage, on the off-side panel ; and in the case of a Metropolitan Stage Carriage, on the back thereof.

7. Such plate shall be the distinguishing mark of the Public Carriage to which it has been fixed, and shall not be removed therefrom without the authority of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis.

8. A Licence will afterwards be prepared and sent to the Proprietor

9. A Licence for a Hackney or Stage Carriage, granted in pursuance of the said Act, shall continue in force for one year from the date of such Licence, unless suspended or revoked ; and such Licence shall be subject to revocation or suspension for any period by the said Commissioner in any of the events in which any Hackney or Stage Carriage Licence might have been suspended or revoked at the time of the passing of the said Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869 ; and shall also be subject to revocation and suspension by the said Commissioner in the event of the Proprietor committing a breach of the said Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869, or of this Order, or being convicted of felony or a misdemeanor.

10. The Proprietor of a Public Carriage, who shall during the currency of the Licence change his Address, shall, within seven days from such change, bring his Licence to the Office of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, and the said Commissioner shall thereupon endorse the Licence with a new Address, and erase the former Address therefrom.

11. The address mentioned in the Licence shall, for all purposes connected with the Licence, be deemed to be the address of the Proprietor of the Public Carriage to which such Licence refers.

The words “mentioned in the Licence” shall, according as the Licence bears no endorsement of alteration of address, or bears one such endorsement, or bears several such endorsements, mean mentioned in the body of the Licence, or in such endorsement, or in the last of such endorsements.

12. Within three days after a Notice shall have been delivered to the Proprietor personally, or left at the address mentioned in his Licence, or otherwise within three days after the expiration of the period for which his Licence shall have been granted, the Proprietor shall deliver up his Licence to the Inspector of Public Carriages at the Police Station of the District within which the place of his

address mentioned in the Licence, is situate, and shall bring the Public Carriage to the same Police Station, in order that the Plate may be unfixed and delivered up to the Inspector of Public Carriages.

13. The Proprietor of a Public Carriage shall at any time when required produce his Licence to the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis.

14. The Proprietor of a Public Carriage shall not conceal the Plate, nor shall he obliterate or deface any number or mark thereon.

15. The Proprietor of a Public Carriage shall not knowingly permit the same to be used for any illegal purpose.

16. Any Licence erased or defaced shall be void and of none effect.

17. During the currency of the Licence, the Proprietor shall, at all reasonable times, allow to all persons appointed by the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, and producing a special order from the said Commissioner, free access to his premises for the purpose of inspecting the Public Carriage to which the Licence relates, the Horses used for drawing the same, and their Harness.

18. In case of the death of any Proprietor during the currency of his Licence, the Licence may be brought to the Officer of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, who may by endorsement thereon transfer the Licence to the personal representatives of the deceased Proprietor, or to his widow or child, if such child is of age. In like manner in case of the Marriage of a Female Proprietor during the currency of her Licence, her Licence may be transferred to her Husband.

#### *Regulations as to Hackney Carriages.*

19. If a Hackney Carriage carry a greater number of persons than the number which it is licensed to carry, the Driver, and also the Proprietor, if he be cognizant of the fact, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Order.

For the purpose of this Regulation, two Children under 10 years of age shall count for one person.

20. Before a Licensed Hackney Carriage may ply for hire in pursuance of a Licence

(1.) The Proprietor shall cause to be painted at the back of the Hackney Carriage on the outside the Number of Persons which the Hackney Carriage is licensed to carry :

(2.) The Proprietor shall furnish and affix to the top of the Hackney Carriage, in a socket or by a hinge, as may be directed by the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, a Metal Flag, and on such Metal Flag he shall cause to be distinctly painted in black letters upon a white ground, or in white letters upon a black ground, the Rate per mile and the Rate per hour to be charged in accordance with his Licence.

If the Proprietor suffers his Hackney Carriage to ply for hire before he has fulfilled both these provisions, he shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Order.

21. The Hiring shall be by Distance or by Time as the Hirer may express at the commencement of the Hiring, but unless expressed to be by Time, shall be taken to be by Distance.

22. If the Hiring is by Distance,

(1.) The Rate to be charged for every completed Mile shall be the Rate per Mile exhibited on the Metal Flag, and the same rate shall be charged for any such Part of a Mile as is over and above any number of completed miles : Provided that the Fare for a journey shall not be less than One Shilling.

(2.) A Driver shall not be compelled to drive more than 6 Miles in one Hiring.

23. If the Hiring is by Time,

(1.) The Driver shall be entitled to charge for the first Hour, or for any lesser period, the sum exhibited on the Metal Flag as the Rate per Hour : and after the first Hour, for every period of Fifteen minutes, or for any period of less than Fifteen minutes which is over and above any number of periods of Fifteen minutes, one Fourth part of the sum exhibited on the Metal Flag as the Rate per Hour.

(2.) The Driver shall not be compelled to drive for more than one Hour.

24. Whether the Hiring be by Distance or by Time, the Driver shall be entitled, in addition to what is due to him upon the calculation as aforesaid of Distance or Time, as the case may be, to the following Extra payments in the following cases respectively :—

(1.) If any Luggage is carried outside the Hackney Carriage, he shall be entitled to an Extra payment of 2d. for every Package carried outside, whatever may be the number of persons carried :—

(2.) If at any time during the Hiring more than two Persons are carried together, he shall be entitled to an Extra payment of 6d. for every Person above two persons so carried. Provided, that two Children under the age of ten years shall count for one person, and that for every such Child when carried together with two or more Persons, the Extra payment shall be 3d. and no more :

(3.) If discharged at a place, the distance of which from Charing Cross, measured in a straight line, exceeds four miles, he shall be entitled to an Extra payment for such Excess as if there had been a Second Hiring for such Excess, at the Rate per mile exhibited on the Metal Flag.

25. If the Hackney Carriage has been hired by Distance and during the hiring has, at the request of the Hirer, been made to wait, whether once or more often, the Driver shall be entitled, in addition to what is due to him upon the calculation of Distance, to an Extra payment, equal to One Fourth part of the rate exhibited on the Metal Flag as the Rate per Hour, for every period of Fifteen minutes completed (whether in one stoppage or in several stoppages) during which the Hackney Carriage shall have been made to wait.

The Driver shall not be entitled to any Extra payment for waiting any lesser period than Fifteen minutes (whether such lesser period be completed in one stoppage or in several stoppages) which is over and above any number of completed periods of Fifteen minutes.

The Driver shall not be entitled to receive any Extra payment for waiting, if such waiting has not amounted in the whole to Fifteen minutes.

26. The Proprietor of a Hackney Carriage shall provide for the driver, and the driver shall deliver to the hirer on entering the same, a Ticket of the following form :—

27. At any time during the currency of the Licence the Proprietor of a Licensed Hackney Carriage may transmit to the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis a Notice in the Form contained in Schedule E. hereto, stating that he is desirous to make an alteration of the Rates specified in his Licence, and specifying the Rates which he desires to be inserted in their stead. On or after the fourteenth day after the receipt of such Notice the Proprietor may present his Licence to the said Commissioner, and the said Commissioner shall on the same day return it to him with the old Rates erased and the new Rates endorsed thereupon. The Endorsement shall be in the Form contained in Schedule F. hereto.

The Proprietor shall thereupon be entitled to cause his said Hackney Carriage to ply for hire at the New Rates ; provided that he first have the New Rates painted upon the Metal Flag of the said Hackney Carriage in place of the Old Rates.

28. If at any time the Rates exhibited on the Flag of a Hackney Carriage plying for Hire be at variance with the Rates specified in the Licence, the Proprietor shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Order.

The term "specified in the Licence" shall mean specified in the original Licence if no Endorsement of an alteration of Rates has been made thereupon, and specified in the Endorsement, if only one such Endorsement shall have been made, and specified in the last of such Endorsements if several such Endorsements have been made upon the Licence.

29. During the currency of the Licence the Proprietor shall provide that the Number of persons which the Hackney Carriage is licensed to carry shall be kept distinctly painted upon the back of the Hackney Carriage, and that a Metal Flag distinctly exhibiting the rates as aforesaid shall be attached

thereto; and if the Hackney Carriage, whilst plying for hire, is defective in either of these particulars, the Proprietor shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Order.

30. A Driver of a Hackney Carriage who, for any Hiring, shall charge or take more than the proper Fare as calculated in accordance with the provisions above set forth shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Order.

31. A Driver of a Hackney Carriage who erases the Figures exhibited on the Metal Flag, or who alters such Figures so that they shall cease to correspond with the Figures specified in the Licence pertaining to the said Hackney Carriage, or who removes the Metal Flag, or who drives a Hackney Carriage plying for Hire without such a Metal Flag, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Order.

32. It shall not be lawful for any Hackney Carriage to ply for hire elsewhere than at some standing or place appointed for that purpose; and while it shall be plying for hire on such standing or place, the flag shall be kept by the Driver raised on the hinge or fixed in the socket so as to be plainly exhibited on the top of the Hackney Carriage.

33. Immediately on the Hackney Carriage being hired, the flag shall be lowered on the hinge or taken from the socket by the Driver, and shall not be again raised on the hinge or placed in the socket, or otherwise exhibited, until the Hackney Carriage shall be again plying for hire on a standing or place appointed for the purpose.

34. The Proprietor of a Hackney Carriage shall keep it and all its furniture and appointments, and the harness of the horse or horses drawing the same, in perfect order and repair; and if, with regard to any Hackney Carriage whilst it is plying for hire, there is defect in any of these particulars, the Proprietor shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Order.

#### *Regulations as to Stage Carriages.*

35. No printed or written bill shall be affixed against the windows of any Stage Carriage.

36. The proprietor of a Stage Carriage shall keep it and all its furniture and appointments, and the harness of the horses drawing the same, in perfect order and repair; and if, with regard to any Stage Carriage, whilst it is plying for hire, there is defect in any of these particulars, the Proprietor shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Order.

#### *Regulations as to Property accidentally left in Hackney and Stage Carriages.*

37. Immediately after the termination of any hiring, the driver of a Hackney Carriage, and immediately after the completion of any journey, the conductor of a Stage Carriage, shall carefully search the Carriage for any property which may have been accidentally left therein.

38. If any property found in a Hackney or Stage Carriage, and brought to any Police Station by the Driver or by the Driver or Conductor thereof respectively, under the Statute 16 and 17 Vict., cap. 33, sect. 11, be not within three months claimed and proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis to belong to the claimant, the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis shall forthwith sell such property, and out of the proceeds shall award to such Driver or Conductor as follows:

For Property consisting of or comprising any gold or silver money, bank note, jewellery, or watch, and being of less value than £10.	A sum equal to 3s. in the £1 on the value of the Property.
For Property of any other kind, and being of less value than £10.	A sum equal to 2s. 6d. in the £1 on the value of the Property.
For Property of the value of £10 or upwards.	Such a sum as the said Commissioner shall deem reasonable.

Provided that the said Commissioner may, if he think fit, at the expiration of the said period of three months, deliver the property to such Driver or Conductor, instead of awarding to him a sum of Money.

39. If the property which shall have been so brought to a police station be claimed before the expiration of the said period of three months, and the claimant prove to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis that he is entitled thereto, the same shall be delivered to him on payment by him of all expenses incurred, and of a remuneration to the Driver or Conductor. The amount of such remuneration shall be determined by the Commissioner with reference to the character and value of the property in accordance with the foregoing section.

#### *Regulations as to licensing Drivers of Hackney Carriages, and the Drivers and Conductors of Stage Carriages.*

40. Licences to Drivers of Hackney Carriages, and to Drivers and Conductors of Stage Carriages, shall be granted by the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis.

41. Licences so granted to Drivers of Hackney Carriages and to Drivers and Conductors of Stage Carriages, shall be respectively in the forms contained in the Schedules G., H., I. to this Order.

42. Licences granted under the Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869, shall, if not revoked or suspended, be in force one year from the date thereof; and for every such Licence there shall be paid to the Receiver of the Metropolitan Police, or to such person as he shall appoint, the sum of Five Shillings.

43. Every Licence granted to a Driver or Conductor shall be subject to revocation or suspension for any period of time by any Justice of the Peace in any of the events in which a Licence granted to a Driver or Conductor of a Hackney or Stage Carriage, in pursuance of any Act of Parliament might,



at the passing of the Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869, be revoked or suspended, and shall also be subject to revocation or suspension by any Justice of the Peace in the event of any breach of this Order or of the said Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869.

44. A penalty, not exceeding Forty Shillings, is hereby annexed for any act or default which is a breach of this Order, save only in those cases where a higher penalty may lawfully be enforced for the same act or default as an offence under the provisions of any other Act of Parliament now in force.

45. The Order made by me in virtue of the said Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869, and dated the 1st day of January, 1870, is hereby revoked.

46. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of February, 1870, and shall apply to all Licences granted under the said Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869: Provided that every Licence already granted in pursuance of the said Order of the 1st of January, 1870, under the said Act, shall be as valid as if it had been granted in pursuance of and in accordance with the provisions of this Order.
