

APPOINTMENT OF STANDINGS FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT; AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

By virtue of an Act passed in the 13th year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, and making other provisions in regard to the consolidated Offices."

I, EDMUND YEAMANS WALCOTT HENDERSON, the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby appoint Standings for Hackney Carriages at the several places hereinafter mentioned, for such number of carriages at each standing as is specified, and within the boundaries set forth for each standing, provided that no hackney carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.

ELEVEN STANDINGS APPOINTED.

ABINGDON STREET, Westminster.	Six Carriages. Commencing opposite No. 27, Abingdon Street (entrance door), in centre of street, towards Millbank.
CROMWELL ROAD, South Kensington.	Twelve Carriages. Commencing in the centre of Cromwell Road, opposite the "Bell and Horns" Public House, and along centre of road, Westward, as far as necessary for twelve hackney carriages to stand.
GREAT SUTTON STREET, Commercial Road East.	Ten Carriages. Commencing six feet from the crossing in Commercial Road East, and extending along the centre of Great Sutton Street, as far as necessary for ten hackney carriages to stand.
AMHURST ROAD, Hackney.	Six Carriages. One cab at South side of Amhurst Road, nine feet from Mare Street, Hackney, five cabs along kerb on North side of Amhurst Road, commencing sixty-five yards from Mare Street, with horses' heads towards Hackney Railway Station.
BERESFORD STREET, Walworth.	Twelve Carriages. In the centre of the road in Beresford Street, Walworth, commencing opposite the Water Post, at the East end of Beresford Street, and extending Westward to the South end of Montpelier Street.
QUEEN'S ROAD, Peckham.	Four Carriages. Commencing in the Queen's Road, opposite the western entrance to the Railway Station, thence alongside kerbstone under Railway Arch, and terminating at eastern entrance to Station.
SHEPHERD'S BUSH GREEN ...	Six Carriages. On the North side of the New Road, Hammersmith, to commence by the kerbstone at the double lamp at the East end of Shepherd's Bush Green, and extend along by the footway at the side of the Green as far Westward as may be necessary for six hackney Carriages to stand.
HIGH STREET, PUTNEY.	Seven Carriages. One hackney carriage to stand opposite the Telegraph Office adjoining the Railway Station along the kerbstone towards Putney Hill, and the remaining six hackney carriages to stand along the East side of High Street, close to the kerbstone towards Putney Church, commencing at the steps leading from the up side of the Railway Station and extending for a distance of one hundred and twenty feet.
