**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 20th day of September, 1870.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**PRESENT,**

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1869,) and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-third day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and words in this Order have the same meaning as in the Act of 1869.

2. Subject to the provisions contained in the Orders of Council relating to the ports of Granton, Leith, and Southampton, dated the tenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, all the regulations in the Fourth Schedule to the Act of 1869 shall apply to sheep and goats brought to Great Britain from any port of the States of the North German Confederation or France, and landed in Great Britain, and all such sheep and goats shall be slaughtered within ten days after the landing thereof, exclusive of the day of landing.

3. With respect to cattle, sheep, and goats brought from any port of the States of the North German Confederation or France, and landed within the Port of London, the following regulation shall have effect, in addition to those contained in the Fourth Schedule to the Act of 1869:—

No such cattle, sheep, or goats shall be landed except at places approved by the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs, and set apart for such purpose, and, notwithstanding any Order of Council to the contrary, no animal shall be moved alive out of any place so approved and set apart.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Malaga, reporting that in consequence of the official declaration of the existence of yellow fever at Barcelona, the Board of Health of Malaga has resolved:—

That vessels which have sailed from Barcelona with clean bills of health at any date prior to the 20th of August last, shall be sent away to Almeira or Cadiz to perform a quarantine of observation for the term of three days; and that vessels which have sailed from Barcelona on or after the 20th August, shall be dismissed to one of the foul lazarets of Port Mahon or Vigo, for the performance of a rigorous quarantine, with fumigation, purification, and ventilation of the cargo, effects, and persons on board.
