In the County Court of Cornwall, holden at Truro. In the Matter of a Bankruptcy Petition against John MacDowell, of Penryn, in the county of Cornwall, Inn-keeper.

UPON the hearing of this Petition this day, and upon proof satisfactory to the Court, of the debt of the Petitioner, and of the trading, and of the act or acts of Bankruptcy alleged to have been committed by the said John MacDowell having been given, it is ordered that the said John MacDowell be and he is hereby adjudged bankrupt.—Given under the Seal of the Court this 26th day of April, 1870.
