##### *Position of Campbell Reef.*

Also, that from observations made by *H.M.S. Blanche*, the position of Campbell reef in Torres Strait is about  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles to the north-eastward of that in which it is placed on the chart, or in lat.  $10^{\circ} 20' S.$ , long.  $142^{\circ} 30' E.$

The reef, awash at low water springs, is about 7 cables long East and West, and 3 cables wide.
