PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending

that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at these Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at one o'clock.

The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock,

two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Alteration in Position of Buoy, Entrance of Jade River.

NOTICE has been received that the Eagle, or outer, buoy, marking the entrance of the Jade River, has been moved from its former position W.S.W. four tenths of a mile, and now lies in 7 fathoms water with Wangarong Lighthouse bearing South (easterly) $2\frac{6}{10}$ miles.

FRANCE-WEST COAST.

Buoys and Beacons, St. Malo.

The French Government has given notice, that the following beacons and buoys have been established in the vicinity of St. Malo; viz.—

Rochefort.—A tower of masonry, the top of which is 13 feet above high water, has been erected on Rochefort Rock; it is painted in horizontal bands of black and red, and is surmounted by a ball.

Buron.—A tower of masonry, the top of which is 4 feet above high water, has been erected on Buron Rock; it is painted red and is surmounted by a ball.

Pierres des Portes.—A tower is in the course of erection on the Pierres des Portes; its height, at present, is 16 feet above the rock, and 18 feet above high water.

Boujaron.—A tower is in the course of erection on Boujaron Rock; its height, at present, is 6 feet above the rock.

Bouton.—A black and red buoy has been placed on Bouton Rock.

Couillons de la Porte.—A black buoy on the Couillons de la Porte.

La Basse du Boujaron.—A red buoy on La Basse du Boujaron.

GIRONDE RIVER.

Alteration in Pointe de Grave Light.
