The Queen taking into Her Royal consideration that upon the decease of George Rice, late Baron Dinevor, without male issue, on the 7th day of October last, the title and dignity of Baron Dinevor, devolved upon his cousin and heir male Francis William, now Baron Dinevor, as second but eldest surviving son and heir of the Honourable and Very Reverend Edward Rice, Dean of Gloucester (brother of George Talbot, Lord Dinevor, and uncle of the said George Rice, the late Lord Dinevor), who was the second son of Cecil, Baroness Dinevor; and that according to the ordinary rules of honor the brothers and sisters of the said Francis William, now Baron Dinevor, cannot enjoy that place and precedence which would have been due to them in case their said father had survived his cousin the said George Rice, Baron Dinevor, and had thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Baron Dinevor, Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that Henry Rice, Clerk, Rector of Great Risington, in the county of Gloucester, John Talbot Rice, of Addington, in the county of Gloucester, Esquire, Charlotte, wife of Alexander Cameron, Clerk, Maria, the widow of Edward Bankes, of Soughton Hall, in the county of Flint, Clerk, late one of the Canons of the Cathedral Church of Gloucester and Bristol, deceased, and Lucy Horatia, the wife of William Sweet Escott, Clerk, Rector of Carlton, in the county of Bedford, shall henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the same title, place, pre-eminence, and precedence as if their said father had survived his cousin George Rice, late Baron Dinevor, and had thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Baron Dinevor:

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
