The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fiftyfive, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the sixteenth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy, in the words following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty, chapter seventy; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John the Baptist, situate at Outwood, in the parish of Burstow, in the county of Surrey, and in the diocese of Winchester.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Burstow, of the parish of Nutfield, of the parish of Horley, of the parish of Blechingley, and of the parish of Horne, all in the county and diocese aforesaid, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such respective parishes.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said parishes of Burstow, Nutfield, Horley, Blechingley, and Horne, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint John the Baptist, situate at Outwood as aforesaid.

"And whereas the Reverend Thomas Marsden, the rector or incumbent of the rectory of the said parish of Burstow, is entitled, as such rector, to nominate and appoint a minister to serve the said church of Saint John the Baptist, situate at Outwood as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right and by h Reverend Samuel, Bishop of the said diocese of for ever.

Honourable William Page, Baron Hatherley, Lord High Chancellor of England, the patron on behalf of the Crown of the rectory of the said parish of Burstow (in testimony whereof they, the said consenting parties, have respectively signed and sealed this representation); with the consent of the Principal, Fellows, and Scholars of Jesus College, in the University of Oxford, the patrons of the rectory of the said parish of Nutfield (in testimony whereof they the said Principal, Fellows, and Scholars, have affixed their common or collegiate seal to this representation); with the consent of the Mayor and Commonalty and Citizens of London, governors of the possessions, revenues, and goods of the Hospitals of Edward, late King of England, the Sixth, of Christ, Bridewell, and Saint Thomas the Apostle, as Governors of Christ's Hospital, the said Governors being the patrons of the vicarage of the said parish of Horley (in testimony of which consent they, the said Governors, have affixed their common or corporate seal to this representation); with the consent of Robert Few, of Henrietta-street, Covent Garden, in the county of Middlesex, Esquire, the patron of the rectory of the said parish of Blechingley, and with the consent of Mary Frances Western, of Montague-square, in the said county of Middlesex, Spinster, the patron of the rectory of the said parish of Horne, and with the consent of the said Thomas Marsden, the rector or incumbent of the rectory of the said parish of Burstow (in testimony whereof they, the said last named consenting parties, have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would in our opinion be expedient, that all those contiguous portions of the said parishes of Burstow, Nutfield, Horley, Blechingley, and Horne, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint John the Baptist, situate at Outwood as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John the Baptist, Outwood;' and that the right of presentation and appointment to the church of the same consolidated chapelry should belong to, and be exercised by, the said Samuel, Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester, and by his successors, bishops of the same diocese
