MINUTE by the Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council on Education.

Their Lordships read, and approved, the following—

Order fixing the Boundaries of the Divisions of the Metropolis, with the Number of Members to be elected by each Division, and appointing the Returning Officer for the first Election of the School Board for London and his Deputies.

WHEREAS it is provided by the 37th section of "The Elementary Education Act, 1870," that the School Board in the Metropolis as in the said Act defined shall consist of such number of members elected by the Divisions specified in the Fifth Schedule to the said Act as the Education Department may by order fix, and that the Education Department, as soon as may be after the passing of the said Act, shall by order determine the boundaries of the said Divisions for the purposes of the said Act, and the number of members to be elected by each such Division :

And whereas it is also provided that the Education Department may in the order fixing the boundaries of such Divisions name some person who shall be the Returning Officer for the purpose of the first election of the School Board, and the person who is to be the Deputy Returning Officer in each such Division :

Now, therefore, the Lords of the Committee of Council on Education, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the said Act, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered as follows :—

1. Each of the following Divisions, viz. :—

Tower Hamlets ;
Hackney ;
Southwark ;
Westminster ;
Chelsea ;

shall have the same boundaries as the Parlia-

mentary Borough of the same name, excluding such parts as are outside the said Metropolis.

2. The Division of Finsbury shall include such parts of the Parliamentary Borough of Finsbury as are within the said Metropolis, and the parts of Furnivall's Inn and Staple Inn respectively which are outside the said Borough of Finsbury.

3. The City Division shall include the area comprised within the Parliamentary Borough of London, except those parts of Furnivall's Inn and Staple Inn which are within such Borough.

4. The Division of Marylebone shall include the Parliamentary Borough of Marylebone and the parish of St. John, Hampstead.

5. The Division of Lambeth shall include the Parliamentary Borough of Lambeth, all those parts of the parishes of Lambeth and Camberwell outside the boundary of the said Borough, and the Wandsworth District as described in Schedule B, Part I, of "The Metropolis Local Management Act, 1855."

6. The Division of Greenwich shall include the Parliamentary Borough of Greenwich, and all those parts of the parishes of Greenwich and Woolwich and of the Districts of Plumstead and Lewisham as described in Schedule B, Part II, of "The Metropolis Local Government Act, 1855," which are outside the said Borough of Greenwich.

7. The Returning Officer for the first election of the School Board for London shall be the Right Honourable Russell Gurney, one of Her Majesty's Counsel, Recorder of London.

8. The School Board for London shall consist of forty-nine members elected as aforesaid ; and the number of such members to be elected and the Deputy Returning Officer in each Division shall be the numbers and the persons respectively mentioned in the second and third columns of the Schedule annexed.

9. "Parliamentary Borough" in this Order shall mean a Borough as defined by "The Boundaries Act, 1868."

THE Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Hamburg, inclosing a Notification, of which the following is a translation, issued by the Rear-Admiral Commanding in-Chief the Prussian Naval Forces in the Baltic, respecting the re-opening, under certain restrictions, of the harbour of Kiel:—

(Translation).

NOTIFICATION.

*On board H.M.S. "Pr. Adler,"
off Friedrichsort, September 28, 1870.*

WITH the approval of His Excellency General Vogel von Falckenstein, Governor-General of the Coast, the navigation of the harbour of Kiel is hereby re-opened under restrictions ordered by the undersigned Admiral commanding, which appear necessary from the continuance of the war on one hand, and the security of the navigation on the other.

The following regulations are therefore issued and hereby made public:—

1. The passage of the barrier at Friedrichsort can only take place in fair weather and in daylight between sunrise and sunset.

2. Passing vessels are bound to stop at the guardships stationed without and within the barrier, and which carry a distinguishing black and white pennant, in order to receive the necessary instructions from the Commanders and to obtain pilots.

3. Should passing vessels need to be towed, steam tugs will be in readiness for that purpose.

4. The pilots for the barrier and the steam tugs are engaged by the Royal Navy, and have no claim to make for payment.

The foregoing regulations which are merely intended to avoid danger from the numerous lines of torpedoes, and which admit of no exceptions,

must be obeyed by the master of every ship entering or leaving the port, no matter under which flag such ships may sail.

Intermittent Light on Ru Stoer.

The Commissioners of Northern lighthouses have given notice, that on and after the 1st November, 1870, a light will be established on the South Ear of Ru Stoer, the western extremity of Sutherlandshire, on the west coast of Scotland.

From the white lighthouse, 47 feet high, will be exhibited an *intermittent* white light, which will be seen at its full power for *one minute*, and then suddenly eclipsed for *half a minute*. The light, which will be shone from an elevation of 195 feet above the level of high water, should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 19½ miles, and be visible to the westward until cut off by the land.

Fixed Light at Port Monopoli.

THE Italian Government has given notice, that on the 14th August last, a light was established on the head of Costello mole, Port Monopoli.

The light is a *fixed* white light, elevated 26 feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 6 miles.

(No. 102.)—ISLAND OF CELEBES—MACASSAR.

Substitution of Light on Shore for Great Lelij Light-vessel.

THE Batavian Government has given notice, that on and after the 1st October, 1870, the *fixed red* light hitherto shown from Great Lelij light-vessel, near the town of Macassar, will be discontinued; and that a light will be established on the adjacent mainland of Celebes, about $4\frac{1}{2}$ cables southward of Losari Monument.

The new light will be a *fixed* light illuminating in a seaward direction an arc of 180° , divided into three sections, of which the central one, measuring 30° , shows a *red* light, and the others, each of 75° , a white light. The lantern is placed at an elevation of 39 feet above the level of high water, the red light being visible from a distance of 3 miles, and the white light 8 miles.
