Vienna, July I. You had in our last, an account of the taking of Fappa, of which we can now tell you tile following particulars. The 18th of the last month, General Caraffa arrived before Lappa with 1600 Men. And intimediately Summoned the place, but seeined for answer, That the Garifon war, resolved to defined it; Whereupon he canted two Batteries to be mailed, one of five pieces and one Mortar, which were finished about fix in the Evening, and were couployed with that success, that by Tenas Clock the next Morning they had made a large Breech in the Wall, and had set the lowe on Fire in five millaces.
