SOLDIERS BALANCES UNCLAIMED.

IN pursuance of the "Regimental Debts Act, 1863," notice is hereby given, that Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department has available, for distribution amongst the next of kin, the sum of money set opposite to the name of each of the deceased soldiers named in the list which is published with this notice in the "London Gazette," and the "Army List," and is also to be seen at the Quarters of the several Staff Officers for the Recruiting and Fension Service throughout the United Kingdom.

Applications from persons supposing themselves entitled as next of kin should be addressed by letter to "The Under-Secretary of State, War Office, London, S.W.," and marked outside "Soldier's Effects."

No application can be attended to which does not state the date and place of the soldier's birth, enlistment, and death, and the name of his regiment; his regimental number should also be stated if known.

Should these particulars furnished by the applicant not agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then within three calendar months the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicants' inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.—Dated this 31st day of July, 1870.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

ORDER SETTLING THE BOUNDARIES OF A DIS-TRICT TO BE STYLED THE DISTRICT OF TENBURY Wells, in the County of Worcesteb, for THE PURPOSES OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT Act, 1858.

WHEREAS a petition has been duly presented to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, from ratepayers resident within the parish of Tenbury, in the county of Worcester, praying me to settle and fix the boundaries of a district to be styled the "Tenbury Wells District," for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1858.

And whereas the said petition was duly signed, as required by the said Act, and set forth, likewise, the proposed boundaries of the district sought to be formed under its provisions; and inquiry has now been duly made by Arnold Taylor, Esquire, the Inspector appointed by me for such purpose, and he has reported to me thereon.

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, having taken the said Petition and Report into consideration, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Local Government Act, 1858, make order as follows :-

1. That from and after the date of this present Order, the boundaries hereinafter set forth and described and delineated on the plan referred to in, and accompanying, the said Inspector's Report, to me, bearing date the 5th day of August, 1870, form and constitute the boundaries of the district to be called the "Tenbury Wells District," for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1858; and that the parts included in such boundaries so described and delineated shall, for the purposes of such Act, be deemed to be a place having a known and defined boundary, and may adopt the

said Act accordingly.

The aforesaid boundary commences at the point A on the map annexed to the Inspector's Report; where the Lower Rochford-road abuts on the River Teme, and at a distance of 55 yards below the extreme eastern corner of property numbered 356 on the tithe map of Tenbury; thence crossing the said road in a southerly direction, and for 33 yards along the hedge of the garden forming part of the property numbered 257 on such tithe map, to the point A 1; thence, westerly, across such garden and pig run, but below the cottage and well forming part of such numbered property 357, to the point A 2, which is taken to be 22 yards above the Lower Rochford-road, and on the easterly boundary fence of the property numbered 357a on such tithe map; thence northerly along such last-named fence to the Lower Rochford-road and westerly along and including such road to the point B; thence, southerly and westerly along the easterly boundaries of the properties numbered 354 and 355 on such tithe map to the point C, on the northerly side of the turnpike road leading from Tenbury to Worcester; thence, south-easterly along and including such road to the point D; thence, westerly, along the south boundary fences of the properties, numbered 336, 335, 334, 333, 332, 342, 341, 343, and 347, to the point E, on the easterly side of the Kyre Brook, thence southerly along and including such brook to the point F; thence westerly crossing such brook and along the southerly boundary fence of property numbered 320, on such tithe map, to the point G, on the westerly side of the turnpike road leading from Tenbury to Bromyard; thence westerly along the southerly boundary fences of the tower of Youghal Lighthouse, two hours

the properties numbered 298 and 290, on such tithe map to the point H, on the west side of the turnpike road leading from Tenbury to the Old Wood; thence northerly along and including such last-named road, and westerly along the southerly and westerly boundary fences of properties numbered 256, 245, and 246, on such tithe map, to the point I, on the northerly side of the road leading from Tenbury to Berrington; thence casterly along and including such road, and northerly along the westerly boundary fences of the properties numbered 179, 178, 175, and 177, to the point K, on the River Teme, on the boundary line which separates the parishes of Burford and Tenbury; thence easterly along such boundary line to a point L, in the said river, exactly opposite to the starting point at A; thence southerly to such starting point at A, so completing the boundary of the district of Tenbury Wells.

2. That William Adsley, Lawyer's Clerk, be Summoning Officer, and take forthwith all such steps as may be necessary under the hereinbefore recited Local Government Act, for convening a meeting of the ratepayers of the said District of Tenbury Wells, to decide as to the adoption of the Local Government Act, 1858, within the boundaries of such district, as fixed and settled by this Order. And in case of the failure or inability of the said William Adsley to discharge such duty of Summoning Officer, that Richard Moore, Lawyer's Clerk, act in his stead.
